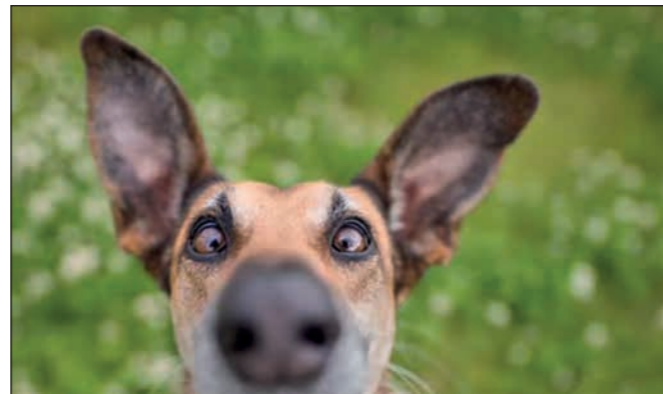

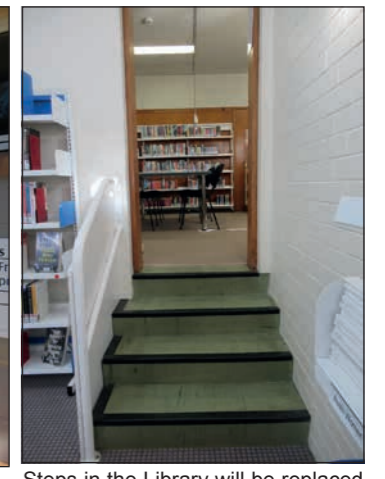
# Community Precinct To Be Created

The Library to move into the Senior Citizens Building and the Sports Museum to expand into the Library - this corner block of buildings will be known as Allora's Community Precinct.



Steps in the Library will be replaced by a ramp when the changes go ahead.

Four years ago The Allora Senior Citizens Club relocated and handed the building title back to the Southern Downs Regional Council. At the time the Council held a public meeting with Mayor Pennisi acknowledging that the public was in favour of the Library relocating to the Seniors Building and the Museum could move into the Library building. Since then there have been delays including public surveys to decide whether to restore or remove the old Fire Station.

The resolution was carried unanimously at last week's Council meeting to remove the Fire Station but salvage the front lintel of the building to be incorporated in the Community Precinct. Work to demolish the Fire Station will commence shortly. President of the Allora Sports Museum Perry Cronin is enthusiast about the move as a lot of important memorabilia is not displayed like it should be at the Museum. As the Museum is totally self-sufficient the cost to fit out the expansion will not be a burden to the Council or ratepayers unless via a Grant. As well as donations from private citizens, supporters have gifted money for the new internal ramp as well as carpet for the extension.

### Where Are Our Worst Roads?

Across the state, unroadworthy roads are putting Queenslanders' lives at risk but now drivers have the chance to nominate the roads in their communities that are in desperate need of an upgrade.



RACQ has launched its biennial Unroadworthy Roads Survey and is asking motorists to join its advocacy efforts and nominate problem stretches of roads that need attention.

Work needs to be carried out on this bad stretch of the New England Highway north of Allora near Forest Springs Road.

RACQ Head of Public Policy Dr Michael Kane said the results would be analysed and provided to road authorities and politicians to help prioritise upgrades.

A huge crowd of around 15,000 is known to attend the Leyburn Sprints so it's worth getting your tickets early.

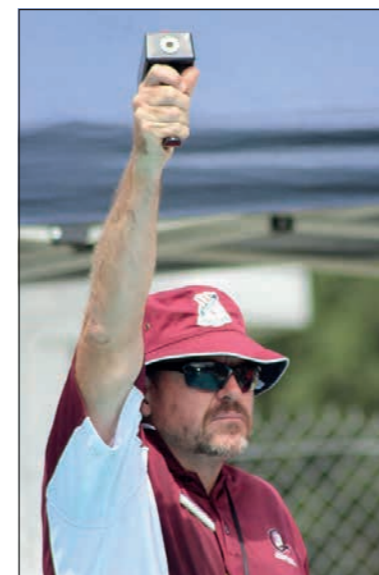

# Council commits to future stages of saleyards redevelopment

Southern Downs Regional Council has reaffirmed its commitment to continuing upgrades of the Warwick Saleyards and supporting the region's biggest industry by funding minor variations to the existing works and future stages that improve the facility's workplace health and safety standards and animal welfare standards.

Following the successful completion of Stage 1 and with Stage 2 commencing, Stage 3 concentrates on the sheep yard upgrades while Stage 4 will improve access to animal loading ramps and build new car parking. In response to user requests, Council will also fund the splitting of the 120 selling pens in Stage 1 into 240 pens to increase head numbers as well as making changes to the Stage 2 pen layout.

In resolving the motion at the Ordinary Meeting of Council on Wednesday 19 June 2024, Southern Downs Mayor Melissa Hamilton said she looked forward to more works progressing at the saleyards for the economic benefit of the region.

"The Warwick Saleyards are a vital part of the region's livestock industry and Council's ongoing investment reflects our dedication to fostering the economic growth of our agricultural sector," Mayor



Hamilton said.

"While we have not been able to fund all of the agent requests, Council will continue to seek external funding through other Government sources.

