



Warwick Underpass update

Last week we saw the arrival of approx another 21 pieces of lift equipment required for the Split Campus Underpass project in Warwick. The equipment was successfully lowered in place on the northern and southern entrances using a 50 tonne crane.

As part of the project, reinstallation has been completed of the heritage front fence of St Mary's Church, following the temporary removal in May last

Other recent works completed at the site

- switching on of the security lights
- full landscaping works
- installation of security cameras
- glass on northern lift.

The artwork - entitled Undercurrent - on the glass lift walls and on the balustrades has been designed by local Allora artist, Dorothy Haig.

The overall project is expected to be completed and fully open to the community in May 2010, weather permitting.



Dear Editor.

With fluoride to be added to the Southern Downs Council water supplies on 31st December 2010, Allora is apparently being spared because our town water is bad enough already; One must take a walk back in time.

In 2010 Council's Mr Rod Ferguson was not willing to discuss with me if in 2007 councillors were experts on the mental health of rate payers, yet in 2010 they have become experts on their dental health needs. How can we believe that, as we witness examples such as pink batts, border control, school building costs, child care, hospitals with their failing pay systems, but most telling of all, the state of Queensland's inability to accurately dose fluoride into water suplies. Governments, be they federal, state or local, must be seen as one entity and judged accordingly.

Just this week precious small children became seriously ill after receiving a flu injection that, if radio is to be believed, was laced with a preservative called mercury, because it was supplied in

Back to 2006 when then councillor Noble was the expert on fluoride, he had the costs following, that rate payer will have to pay. A 1,000 litre drum of fluoride was \$3,000 each, which annually would amount to around \$60,000 for Warwick Shire alone. There would be power costs for pumping, and "extra" testing costs of around \$10,000 a year. The fluoridation plant would cost around \$400,000 to install with the amalgamated shires of today, plus the enormous costs. Not so apparent in 2006, the figures outlined would be a fantasy today.

So Allora be warned, you will not be dosed with fluoride right away, however our rates notices will be, in preparation I believe. It will be seen like the N.R.L.'s "Storm" salary cap debacle, carefully rebranded towards the next (council election)

Hopefully, Council point scoring will be as is "Storms" zero, come election day!





Allora's Past 85 years ago April 1925 Sacred Concert

The first Anzac Day sacred concert appears to have occurred in 1925. It was organized by the Anzac Day Commemoration Committee, chaired by Cr. T. Muir, with Mr. S. H. Reason as secretary and members, Messrs. A. C. Lickiss, A. C. Spanswick, W. J. T. Neale, H. J. Wilson, S. C. Slatter and the Rev. D. Fletcher. The Allora Picture Company provided the Central Hall free of charge and Mr. Cunnington supplied the organ. No charge for admission was made nor was a collection taken up. The Allora Shire Council covered all expenses. Customary hymns and other songs were rendered by a combined choir

and the Resolution was read by the Rev. A. Hadden and Mr. Spanswick. One minute's silence was observed at 9 o'clock. On Anzac Day in 1926, the Central Hall was filled to its utmost capacity when the sacred concert was given by a combined choir. The committee which included Cr. T. Muir, Messrs. R. C. Patrick, W. M. Holmes and R. W. Brown had made the most complete arrangements.

Cr. Muir opened the concert and introduced the choir for its rendition of "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name". A much appreciated solo by Mrs. Sapsford and the anthem "What are These" by the choir, were followed by a short address by the Rev. A. Hadden on the sacrifices made by Australian soldiers. Three minutes silence was then observed, at the conclusion of which, the "Last Post" was sounded by Mr. N. Duncan. A very tunefully rendered selection was performed by the local Salvation Army Band and a nicely rendered anthem, "Australia", was given by the Allora State School children. The programme was rounded out with the hymn "Abide with Me", a solo by Mrs. Lickiss, Kipling's "Recessional, and "The Soldier's Chorus" by the choir. The hymn "Nearer My God to Thee" and the National Anthem ended a very successful and emotional night.



Pte. Leak Memorial Plaques unveiled at historical sites -

At the Commonage, Berat, last Wednesday, 21st April two plaques were erected to record, for historical purposes, that Queensland's first V. C. winner, Pte J. Leak operated a sawmill with partners and was a farming soldier settler in the area in 1919-1920.

Pte J. Leak was awarded the Victoria Cross following his bravery at Pozieres France on 27th July 1916 and he was presented with the supreme award by the King at Buckingham

Palace London on November 4th 1916. He was subsequently wounded on his return to the front line and was severely gassed at Hollebake Belgium on March 7th 1918. He had also served at Gallipolli.

Pte Leak suffered for the remainder of his life from the effects of the gassing and lived quietly and worked hard to support his wife and seven children and took no part in public activities.

The sawmill site is on a property owned by Neil & Robyn Phelan and the home site owned by Chris Hood, Brisbane. Both owners have been very cooperative and


generous in their support for the projects which are part and parcel of a book being written by Ron Siebenhausen and Tom McVeigh on Pte Leak and his life. A son and daughter of Pte Leak live in South Australia and they have in their possession his Victoria Cross and other medals. Both are assisting Ron and Tom in writing the history of their distinguished father. Many sources have contributed to the discovery of the location of the sites, including research of the correspondence and records at the State Archives Brisbane, personal knowledge of Cecil Hoey and Harry Gwynne who grew up in the area,

assistance from Norm Tranberg who owns a property adjacent to the sawmill site and Ian Smith whose father farmed the house property when Pte Leak left the area. Norm Tranberg had been advised some years previously that there were remnants of activity on the next door property which included

old kerosene fuel tins and metal containers. Kitchen utensils had been found by members of his family as they explored the area after arriving in the district. He was able to lead the researchers to the site which coincided with the correspondence in the Archives.

