





#### Last days to have your say on equestrian sculpture

The survey to get opinions on a proposed equestrian sculpture for Warwick closes next week (April 27, 2011).

Several hundred people have so far had their say on where the giant sculpture should be located and whether it would be an

asset to the community which Council should maintain.

The 15 metre high sculpture, brainchild of local artist John Simpson, is designed to pay homage to Warwick's equestrian community past and present.

It received in principal but not financial support from Southern Downs Regional councillors at the General Meeting on 22 June 2010.


At the December 2010 General Meeting, Council agreed to seek public feedback on a request by Mr Simpson that Council fund lighting, signage and ongoing maintenance for the sculpture, if the sculpture construction costs of \$115,000 plus were funded elsewhere

Maintenance costs over 25 years have been conservatively estimated by the artist at \$10,000. A costing for maintenance has not been completed by independent consultants Council officers.

Two locations have been proposed for the sculpture.

The first is in the corner of Queen's Park on Alice Street opposite the Rodeo Hall of Fame building: the second is at the entranceway to Morgan Park.





# LETTERS FROM LES

#### **HOLY WEEK IN REVIEW**



The Holy Monday & Tuesday: The cleansing of the temple in the Holy City of Jerusalem is thought to have taken place on this Monday. This was when Jesus overturned the tables of the moneychangers and said to them: "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer; But you make it a den of robbers". [Matthew: 21:13]

The Tuesday of the Holy Week is the day when the Pharisees tried to trap Jesus into making blasphemous remarks about God and against Roman rule. It is sometimes called the Day of Questions. This day is also important as a day when Jesus discoursed with his disciples on the Mount of Olives about the destruction of Jerusalem and the signs of the last days to come.

Spy Wednesday: This day is called "Spy Wednesday" in some places. It is the day when Judas Iscariot, a disciple turned betrayer, agreed to show the chief priests where they could easily capture Jesus.

Maundy Thursday: The word "Maundy" is derived from the Latin word mandatum meaning "command" - the same Latin root that we get mandatory and mandate from. This is a reference to Christ's commandment to love one another, made at the Last Supper, when Jesus washed His disciples' feet. On this day Jesus had supper with his disciples and in the words of St Matthew: "Jesus took bread, and blessed, and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying," Drink of it, all of you; for this is my blood of covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Good Friday: The day on which Jesus was crucified outside the walls of Jerusalem on top of a hill called Calvary. Christians believe that Jesus sacrificed himself and took upon himself all the hurt, dirt and wrong of those who will accept his forgiveness.

It is a day to be marked by solemn observances in memory of the Crucifixion. Christians believe that by dying Jesus accomplished reconciliation between God effective for all who will accept his message and follow his ways.

Easter Eve: The day following Good Friday is usually called Easter Eve in Anglican churches, and in the past has been a traditional time for baptismal

Easter Day: Indeed a day to celebrate. Jesus rises from the tomb and meeting his disciples prepares them to carry out his work of bringing spiritual new birth to all who will accept and follow him.

#### Allora's Past 75 years ago April 1936 **Farmer Found Dead**

Mr. Richard Stoddart Harvey was found hanging in the dairy of his farm at Table Top, Allora, on Sunday, 12th April 1936. Mr. Harvey was born in Allora, the son of Mr. Edward Harvey, long time owner and editor of the Allora Guardian newspaper, and his wife Elizabeth. Richard Harvey attended the Allora State School and enlisted in the Great War in January 1917. He saw action in France with the 41st Battalion until the signing of the Armistice in 1918. He was witness to many things including the downing of the aeroplane of Manfred von Richthofen, "The Red Baron". Although physically unharmed, he suffered badly from shell

Mr. Harvey returned to the family farm in 1919 and in 1926 married Miss Eldorine Nussey, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nussey of Goomburra Homestead. His death came as a shock to his many friends in the Allora district.

#### Allora's Past 100 years ago April 1911 The New School

A public meeting was held on the 18th April 1911 to consider the planning of some function to celebrate the opening of the new State School buildings in Allora. The Mayor, Mr. T. Muir, presided, and others present were: Messrs. J. Munro, J. Moorhead, G. Draney, J. Kingsford, G. Briggs, R. Gordon, W. Masters, E. Holmes and the Head Teacher, Mr. R. L. Jackson. It was decided that the function should take the form of a treat for the children at the same time also act as a fund raiser for improvements and beautifying the grounds. The opening was to take place on Empire Day with a picnic during the day and a dance in the evening. It was decided that invitations were to be sent to the Minister of Education, Mr. G. P. Barnes M. L. A., Mr. F. Gravson M. L. A., the architect and the contractor, A subscription was opened with those present heading the list with 5/- each.

# SDRC receives first NDRRA flood funding payment

Southern Downs Regional Council has received an initial flood recovery payment of \$13.2m plus GST from the Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA).

The advance payment to assist with flood repair costs follows an interim request from Council for \$76.3m from the NDRRA after the devastating floods in December 2010 and January 2011

The full damage bill is expected to be higher than that, with a full survey of damage across the region due for completion by the end of this month.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said he hopes Council will eventually receive funding to cover the full damage bill.

"I don't see any reason why not," Cr Bellingham said.

"We haven't rushed into this, we've put in a considered application and taken a very professional approach bringing in expert consultants to assess and cost the damage.

"They're completing the survey of damage across the entire region as we speak," he added.

NDRRA is a program jointly funded by the Queensland and Australian Governments.

# Fluoride to flow in Warwick and Stanthorpe water supply

Southern Downs Regional Council contractors today finalised installation of new fluoride treatment pumps at Warwick and Stanthorpe water treatment plants and will start introducing fluoride into the two town water supplies from tomorrow.

The steps are required under State Government's Water Fluoridation Act 2008 requiring the introduction of fluoride into the Warwick and Stanthorpe town water supply to assist with dental health.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said Council had no choice in taking these steps.

"This is a State Government initiative, under the legislation we're required to comply."

Contractors Prominent Fluid Control will start testing the new pumps, finetuned to calibrate liquids by the milligram, tomorrow with very low amounts of fluoride.

Over the next few days, they will gradually increase the level of fluoride in the water treatment plants in line with Australian drinking water guidelines.

It will then take between three days and one week for treated water to reaching households.

Water will be continually tested for levels.