"These latest budgeted works reaffirm Council's vision for a thriving and sustainable future for the region and supports our broader commitment to attract more business to the facility."

**New Council funded works at a glance**

- Splitting 120 new selling pens in half via a new gate and adding

120 new troughs, creating 240 pens in total

- Pen layout adjustments to Stage 2 to accommodate agent requests

**Stages 3 and 4 works include** a sheep yard with soft shade over fat lamb area, a new administration office for the sheep yards, NLIS equipment, light pole reprofile and gravel hardstand in front of ramps, demolish Z yards and create a gravel carpark\* (\*Will be submitted for funding through the Queensland Government Works 4 Queensland Program).

Upgrades to-date for the \$7.5m Warwick Saleyards Redevelopment Project have been co-funded by the Federal Government's Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grant Program and Council.

In addition and following requests from stakeholders, Council has funded an additional \$1M in variations for Stage 1 including the provision of structural posts for a future roof and other ancillary works.

On the back of yet another sterling front-row effort by Cooper Tate-Roche the 'Stillwater Pastoral Company' Wattles Warriors A Grade line-up held off a determined Highfields Eagles challenge to win 20-18 at Platz Oval on Sunday.

The top-grade success completed a three-match clean sweep for the home side who also snared the victory honours in Reserve Grade and Under 19.

Former Western Clydesdales regular Tate-Roche has been in superb form this season, and on Sunday along with fellow forward pack members team Captain Ty Gardner and back-rower Jacob Leach, were key performers in Wattles four try to three desperation win over a just as desperate Eagles.

Elusive centre Lachlan Watt continues to impress from anywhere in the back line, shining in what was his third match in green and gold on Sunday.

Accomplished fullback Jackson Green made his presence felt as he returned to the Warriors line-up after a frustrating injury spell.

The less than full strength Wattles outfit edged to a 10-6 halftime lead on their way to a hard-fought victory courtesy of a first stanza try double by wing finisher Joey Willett.

The result has Wattles level on fifteen competition points with the Valleys Roosters, both balanced on fourth rung of the Hutchinson Builders A Grade premiership ladder behind the Gatton Hawks and the top of the table undefeated Warwick Cowboys.

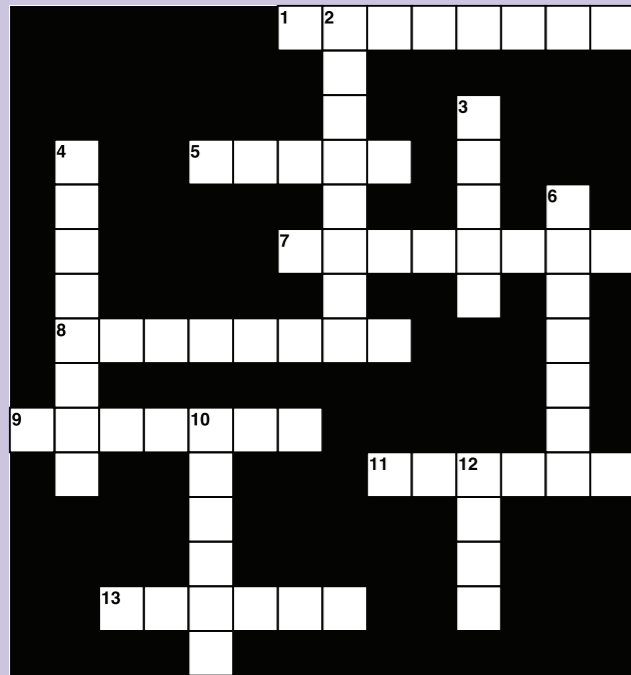

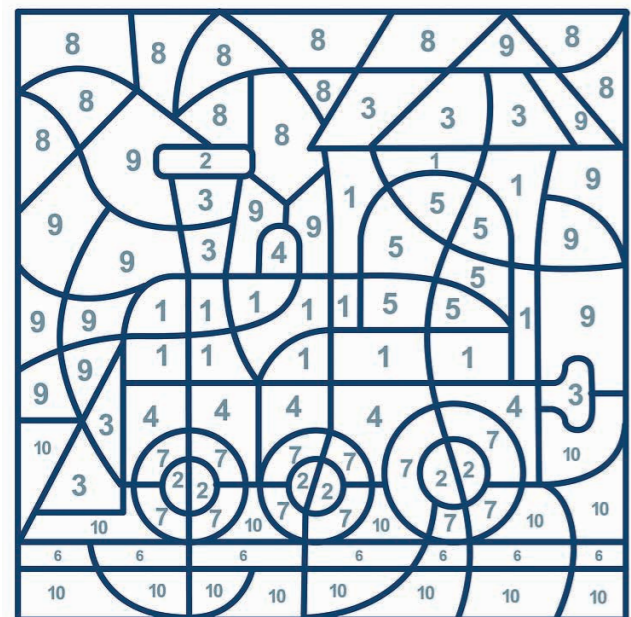

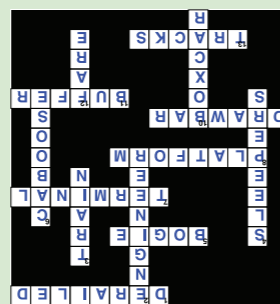
