

Anzac Day Commemoration across the region

On next Sunday's 95th anniversary of the landings at Gallipoli, civic and military leaders along with masses of residents and school children will gather across the region to commemorate Anzac Day.

They will pause to remember the service and sacrifice of sailors, soldiers, airmen and nursing sisters in the Great War of 1914-18, along with Korean, Malayan, Borneo and Vietnam campaigns and current peace keeping operations throughout the globe.

Mayor Ron Bellingham expects communities throughout the region to get right behind Anzac Day Parades and Commemoration Services.

"In partnership with local Returned Services Leagues and the Veteran Services & Advocacy Services Australia organisation, Anzac Day programs have been organised to allow community members the flexibility to select a service that best suits their timetable," Cr Bellingham said.

Warwick's program includes a Dawn Service, ceremonies at the War Graves Cemetery and Eden Gardens Memorial Park and an 11am service at the Cenotaph in Leslie Park.

Cr Bellingham highlighted Warwick's unique Fade Away Ceremony as something to behold on Anzac Day.

"The Fade Away Ceremony is symbolism of the old diggers passing the baton on to the younger generation to carry forward as they slow-march through the ranks of school children," Mayor Bellingham said. The Ceremony will be held at the end of Warwick's 11.00am Cenotaph Service.

Colonel Michael Batiste will perform the duties of Reviewing Officer at Warwick Anzac Day services. He will join officials outside the Town Hall at 10.55am to take the salute from servicemen and women, before proceeding to the Cenotaph where he will be guest speaker at the 11am service.

Diggers looking for a free taxi pick-up to Anzac Day services in the Warwick area are invited to phone Nancy Miller on 0407 623987. This service will only be available to Diggers who phone Ms Miller directly on this number.

A similar program of Anzac Day services has been arranged for the Stanthorpe community, including Dawn Service at Weeroona Park, Services at RSL Wall of Remembrance & Garden of Remembrance, a Parade and a Public Meeting at the Civic Centre. A collection in aide of the War Veterans' Home will be taken up during singing at the Civic Centre service.

Commander Donald Forbes RFD RANR will represent the Royal Australian Navy as Reviewing Officer and Guest Speaker at the Stanthorpe Anzac Day activities.

Services will also be conducted in many of the smaller communities within the Southern Downs region including Allora, Killarney, Tannymorel, Yangan, Leyburn and Wallangarra. Details of Allora's Anzac Day program:



Put pen to paper so Chaplaincy program can continue

Federal LNP Member for Maranoa Bruce Scott is encouraging people to sign his petition calling on the Rudd Government to continue funding the National School Chaplaincy Program in its current form.

Mr Scott said that after much pressure from school and local communities, the Rudd Government had committed to continue funding the program, but only for another year and at a reduced level.

"The Rudd Government has cut the level of funding to the National School Chaplaincy Program and they have only extended it until the end of 2011 so they can get it out of the way for this election year," Mr Scott said.

"A Liberal-National Coalition Government would continue funding the program in its current form and at its current level of \$165 million over 3 years. This petition is calling on the Rudd Government to match that commitment," he said.

Mr Scott said the program was very popular in Maranoa, with the former Liberal-National Government providing more than \$1.6 million for school chaplaincy services across the electorate in 2006 and 2007.

"This program provides important pastoral support to students and staff and it has been embraced by school communities right across Australia," he said.



Looking Back... LEST WE FORGET

Although numbers can be confusing, with some Allora residents enlisting elsewhere and some residents of other districts enlisting in Allora, the



Allora district lost about fifty young men in World War I. These were men who were either born in Allora, enlisted in Allora, or enlisted elsewhere while living in Allora. That would be like losing the entire Wattles A Grade, Reserve Grade, and Under 18 teams in a period of four years. We will look at a brief history of six of those young men.

Joseph Burge was born in Allora, the son of William Burge, a saddler, and his wife Mary Ann. He went to school in Allora and on joining the Queensland Mounted Infantry, served with the First Queensland Contingent in the Boer War. At the time of joining the 2nd Australian Light Horse Battalion in 1915 he was a single, 36year old, auctioneer's clerk He had achieved the rank of lieutenant and was killed in action at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli, on the 7th August 1915. Clinton Gregory Siebenhausen was born in Allora, the son of Albert David Siebenhausen, a tailor, and his wife Hannah Blanche. He was a nineteen year old farmer when he enlisted in Allora on the 16th November 1915 when the "Dungarees" recruitment march passed through the town. He was assigned to the 25th Battalion and was killed in action in Belgium on the 4th October 1917.

John Warfield was one of the four Warfield brothers who served in World War I. He and brothers, Harry, Herbert and Sydney were sons of John Warfield, licensee of the Railway Hotel at Hendon. John was a 22 year old police constable when he enlisted on the 12th October 1915. He was a sergeant in the 47th Battalion when he was killed in action on the 28th March 1918.

The Lynam family, along with the Kilpatrick and Payne families, endured the loss of two sons in the war. Michael Joseph Lynam was a 20 year old farm labourer when he enlisted on the 7th September 1915. He was born in Allora, the son of Terence Lynam and his wife Abigail. He was wounded in action in Belgium on the 19th October 1917 and died the next day. His brother Timothy Lynam, was born in Allora, and was a 28 year old labourer when he enlisted on the 8th March 1916. He was assigned to the 42nd Battalion and was killed in action on the 8th August 1918. His father had died in 1917 so his mother had suffered the loss of her husband and two sons in the space of two years.

Arthur Archibald Cameron's story is not typical of the Allora soldiers who enlisted but is just as tragic. He was a 38 year old married man with three children when he was killed in action in France. He was born in Allora, the son of Allora's first town clerk, Alexander Cameron and his wife Esther. He completed his apprenticeship as a compositor with the Allora Guardian newspaper and joined the Queensland Mounted Infantry in which he served with the First Queensland Contingent in the Boer War along side his friend Joseph Burge. He was the Allora Town Clerk for three years before going into business as a tobacconist and stationer. He took up the licence of the Railway Hotel in Allora before relinquishing it to join the A. I. F. on the 1st April 1916 as a 2nd lieutenant. He was killed on the 26th February 1917, 18 days after joining the 9th Battalion at the front in France.

Beetles' Bikers Hit The Road for ANZAC Day.



As a result, our club members had a very successful weekend with 5 ADCA members in the winning line-up of the Encouragement Draft, 7 ADCA members in the winning line-up of the






