



Joffre Celebates His 104th Birthday

It has been a busy time for Joffre Bell of Clifton. As Joffre does each year

he attended the Anzac day commemoration at Clifton.

On the following day he was guest of honour at a function at the Senior Citizens' Centre. many friends along with representatives from the RAAF Association and the Clifton Masonic Lodge along with a contingent of nine people from his old school - The Southport School (TSS). Joffre is the oldest living "old boy" of TSS.

Allora's Historical Museums created plenty of interest

As part of the Autumn Festival the Allora Historical Society opened both Museums to the delight of the public. After-five gowns

and ball gowns from different eras were on display along with an unusual

pair of "gloves" recently donated by Phyllis Shooter and crocheted by Madge Shooter, mother of Ray and her late husband, Keith. These were worn by the lady bowlers to protect the back of their hands from the sun c1970's.

A special section called "Joan's Corner" displayed beautiful works by one of Allora's oldest residents, Miss Rae Masters.

The Secretary of the Society Wendy Free had a chance to visit Rae at the Allora Homestead and here is her story as told by Wendy

"When Rae left her home almost two years ago, she gave much of her crochet pieces to the Allora Historical Society. We wanted to make a showpiece of them so I stitched as many different patterns on background material to make a wall hanging. Her beautiful works are placed on a wall in 'Joan's Corner' at our 53 Warwick St Museum for all



to see. Joan Kiernan owned 'The Joan' Frock & Beauty Salon from 1954 – 1980.

Rae was born in 1925, was taught to crochet by her mother when she was about 11 years old, then started work in the women's section of Holmes & Co. at the age of 16. She worked there until it burned down on Friday 13th October 1972. The IGA grocery shop now stands on that block.

Peter Stewart, Roy Smith and Jock Evans asked her to open and be a partner in a haberdashery shop 'The Shopping Spot' where the chemist now stands. Later, Rae and Jock bought out Peter's and Roy's share, with both working there for approximately 16 years until they sold it to the Kerkin family."

If you'd like to delve into the history of Allora, the Museum is open to the public every Thursday and locals who haven't visited for a while will be amazed at the extensive and interesting exhibits. Wednesday, 8th May 2024

In the past few weeks local drivers have noticed that a lot more animals, particularly kangaroos, have been hit on the highway and back roads. In one week three dead roos were counted on the New England Highway.

The RACQ is urging motorists to be extra vigilant on Queensland roads after receiving a 25% increase in motor claims stemming from animal collisions over the past 12 months.

The claims peaked from May to October, indicating that the cooler months were the worst time of year for animal collisions, with May and July experiencing the highest volume of claims.

Across Queensland, regional areas saw the highest frequency of claims with Darling Downs one of the most dangerous locations for collisions with animals.

RACQ Group Executive Insurance Trent Sayers said that it can be confirmed from the data that most collisions happen at dawn or dusk, with 38% of animal collisions occurring between 5am-6am and 6pm-7pm.

"Unfortunately, it seems

that kangaroos are the most common animal collided with on the road." Mr Sayers said motorists should be cautious when travelling on roads with surrounding wildlife.

"Hitting an animal while driving can be emotionally distressing to the driver, cause damage to the vehicle and sadly, may result in loss of life of a native animal," he said.

"Ideally, you should avoid driving at dawn and dusk when wild animals are most active and sun glare or darkness can reduce visibility.

"If driving at these times is unavoidable, use high beams where appropriate, drive to the conditions, don't speed and stay alert for any wildlife in your peripheral vision that might move onto the road.

"You shouldn't swerve to avoid hitting an animal as it can put you at greater risk of causing a collision with another vehicle or roadside obstacle.

"If you have hit an animal and it's safe to do so, pull over to inspect your vehicle and check on the animal," Mr Sayers said.






