Work To Commence On Allora Hall


The Contractor Allstruct Pty Ltd will commence remedial repair work to our Community Hall on Monday 26 February.

Drivers To Be Aware Of Road Conditions

Emergency services were called to two road crashes - one at Berat on Sunday morning and the second at Goomburra on Monday morning.

Three young males were travelling in a Nissan

Navara dual cab utility which was involved in a crash on the Goomburra Road at Berat at 10.22am on Sunday.

A 23-years-old male from the Gold Coast was at the wheel when the utility left the road, struck a culvert and rolled.

A QLD Ambulance spokesperson said two male passengers, one in his teens, the other in his 20s, were assessed at the scene and transported in stable condition with suspected spinal injuries, to Warwick Hospital.

. Warwick Highway Patrol is investigating the crash.

On Monday morning around 8.30am police, paramedics and two fire crews were sent to a crash on Inverramsay Road at Goomburra.

A vehicle driven by a 21-years-old Goomburra

He was the only occupant of the vehicle.

The man lost control after the vehicle rounded a bend in the road and struck an amount of soil and debris which was the result of heavy storms in the area the previous afternoon and evening.

The driver was taken to Warwick Hospital.

Senior Constable Ben Odden of Allora has urged drivers to be aware of changing road conditions due to recent extreme weather events.

He said motorists need to be wary and drive to the conditions.

Sunday afternoon's downpour in the ranges to the east caused flash flooding which resulted in several roads being impacted.

The New England Highway near Glengallan was cut by Backwater Creek for some hours, while the culvert at Rosehill on the Allora-Warwick back road was also under water.

Police diverted traffic along Lindhurst Lane.

"During this term as Mayor I have led our community through droughts, fires and pandemics, and delivered real growth at the same time". "We have achieved so much, but there is still more to do and I have the commitment and the energy to continue to contribute".

Take a day trip starting at Allora for a meal and enjoy the friendly hospitality. Proudly displayed at Allora are two sculptures.

In Herbert Street stop off at PL Travers Park and check out the Mary Poppins

monument. take a stroll down to Dalrymple Park where there's an amazing fossil image of a Palorchestes carved into the back of a Sandstone Chair.

Travelling on from Allora it's worth the trip to Goomburra, Killarney, Tannymorel, Emu Vale, Freestone, Leyburn, Leslie Dam, Warwick, Dalveen and Stanthorpe.

Most of the sandstone, granite and marble works featured in the trail were created Southern the Downs Sculpture Symposiums in 2006,

2008 and 2010 using locally sourced materials, but some have esteemed historical roots, such as the heritage listed T J Byrnes Monument which was carved in Italy and placed in the centre of Warwick in 1902.







The upgrades will deliver strategic enhancements

to secure a sustainable future for the saleyards and support the Southern Downs' biggest industry.

The improvements will feature 120 selling pens, 35 holding pens, two processing areas, overhead agent catwalks, 5 new loading ramps, cattle troughs and more.

Stage 1 is expected to be completed by March 2024 and Stage 2 by the end of May 2024.






