Illegal Dumping Needs To Stop!

illegal dumping is a growing problem, with close to 300 incidents reported last year.

Southern Downs Regional Council's efforts to protect the region's environment and communities have been bolstered with the Queensland Government extending funding for 12 months through the Local Government Illegal Dumping Partnership Program.

Southern Downs Councillor Sarah Deane welcomes the funding and acknowledges that Council has cleared more than 257,000 litres of illegally dumped waste - equivalent of 1,285 wheelie bins.

"Our unsupervised compounds continue to receive unsuitable items such as furniture, mattresses and tyres." Councillor Deane said.

"These items must be disposed of at supervised waste facilities as the unsupervised bin compounds are operational for small quantities of household waste only.

"At the end of the day, it is a considerable financial and resource burden for Council to transport and dispose these abandoned items to a waste facility, with ratepayer dollars footing the clean-up bill and staff being diverted from servicing community amenities.

"We all have a responsibility to keep our region clean and beautiful, and I encourage anyone who sees illegal dumping or littering to see it, report it, stop it."

One of the most concerning incidents occurred recently when 1,060 litres of hazardous chemicals were found dumped in a remote area, posing significant risks to public health and the environment. Council engaged a licensed

specialist to manage the cleanup, incurring a substantial cost of more than \$10,000 to ensure the safe and proper disposal.

When reporting dumping, please include the location and photos of the waste if possible.

Time, date, location and a description of the dumped items; vehicle details, including registration number, make/model,

colour or any distinguishing features: description of the person involved, including their location in the vehicle; clothing and gender and if it's safe, take photos of the scene but do not approach the individual for your own safety.

The Back

Foundation For Rabbit-Free Australia **Elects Queenslander As New Chair**

Chief Executive Officer of the Darling Downs-Moreton Rabbit Board, Craig Magnussen takes over the position from outgoing chair Professor Wayne Meyer.

appointment represents the first time a Chair from outside South Australia has led the Foundation in its 30 plus year history.

Rabbits are the most widespread pest in Australia, posing a threat to over 300 species of threatened plants and animals and causing losses of over \$200 million a year to agriculture. The Foundation for Rabbit-Free Australia's charter is to raise awareness of the harm caused by rabbits, to promote ongoing research into better bio-controls for rabbits, and to encourage the application of science based management techniques.

New Chair, Craig Magnussen from the Granite Belt said, "The Foundation was established in 1992 to promote research into rabbit control. The committee has included many of Australia's most notable rabbit experts and I'm honoured to become the Foundation's Chair. The promotion of, and advocacy for, continued development of best practice control tools biological controls, as well as the Bilbies not Bunnies message, is as important today as it was prior to the introduction myxomatosis calicivirus'.

How To Handle A Snake Bite

(September and October). 39 people have presented to emergency departments with snake bite injuries within the Darling Downs region.


Executive Director Rural, Dr Chris Cowling has emphasised the importance of knowing and applying effective first-aid for snake bites, particularly when on the farm, bushwalking or in remote

"This is a timely reminder for residents to be vigilant and avoid approaching snakes.

If you do spot one, the best advice is to simply leave them alone and back away to a safe distance." Dr Cowling said.

After a snake bite, or suspected snake bite, people should:

- check the snake has gone and is no longer a danger to yourself and the person who's heen hitten
- check airway, breathing and circulation. If the patient has collapsed, start CPR immediately.



- treat any snake bite as an emergency, regardless of whether you think the snake was venomous or not.
- don't attempt to drive yourself to hospital or walk. Sit or lie down and stay as still as possible.
- apply a pressure immobilisation bandage as soon as possible.
- apply a firm bandage over the bite site, and then cover the entire limb.
- immobilise the limb using a splint. Use any rigid object - spade, piece of wood, tree branch or rolled up newspapers.

In the case of a snake bite, Dr Cowling also advised what not to "Don't wash or cut the area

- keep still and try to remain calm

try to suck out the venom, or use a torniquet," he said. "If you find a snake on your

property, it's best to leave it to the experts and call a snake catcher for relocation assistance."

The most common snakes responsible for bites resulting emergency department presentations in Queensland are brown, black, tiger and taipan

In regards to the Heritage Weekend, "it's amazing what has been achieved from such humble beginnings", said organising group President Graeme 'Yogi' McMillan.

"The Weekend's beginnings back in 1995, served as an opportunity for local enthusiasts to roll their vehicles, machinery, motors and other equipment out of their sheds and have a bit of fun" grinned Graeme.

Tractorologist of note Graeme is among the select band or restorers and enthusiasts that formed the original Heritage Weekend organising committee.

While Graeme has seen a wide range of vehicles and machinery over the past decade, he considers an 1899 Winton car and Dave Fiechtner's 1908 Cadillac memorable.

& Falcon cars; Crosley-Challenger engines and Matchless motorcycles.



Capable Secretary of the past two years Emily Henry vacated her role, which allowed for the return of former club President and Secretary Glyn Rees filling the Secretary void while continuing as the Media Manager.

Wattles' Life Member and former President Neil Phelan was appointed club Patron given the sad recent loss of long serving

Patron and Wattles statesman Jack Duggan.

Wattles will continue to benefit from the efforts of Dorothy Christensen who will continue so capably as Sponsorship Officer and Fundraising Co-ordinator.

Outstanding Wattles back rower Ty Gardner, who will miss the coming season with injury, was reappointed Club Captain.

Coaches Appointed Coaching appointees for what is
Wattles 60th year since forming
in 1966, and 59th year in the
Toowoomba Rugby League, are
experienced hands Travis Burns
(A Grade) and Cameron Hamblin
(Under 19), while new face on
the coaching front Will Manley is
taking the reins of the Reserve
Grade side.

Many will be familiar with Burns outstanding career in the NRL and British Super League, before a pre-retirement season with State League side Wynnum-Manly.

The Wattles 2025 mentor headed back to his league beginnings on the Central Downs signing back in 2017 to captain-coach Wattles for the 2018 season, his debut coaching experience.

The 2025 season will see him as Wattles longest serving first grade coach about to embark on his eighth year at the top-grade helm.

Discounting the TRL's cancelled Covid year of 2020, Burns has guided his side to the finals series each year since his arrival, climaxing in Grand Final appearances in 2018 and 2022, the latter resulting in the Wattles club's fifth TRL first grade premiership in 2022.

The seasoned coach and club coaching director is looking to another year of achievements in 2025, and in saying that he suggests across all grades, with training commencing in early January.

The top-grade side will comprise a foundation of a solid band of established achievers who will be joined by some exciting new faces.

As has been the case for the past near 33 years, the Wattles pre-season tester will be the famed local rugby league tradition in the Barrett Family Shield against country cousins Warwick, with the next contest hosted early next year




