Finally, Allora's Community Hall is undergoing repairs to make it safe and operational again.

After being out of action since 2022 the local community is looking forward to planning and using the Hall once more.

Community Services Manager with the Southern Downs Regional Council, Michael Bell advises that during the work, toilets in Muir Street could be impacted. If this is the case, the contractor will place directional signage on the

fencing to provide alternative facilities. It's also likely that there will be changes on the use of the footpath for the entirety of this project.

# **Meeting Called To Discuss Wind Farm**

A Victorian-based windpower company is believed to be planning construction of up to 60 wind turbines and more than 30km of highvoltage power lines and towers in the Allora area.

Wind Prospect Pty Ltd have formally approached a number of landowners on the Eastern side of Allora to discuss the proposal, and are understood to be holding several on-farm private meetings with landholders this week to discuss the plans.

Wind farms have proven a controversial matter in rural areas across Australia, with residents and landowners often divided over the perceived benefits and drawbacks of the turbines in their (sometimes literal) backyards.

Given the high level of community interest in this issue and possible effects on both the community and the Allora region's local environment, a Community Landholder information meeting will be held at 6.30pm sharp on Thursday, 14th March at the Allora Sports Club. aimed at providing as much

information to local residents as possible.

All local landholders and residents are welcome to attend, with representatives from both Property Rights Australia and Agforce invited, along with State and Federal Members of Parliament and local mayor and councilors.

AgForce South East Queensland director Scott Reed said the farming peak body looked forward to the opportunity to assist Allora district landowners in getting more information on the subject.

"Agforce understands the community concerns and we will be attending the community event"

Goomburra property owner Graham Park was among those approached by the Wind farm group and said he welcomed the chance to attend a community meeting

"I am impressed that the Allora community is running a community event where we can all get more information." he said.

"A wind turbine farm in the region is a whole new idea to me and I have mixed emotions and thoughts on the concept; I look forward to attending the meeting and hopefully getting some of my questions answered."

Property Rights Australia spokesman Jim Willmott

expressed his concern about the proposed development, especially based on his observations of large-scale turbine farms elsewhere.

"Industrial sized wind developments like have cumulative impacts on rural landscapes and amenity, biodiversity values, agricultural systems. infrastructure community overall regional and liveability," he said.

"The reckless roll-out of renewables are dividing communities and currently are inadequate governance and strategic assessment mechanisms in place."







# **Old Fire Station**

The allotment at 80 Herbert Street now occupied by the old fire station was laid bare by the 1914 Holmes' Buildings' fire. It is not known if there was a building on the site before May 1950 when Eddie Balke, a tailor, advertised the allotment for public auction, 'Improved with dwelling 18' x 36', erected as a shop, lavatory at rear'.

In November 1951, Allora Dry Cleaners moved into the building from their former site in Muir Street. The dry cleaners occupied the site until closing in February

Following a public called by the Rev. Fr. McCormack, the Fire Brigade decided to establish a base in Allora and the building at 80 Herbert Street was adapted for use as a fire station. The building was

Herbert Street building was used as a seed analysis laboratory for a time by Petrina Gardiner. Dorothy Haig established 'The Old

Fire Station' art gallery there, and the building was later used for a time by the Allora Men's Shed.



The mountains are calling and the highways beckoning, as they have done for most of my life. Being a nomadic and creative soul by nature I find it difficult to sit still for too long.



# **Growers on Alert for Fall Armyworm**

Fall armyworm (FAW) are being detected at unprecedented levels in sorghum crops across Central Queensland, the Western and Darling Downs and northern New South Wales causing what experts predict could be the most significant impact on sorghum since the pest's arrival in Australia in 2020.

Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) principal entomologist Melina Miles urged growers to be alert, but not alarmed and take a considered approach to making decisions about the need for control.

"We know that FAW can be devastating and we're seeing significant crop damage in southern and Central Queensland in sorghum," Dr Miles said.

"We're in the early stages of developing robust management recommendations for this pest and research is ongoing, but what we

build up between October and March. Where they can, growers are adopting an early-sowing strategy to largely avoid severe damage, and this has been effective in 2021-23.

"This season we have late crops planted on the December rain. Because of that, more growers are seeing high FAW populations and damage in crops from emergence throughout the vegetative stages.

Dr Miles said in order to decide whether an infestation warrants control, growers should assess the number and size of FAW larvae per plant. The only effective way to do this is to pull plants apart and unroll the whorl.

"Just looking at damage is risky as it doesn't tell you what the damage potential is of the infestation over the next week or

Some of the worst affected crops in central Queensland have seen

caterpillar pests, like helicoverpa, the natural mortality of eggs and small larvae is high - possibly as high as 80 per cent, however, the mortality of larger larvae (4th -6th instar) tends to be much lower, so you can assume most of the larger larvae you

cause damage "Over the past three seasons, once

sorghum started to come into head FAW infestations have declined. However, this year we are seeing infestations persist into grain filling. There are instances of FAW damaging grain in the heads, but not to the same extent as a similar infestation of helicoverpa.
