

Former internationals Cliff Lyons, Steve Price, Sam Thaiday, Scott Prince and John Hopoate are just a handful of names in the Australian team, while Wattles players former Michael Dempsev and Thomas Draper will run on for the Danes All Stars kicking off at 6.00 pm.




