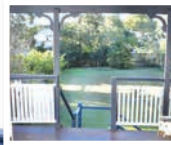

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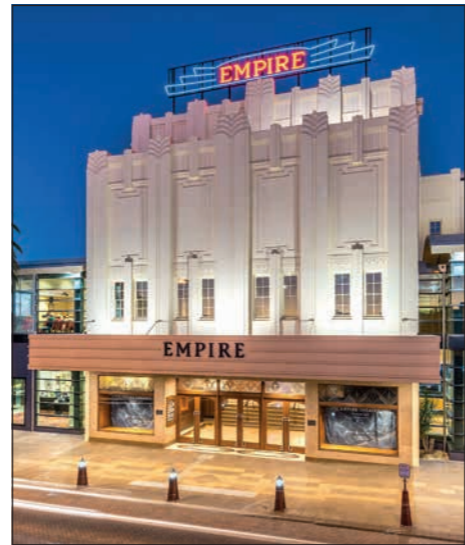

Information Sessions For Grain Growers

Using satellites and drones to support on-farm decision-making, connectivity for remote locations and the latest on fall armyworm (FAW) management are some of the key topics on offer for growers and advisers at the next major grains information events in southern Queensland.

The main two-day GRDC Grains Research Update will be held in Goondiwindi on July 30 and 31. Designed to provide the latest research information to grain growers and their farm advisers the series is focused on the current winter season and upcoming summer crops.

GRDC Grower Relations Manager – North, Rebecca Raymond is well equipped to offer insights into the value of the update series. A former research and extension agronomist, who has worked in the Goondiwindi region and across the Darling Downs, she says the events provided critical information to inform on-farm decision making.

"The GRDC update programs are developed in close consultation with local committees, so they covered off on the topics important

at a regional level," Ms Raymond says.

"For that reason, we have a section of the program dedicated to decision support and data management, but we're also offering the latest in FAW management; along with a seasonal update on cereal rust and disease management as part of a really comprehensive program."

The Goondiwindi Grains Research Update agenda includes -

- Decision support and data management using high resolution earth observation satellites and drones.
- Latest FAW threshold research for sorghum and maize and management guidance for 2024/25
- Seasonal update on cereal rust and disease management
- Focus on Residuals - this session allows participants to engage in a panel discussion focusing on paddock selection for summer crops in the face of fallow residuals and glyphosate resistant weeds.

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Duggan and Gardner Show Guide Wattles to Victory



Veteran half back Matt Duggan returned from an injury lay off to combine with classy team skipper Ty Gardner and add a touch of excellence to a Warriors performance that sealed a 78 - 6 overwhelming win to open the second round of the Hutchinson Builders Toowoomba Rugby League A Grade premiership on Oakey turf on Saturday night.

Wattles breezed to a 26 - 0 advantage by the twenty-minute mark, before assuming a half century 50 - 0 lead by half time.

The Warriors juggernaut leapt into action after just four minutes of play when team skipper Ty Gardner ran a short line off five-eight Brayden Paix to touch down and open the points flood gates.

The home side Bears had no answer to the Warriors running game as they dictated terms in their endless attacking raids.

Coach Travis Burns rated

his team's performance highly, with special mention for front-rower Jacob Leech and impressive 18-year-old forward George Nott.

"George is a quality young forward" said Burns, "he shows ability and experience beyond his years with Saturday's game his fourth first grade outing since his top-grade debut."

The result over the Bears has Wattles level on seventeen competition points on the A Grade premiership ladder level with the Valleys Roosters. The Roosters sit in third place on for and against above Wattles, both behind the Gatton Hawks and the top of the table undefeated Warwick Cowboys.

Wattles A Grade side, who are looking to the return of a number of key players from the injury bench, are facing another must win fixture when they take on the Brothers Leprechauns this Saturday evening at Clifton's Platz Oval.

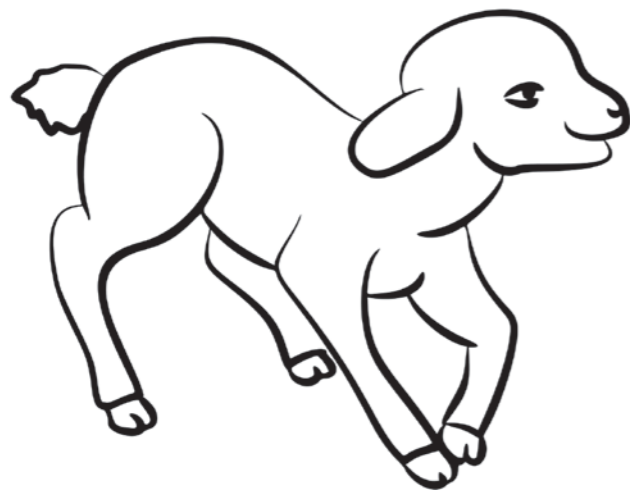
