### **New Bridge For Allora Golf Course**

In late 2022 the Allora Sports Club received \$179,974 in grant money to be used in part for building a new bridge to access the Golf Course.

This original bridge has born the brunt of many floods over the past 26 odd years and while it is serviceable it will continue to deteriorate with continued flooding.

Funding was allocated by the Queensland **Government Community** and Recreational Assets Recovery and Resilience Program. The other part of the funds have been used for drainage and repairs to creek banks and creek washouts.

Today, 1st May, sees the start of construction of the new bridge, near the 9th areen.



### **Mouse Activity Detected On The Darling Downs**

The Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC) and CSIRO are urging growers and advisors to be vigilant due to reports of moderate to high mouse activity in several regions across Australia.

Wednesday, 1st May 2024

Mouse numbers are generally low in most areas, but moderate to high mouse activity is being reported in pockets of the Darling Downs.

CSIRO mouse researcher Steve Henry said now is the time for growers and advisors to actively monitor mouse activity.

"Moderate or high mouse numbers are a concern for this time of year due to it coinciding with the seeding of winter crops, which is when significant economic damage can occur," Mr Henry said.

"Given the favourable conditions across many areas, mice have been breeding through summer and autumn, with numbers expected to peak in April-May.

"Because of that, and because of patchy activity

across paddocks, growers are advised to monitor multiple paddocks to gauge mouse numbers to inform management decisions over the coming weeks."

CSIRO researchers have identified some areas in Australia with moderate to high mouse numbers and are encouraging growers to actively monitor for the pest now.

- Actively gauge mouse numbers by walking through paddocks; utilise mouse chew cards and active burrow counts to gauge mouse presence and activity. Mouse chew cards can be ordered from GRDC on 1800 11 00 44 or ground-cover-direct@canprint.com.au.
- If mice are present at sowing, bait at, or as soon as possible after sowing, to prevent damage to the freshly sown crop;
- Talk to bait suppliers early to ensure timely supply. As with use of any agricultural chemical, use the product in accordance with the label, and report any adverse or off target effects

via the APVMA website;

Growers should be aware that only baits containing 25 g/kg zinc phosphide (ZnP) are currently available as the Emergency Permit for baits containing 50 g/kg ZnP has lapsed, and this

lapsed, and this is no longer available.

 MouseAlert is a free resource. For farmers, grain producers, Landcare groups, and biosecurity groups. Anyone can use MouseAlert to record information about

mouse activity in farm environments. The more information you record, the more useful MouseAlert will become for detecting changes in mouse activity across your region, which can help predict and prepare for plague events.



Wattles Nick Van Der Poel ran in a hat trick of tries on Sunday in a player of the match performance. a key component in the 'Stillwater Pastoral Company' Warriors walloping 50 - 8 victory over the Brothers Leprechauns.

The result that featured nine Wattles' touchdowns secured a pair of Toowoomba Rugby League premiership points and saw the Ty Gardner skippered Warriors retain the prestigious Dan Ryan Memorial Shield twenty years since its 2005 inception.

The Shield was presented by All Whites (Brothers) legend Mark Barrett who played a leading role in its introduction in memory of Dan Ryan two decades back.

Dan played 113 games for All Whites A Grade team. Mark 116. making them both club centurions.

Chris Ryan thanked both Wattles and Brothers Clubs for their ongoing support for the Shield on behalf of the Ryan Family.

Wattles' coach Travis Burns rates Nick Van Der Poel one of his most consistent doers, week in week out.

The courageous lock forward emerged from local league nursery Wattles Junior RL Club, before eventually stepping up to an A Grade debut in 2018.

then young centre gain selection in the Central Division Regional Queensland Under 20 line-up capping off an inspiring season, before playing a significant roll in the Warriors 2022 TRI premiership

win a couple of seasons later.

Coming in to Round 4, Brothers were striving to add to their single success against Southern Suburbs back in their season opener, and certainly put it to the Warriors who never had it all their own way in the early stages of the feature clash on Sunday.

Indeed, while those in green and gold oversaw a more than commanding advantage at full time, the completion of the initial forty minutes saw them holding the Leprechauns at bay by a slim 12 8 margin.

It was Wattles scrum back end in Van Der Poel and Tyson Stevens who ran in those first green & gold tries, and while Brothers centre Riley Wockner and second-rower Simione Ata levelled the touchdown ledger, two Brayden Paix conversions shunted the Warriors ahead marginally.

Brothers never bothered the scoreboard attendant again sadly. and when Van Der Poel crossed for his second four-pointer early in the second stanza it opened a seven try floodgate through a column of try scorers including a third by Van Der Poel, a double by Tom Hatch, centre Andrew Richardson, Brayden Paix and inform winger Mitch Bourke for the Warriors to gallop home to victory, and escort the Dan Rvan Memorial

Shield back to Clifton for a seventh consecutive season

Wattles took the field without star duo of halfback Matt Duggan and injured fullback Jackson Green, while concerns abound after skipper Tv Gardner left the field after 25 minutes with a leg

Coach Travis Burns was particularly happy with how his team lifted from the second stanza commencement, their defence. ball movement and completion rate all providing too much fire power for Brothers.

Wattles backs half Brayden Paix, centre Matt Christensen and fullback Joe Willett also shone in a sterling Warriors performance, as did busy hooker Tom Hatch.

Brothers were reduced to twelve for the final 23 minutes after bench player Phillip Waters was sent-off.

The win over Brothers has Wattles on the third rung of the Hutchinson Builders A Grade premiership ladder, trailing the undefeated Warwick Cowboys and the Gatton Hawks.

The Hawks and the Warriors play off this Sunday at Gatton's Cahill Park in a vital contest for both, with Wattles top team mentor Burns hoping he can assemble his best seventeen to head to the Lockver
