Update On The Old Allora Fire Building

In November last year the Allora Community was invited to have a say in a survey relating to the Allora Community Halls and Precinct.

On Monday Michael Bell, Manager of Community Services with the Southern Downs Regional Council supplied information in relation to the old Allora Fire Building.

Recently a Structure Engineer inspected the building and completed a report, which is to follow. However, during the inspection, the Structural Engineer identified an issue that requires the immediate attention of the Council, more specifically, the issue relates to the lack of bracing/tieback that would normally be associated with tying single-skin brickwork back to reduce the risk of it collapsing.

At present, due to the lack of conventional bracing, if this brickwork was to let go, there is a risk that it could collapse outwards onto the footpath, placing at risk those that use this footpath. As a result, it has been recommended to the Council to cordon off this section of footpath to

mitigate this risk.

With this advice, Council will now take immediate steps to make this location safe until the community survey has been completed and an outcome determined based on this community engagement process around the old Allora Fire Building.

Mr Bell commented on the outcome of the community survey.

Council officers are just waiting on the Structural Engineer's report to be provided. On receipt of this report, the report will be used with the survey to assist the community in their responses. As such, Council is just waiting on receipt of this report to release a further survey that will allow the community to have their say on how Council can collectively with the community celebrate/preserve the history of the old fire station. I would expect that this is a couple of weeks away before the survey will be released, opened to the community, results evaluated and then presented back to Council.

The issue with the old Allora Fire Building will have no affect on the planned repairs to the Community Hall as the contract to complete the remedial works has been executed and contractors will be on site shortly.

Campaign Integrity Important First Step In Fixing A Broken Council

Independent Mayoral candidate Melissa Hamilton is condemning the use of social media and the rumour mill to pedal lies and defamatory comments about her political allegiances and is calling on other candidates in the upcoming election to show leadership by supporting campaign integrity.

"To be crystal clear, I am not standing for the Greens and have never been a member of the Greens party," Ms Hamilton said. "I have also never been a member of Extinction Rebellion and, unsurprisingly, I have never glued my hands to a road or indeed anything else."

"Like many Australians across the political spectrum, I support sensible and affordable measures to increase our energy and economic self-sufficiency. This is no different from Mayor Lawrence Springborg in Goondiwindi or Mayor Geoff McDonald in Toowoomba, who are pushing innovative energy projects in their communities," Ms Hamilton said.

"The green label is

being used against me as a political smear. Other candidates in this election who have expressed support for sustainability initiatives, including the current Mayor, are not being labelled as green," said Ms Hamilton.

"The Mayor has told me personally that he's aware dirty tactics are being used against me, but has given me his assurance that neither he nor his team members have been involved," Ms Hamilton said.

"To the other candidates in this election I say there is no place in public discourse for lies and misinformation," she said. "The standard we walk past is the standard we accept so let's keep this campaign clean."

Under Queensland's electoral rules, it is an offence to post false statements about the personal character or conduct of a candidate.

Melissa Hamilton is a mayoral candidate in the upcoming election. She is standing on a platform of professionalism and integrity.

Our opinion may not be popular with the current leaders who make the laws we are expected to abide by and respect, but we have reached the stage of communal frustration and no longer care what the government thinks.

We do care though about

The Premier claims he will open the cheque book to address this scourge on society.

So, what can we expect to see and can we now start to feel safe and secure?

