Queenslanders are being urged to update their phone settings to 'favourite' the Emergency Alert (EA) phone number, to stay informed during an emergency or disaster

Emergency Alert is the national telephone-based warning system used to send voice messages to landlines and text messages to mobile phones to warn people of emergencies. This includes dangerous weather potentially severe impacts.

An Emergency Alert is just one way for authorities to warn communities of a dangerous situation in the area and only issued when

They are not issued for every circumstance but

the message will include important, potentially lifesaving directions which require you to take action to stay safe.

You do not need to register to receive an Emergency Alert from the system which is sent from caller ID number: +61 444 444 444

Messages from +61 444 444 444 are not a scam, they are official phone warnings as part of a national geotargeting emergency alert system.

Residents are being asked to check the number is not blocked on their device and to add it to their 'favourites', so they don't miss the alerts.

If you follow these steps, even if your phone is set to 'do not disturb' vou will still receive the alert, no matter what time of the day or night it is issued.

Show Patron Dorothy Rubie



2025 marks the 62nd Allora Show for our Patron and Life Member. Mrs Dorothy Rubie.

Dorothy commenced her journey as a volunteer with the Allora Show Society when she, her husband Harry and daughter Del, moved from Warwick to their new home in Allora in 1964.

Keen to be involved with the local Community, her time with the Society began in the Schoolwork Section where Charlie and Dulcie Tickle presided over When Dorothy events. offered her services, Charlie Tickle asked if she had neat handwriting, necessary for transcribing details on the place getters' cards. When that test was passed with flying colours. Dorothy's first Show Society assignment started in the old weatherboard Pavilion standing where the brick Pavilion is now situated.

From working in the Pavilion, Dorothy moved into the Horse Ring pencilling for the Ring Stewards, and Mr Tom Cowley, after whom the Main Arena is named, was the Chief Ring Steward at the time.

When Tom passed away, Len Batterham was elected Ring Master and it was during this time that the first 'Ring Office'

was created. This was the small, enclosed section underneath the Announcer's Box near the Campdraft yards. It was from this tiny space that all transactions for the Equestrian events

In the early days of Dorothy's association with the Allora Show, a 'Show Campdraft' was held on the Friday with Local Horse Events in progress outside the main Ring.

Dorothy was responsible for all 'Office work' connected with the Equestrian Events for the two days of the Show, including the Campdraft. The 'Draw' for the Draft was conducted from her kitchen table in Drayton Street, with a few willing helpers, the day before the Show.

Each Steward's Result Book was handwritten and covered in Brown Paper as was the Receipt Book, where a signature was required from Competitors to enable them to receive their Prize Money. Every equestrian Event for the two days of the Show had a white envelope, again handwritten with all necessary details, containing exactly the correct amount of prizemoney. The books were 'balanced' at the

end of each Show day and rarely were they out by even 10 cents! On one occasion, Dorothy unexpectedly became the Equestrian 'Ring Announcer' when the usual voice of the show was unavailable.

The current Ring Office was purpose built by the Allora APEX Club, for their use on the famous Allora Apex Auction Day. It was here that Dorothy spent the remainder of her time

with the Equestrian section of the Show. Dorothy's association with the 'Ring Office' concluded in 2022 after 58 years volunteering her services to the Show Society.

In 2018, Dorothy was extremely honoured to accept the position of Patron of the Allora Show Society and has worked with some wonderful people and made some great friends during her 62 years, volunteering at

The Back

Growers Asked To Have Their Say

GrainGrowers has commenced its Annual Policy Survey, encouraging growers across Australia to have their say on issues impacting their farms.

The survey results will assist GrainGrowers in identifying the key issues facing growers and prioritising the challenges and opportunities for the year ahead.

In addition to seeking feedback on policy issues, the survey includes some new questions around biotechnology untake. natural capital on farm and the extent to which respondents are planning ahead for issues that may impact them in the future.

GrainGrowers CEO Shona Gawel said the survey represented an important opportunity for growers to raise issues that impact their day-to-day business operations.

"Last year, 663 growers participated in the survey, providing a wealth of useful information. From a data viewpoint, the breadth of participation provided significant statistically results, allowing us to draw accurate. industry-wide conclusions."

"In 2024, the survey identified the top three priority areas as farm inputs, markets and pricing and labour. The feedback and insights provide a sharp focus to our policy and advocacy efforts, undertaken on behalf of our members and the wider industry." "The insights gained

through the survey were used in 23 industry submissions and over 80 parliamentary briefings, representing the views of our members to parliamentary. departmental and other key decision makers."

"Following the 2024 GrainGrowers launched a series of reports exploring the future of farm inputs - fertilisers. chemicals, fuel and seeds - designed to inform growers and equip decision makers with the facts

and possibilities for future development." The survey, conducted through an independent research firm, comprises a range of multiple-choice and open-text questions. It asks growers for information about the issues



For the most part I enjoyed an amicable relationship with those I represented right across the jurisdiction Council of the time, met a lot of people, covered a lot of formerly unknown territory, learnt a great deal about local government and its workings and made some good friends.

I also enjoyed immensely travelling our region and appreciating all there is to

see and enjoy, and become aware of the contributions of so many community

While there are many achievements of various levels I take some pride from, the pipeline from Warwick to Allora to enhance water quality is something I feel was a significant positive.