Ken Ashton, Secretary, Allora Sub Branch R.S.L unveiled the sawmill site plaque and Harry Gwynne the House Plaque. Not only did

they perform the official duties, they also shoveled the soil into the post holes. Both seemed to have style as they shoveled indicating they had not been idle in their youth and had retained their boyhood skills. The stands for the plaques were manufactured and donated by Bob Denny, Denny's Engineering & Welding Allora and the plaques themselves were donated by Western District R. S. L. Inc. Toowoomba. Harry Gwynne remarked, after the official

unveiling that he would never have dreamt of an occasion like this as a boy. He recalled that in his youth he roamed over the farms with a mate trapping possums and cutting down trees with a cross cut saw to gather the bush honey from the wild bees





Glass Dominates in Warriors Bear Hunt

Classy back-rower Brady Glass posted a "Player of the Match" performance as the "Queensland Farmer's Warehouse" Wattles "A" Grade side stepped into the winner's circle for the first time this season, overwhelming the Oakey "Bears" at Oakey on Saturday night by 30 – 12. Coach Cameron Hamblin was more than happy with his side's defensive effort, but despite the encouraging result, Wattles basic error rate still needs some work. Oakey enjoyed a glut of first half ball possession, but solid Wattles defence kept the "Bears" scoreless for the initial 58 minutes

The "Warriors" were tipped in the northern press a few weeks back to be looking down the barrel of a difficult season due to the loss of some key players in the off season. However, the results of their initial two outings in this recently commenced 2010 Toowoomba Rugby League season indicate a very competitive outfit. Wattles caused glamour club Brothers no end of concern last week, leading the match against the premiership hopefuls until the later stages, and this week have finished well on top in a confidence building result. Brady Glass gave a polished performance in Wattles back row resulting in a "Players Player" award for the game. The 20 year old Glass has matured considerably as a player since making his "A" Grade debut last year, and has evolved into a vital cog in Wattles' engine room. Team mate Jim Hegarty gave another great account of himself in the engine room. The 20 year old dependable front-rower's honest, no frills approach to the game has him going about his business throughout.

Wattles unearthed a surprise package in veteran rugby union player Dan Sullivan against the "Bears". The 38 year old Sullivan's unannounced Wattles debut saw him boost the reserve grade side for the full 80 minutes, before coming off the bench for the "A" Grade side, putting in another 40 minutes in the front row. A former Queensland Under 19 rugby union representative, Sullivan is no stranger to handling a football. He combined with John Byrne in reserve grade to snatch a try for his efforts. "A" Grade Coach Cameron Hamblin was impressed with Sullivan's alround play, particularly the lines her ran. "Dan is an experienced player, an old head, who will be a more than handy addition to Wattles line up" according to Hamblin. Young debutante hooker Harry Gibson was also impressing until injured, bringing 17 year old Liam Ross into the fray. Ross had a big game, especially considering he had already played a full Under 18 match. Hamblin admits Wattles have plenty of room for improvement despite Saturday's victory, with speed to burn out wide, not yet being utilised. He was more than happy yet again by the outstanding efforts of forwards Jim Hegarty and Jason Nightingale against the "Bears".

Winger Scott Murdoch put first points on the board after gathering an Oakey kick on halfway and racing 50 metres for Wattles' opening try after eleven minutes. Brady Glass blasted his way through the Oakey line five minutes prior to halftime and offloaded to hooker Liam Ross who scored under the posts. Glass converted and Wattles led 12 – 0. Minutes later, workhorse front rower Jim Hegarty made inroads into the defence before finding five-eight Tim Hentschel in support. Hentschel fired the ball to fullback Brenden Wilson to touch down for Wattles third try, securing a vital 18 -0 half time advantage.

The "Bears" hit back in the 58th minute in a desperate attempt to stay in the game, but Wattles answered almost immediately through Tim Henstschel moving the score to 28 – 6. Fullback Wilson raced away for Wattles final try in the later stages to secure victory. Classy winger Marshall Scott suffered a leg

Nathan Murphy is an outstanding talent in the Toowoomba Rugby League, with experience in the NRL lower grades, and also the Queensland Cup. Brother Justin has a more than impressive pedigree, with NRL top grade appearances with the Canterbury Bulldogs & the New Zealand "Warriors", as well as Widnes and the French club the Catalans in the British Super League. The team will be captained by former Brisbane Norths and Melbourne Storm back Justin McKellar. Warwick team mates Scott Kerridge, former Wattles "Player of the Year" Luke Brosnan and 2009 Queensland residents front rower Cameron Mulcahy are also in the Toowoomba line up. Toowoomba will take on Bundaberg at 12.30 pm Saturday, followed by Gladstone at 3.30 pm. On Sunday morning (9.30 am) they play Central Highlands before a round of semi-finals and the final at 2.30 pm.
