Each year the Queensland Government conducts an audit into Aged Care food ratings throughout the State.

In 2023 Southern Cross Care Allora was awarded second place but this year they went one better taking out the highest score in Queensland for Aged Care Food Standards with a rating of 3.88.

The rankings are a combination of judging by the residents and their families along with

survey feedback, external compliance assessments and auditors' reports during site visits.

Each day approximately 132 meals are served with additional snack foods three times a day to the Homestead and the Nursing Home.

The win is a credit to the hard working staff in the kitchen and a huge achievement by Chief Cook Vivienne Ziser and her dedicated staff at the Homestead.

Fidgey Our Super Swim Coach Is Staying



At last commonsense has prevailed.

Southern Downs Regional Council has listened to community concern over the decision to not extend the management agreement for the operation of the Allora Pool with current operator Andrew Fidge at the end of the 2024 season.

It was resolved at the April meeting of Council that the CEO would review the decision and prepare a proposed way forward to take the view of the community into account.

Following this review it was agreed to extend the term of the contract for a period of 24 months.

Southern Downs Mayor Melissa Hamilton said that the swift action of Council officers to undertake a review and negotiate a way forward reinforces

that Council is listening to the community.

"We as Councillors are listening to the community. We wanted to ensure that Council had fully taken into consideration the economic and social impacts of its decision, as well as the input we received from both users of the facility and the wider Allora community," Mayor Hamilton said.

"Following the review by the CEO, Council wishes to advise that Andrew Fidge remains the pool operator up to the winter recess in 2026."

Council recognises that the Allora Pool is an important public facility and appreciates that it is crucial to secure an operator who will ensure good management of the facility whilst providing the highest level of coaching and instruction to many community members and

competitive swimmers.

"The Allora Pool is an important recreational hub for the community," Mayor Hamilton added.

"We have reached an agreement with Mr Fidge to provide good management of the facility and ensure that the Allora Pool provides continued access to high quality swimming pool facilities and coaching for Southern Downs residents."

Port-A-Loos Not The Solution

Southern Downs Regional Council has received feedback from businesses and residents in Allora expressing concern with the temporary closure of CBD toilets, necessitated by the current construction work at the Allora Community Hall.

"While this situation is not ideal, it is only temporary." a Council Spokesperson said. "During this time, there are other public toilets in the local vicinity.

There are toilets near the pool approximately 240

metres away and also off Allora Drive approximately 640 metres away.

Unfortunately, temporary port-a-loos at the construction site is not a viable option as space is limited and the facilities would require regular inspection, cleaning and maintenance/pump out."

As previously reported in the Allora Advertiser that due to issues with the wastewater from the Hall and the limited existing internal toilets, re-opening of the Community Hall has been delayed.

Satake Corporation Expands

purchasing a machine at one of its meetings due to the number of different activities that happen throughout the year.

The defibrillator will be placed on the outside wall of the canteen.

This site was the most suitable as it will enable those using the Showgrounds easy access in time of need.

Earlier this year the Clifton Local Ambulance Committee installed an automated external defibrillator at the Allora Medical Centre in Herbert Street.

Joffre Celebrates His 104th Birthday



It has been a busy time for Joffre Bell of Clifton.

As Joffre does each year he attended the Anzac day commemoration at Clifton.

On the following day he was guest of honour at a function at the Senior Citizens' Centre.

In attendance were many friends along with representatives from the RAAF Association and the Clifton Masonic Lodge along with a contingent of nine people from his old school - The Southport School (TSS). Joffre is the oldest living "old boy" of TSS.

Allora's Historical Museums created plenty of interest

As part of the Autumn Festival the Allora Historical Society opened both Museums to the delight of the public.

After-five gowns and ball gowns from different eras were on display along with an unusual pair of "gloves" recently donated by Phyllis Shooter and crocheted by Madge Shooter, mother of Ray and her late husband, Keith. These were worn by the lady bowlers to protect the back of their hands from the sun c1970's.

A special section called "Joan's Corner" displayed beautiful works by one of Allora's oldest residents, Miss Rae Masters.