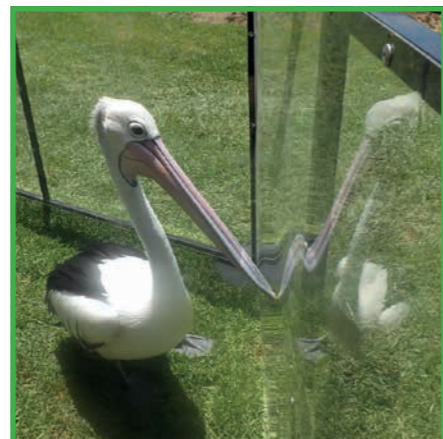

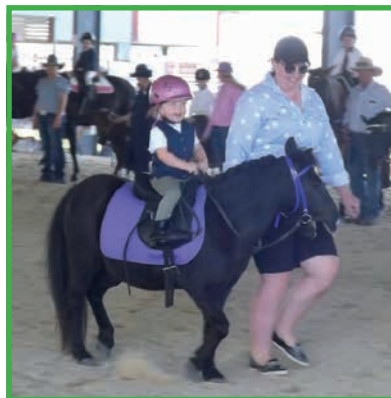

Positive start to season by Wattles Warriors



The match between Wattles and Danes was played in front of a massive crowd prior to the Australian Legends vs Pittsworth Danes Allstars, Legends Of League Game at Club Pittsworth. Known for his willingness to blood up and coming talent, Coach Travis Burns ran on a squad of 25 against the Danes, consisting of regular A Graders, Reserve Graders and Under 19 Colts, some involved in their initial taste of senior grade league.

Burns was more than pleased

with his team's performance, especially the younger brigade highlighted by a sparkling effort by five-eight Hamish Gartery.

Gartery was playing in Wattles Junior Rugby League Club colours last year, captain of the Under 17 line-up and eventual winner of the club's best Under 17 back at the end of season presentations.

"To play in the match was an awesome experience" said Hamish who his hoping for more opportunities in the top green and gold line-up, "I learnt so much in what was my first hit out in an A grade game."

Gartery is among eight young Wattles Under 17 players from last season to graduate to the senior ranks, with tough forward Bryce Stewart also making his first appearance in top grade against

Pittsworth with a solid game.

In his debut outing for Wattles, former Western Clydesdales Under 21 hooker Thomas Hatch was impressive, and along with fullback Craig Donn, centre Jake Meddleton, back rower Ty Gardner and lock Nick Van Der Poel, all shone in the overall team of achievers in a result that saw the mentor Burns sporting a beaming smile at full time.

"We have some very capable young players who this afternoon showed they are more than capable of stepping up to higher levels" said Burns, "and the experienced players demonstrated how they will be lynch pins in the senior sides as we navigate this year's premiership."

The Warriors skidded in to quarter time with an 8 - 0 lead after tries by winger giant Aiden Suhan and back rower Gardner.

The Danes snared a valuable four-pointer as the second quarter opened, before front-row bookend Mitch Duff burst through to touch down from close to the tryline, 15 minutes before the half time break.

Wattles took a 14 - 6 lead into the third quarter, but the home side

kept them honest with touchdown soon after the restart.

It was all Wattles though minutes later when back-rower Alex Donn ran a perfect line to cut through from fifteen metres out to score, allowing the Warriors an 18 - 10 advantage.

The Danes kept in touch though with another try just before the three-quarter time break.

While a couple of errors in the latter stages saw those in green and gold under pressure at times, they were giving the ball plenty of air and it was fullback Craig Donn who found room with ten minutes remaining racing away to score allowing the Warriors to shut the game out and claim victory.

Wattles 24 (Aiden Suhan, Ty Gardner, Mitch Duff, Alex Donn, Craig Donn tries; Jake Meddleton 2 goals) defeated **Pittsworth 14**.

For the coming five weeks, the Warriors focus is on training, fitness and improvement until their next on field outing, the much anticipated Barrett Family Shield at Platz Oval, Clifton on Saturday March 23rd.

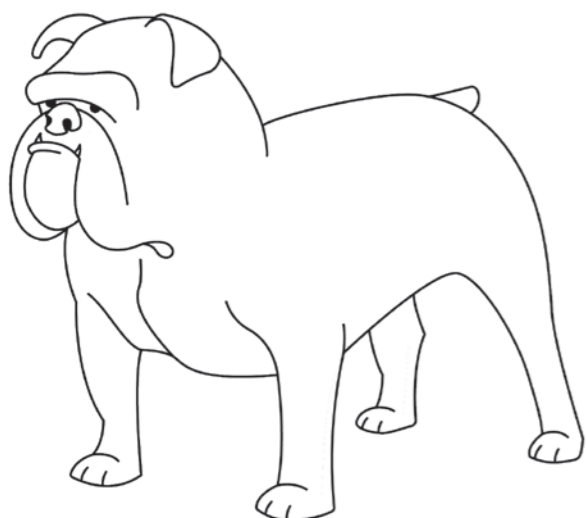