The Secretary of the Society Wendy Free had a chance to visit Rae at the Allora Homestead and here is her story as told by Wendy

"When Rae left her home almost two years ago, she gave much of her crochet pieces to the Allora Historical Society. We wanted to make a showpiece of them so I stitched as many different patterns on background material to make a wall hanging. Her beautiful works are placed on a wall in 'Joan's Corner' at our 53 Warwick St Museum for all



to see. Joan Kiernan owned 'The Joan' Frock & Beauty Salon from 1954 - 1980.

Rae was born in 1925, was taught to crochet by her mother when she was about 11 years old, then started work in the women's section of Holmes & Co. at the age of 16. She worked there until it burned down on Friday 13th October 1972. The IGA grocery shop now stands on that block.

Peter Stewart, Roy Smith and Jock Evans asked her to open and be a partner in a haberdashery shop 'The Shopping Spot' where the chemist now stands. Later, Rae and Jock bought out Peter's and Roy's share, with both working there for approximately 16 years until they sold it to the Kerkin family."

If you'd like to delve into the history of Allora, the Museum is open to the public every Thursday and locals who haven't visited for a while will be amazed at the extensive and interesting exhibits.



More Animals Being Hit On The Roads

In the past few weeks local drivers have noticed that a lot more animals, particularly kangaroos, have been hit on the highway and back roads. In one week three dead roos were counted on the New England Highway.

The RACQ is urging motorists to be extra vigilant on Queensland roads after receiving a 25% increase in motor claims stemming from animal collisions over the past 12 months.

The claims peaked from May to October, indicating that the cooler months were the worst time of year for animal collisions, with May and July experiencing the highest volume of claims.

Across Queensland, regional areas saw the highest frequency of claims with Darling Downs one of the most dangerous locations for collisions with animals.

RACQ Group Executive Insurance Trent Sayers said that it can be confirmed from the data that most collisions happen at dawn or dusk, with 38% of animal collisions occurring between 5am-6am and 6pm-7pm.

"Unfortunately, it seems

that kangaroos are the most common animal collided with on the road." Mr Sayers said motorists should be cautious when travelling on roads with surrounding wildlife.

"Hitting an animal while driving can be emotionally distressing to the driver, cause damage to the vehicle and sadly, may result in loss of life of a native animal," he said.

"Ideally, you should avoid driving at dawn and dusk when wild animals are most active and sun glare or darkness can reduce visibility.

"If driving at these times is unavoidable, use high beams where appropriate, drive to the conditions, don't speed and stay alert for any wildlife in your peripheral vision that might move onto the road.

"You shouldn't swerve to avoid hitting an animal as it can put you at greater risk of causing a collision with another vehicle or roadside obstacle.

"If you have hit an animal and it's safe to do so, pull over to inspect your vehicle and check on the animal," Mr Sayers said.

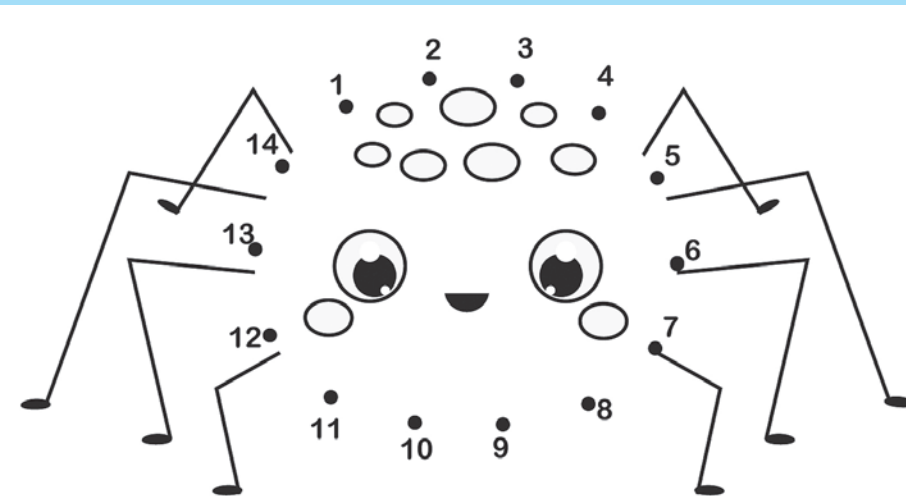
