



Council survey on water usage under way

Residents receiving phone calls about a Council water usage survey need not be alarmed - it is a legitimate Council survey. Mayor Ron Bellingham said that under Strengthening Basin Communities Grant funding, Council has commissioned Local Government Infrastructure Services (LGIS) to prepare a Water Savings Plan for Council's water infrastructure.

"As part of this project LGIS has commissioned a professional survey company to do phone interviews with both residents and businesses about household or business water usage behaviour and will assist with future planning for water supplies," Cr Bellingham said.

"The information from the surveys will be used to develop demand management measures specific to our community." In total there will be 500 surveys done, 300 residential (now completed) and 200 businesses with participants drawn from Allora, Warwick, Killarney, Stanthorpe and Wallangarra. Residential surveys got under way on the weekend with business surveys to commence later this week.

Cr Bellingham assured residents and business proprietors that the information and opinions provided will be used for research purposes only. The survey takes about 15 minutes depending on how many questions apply to the household or business. Council thanks residents who have participated in the survey to date. 

Letter To The Editor...

Dear Editor,

Everyday somewhere in the world families are torn apart without a second's notice, by war, armed conflict and disaster. For some, as they run for their lives without a moment to look back, it is the last time they will be with the people they love most; for the fortunate ones, perhaps decades later, they will meet again.

August marks Missing Persons Week (1 to 7 August 2010) – a reminder of the hundreds of thousands of people who are right now searching for missing loved ones. August 30 is another significant day for the world's missing, International Day of the Disappeared.

Australian Red Cross' International Tracing Service, which uses Red Cross contacts and resources in more than 180 countries, works to restore links between families who have been ripped apart by armed conflict, war and disaster. Red Cross' mandate of neutrality and impartiality helps Tracing caseworkers access information in even the most difficult circumstances.

The distress of separation and the uncertainty of not knowing if your loved ones are even alive can be devastating and debilitating. Separated families can suffer feelings of grief, isolation and helplessness.

Tracing provides comfort to broken-hearted parents and children, and a flicker of hope for reunification. About two-thirds of our cases are resolved – though sadly the news is not always good. There are many more missing out there.

Funding available for community arts projects

Regional Queensland artists could receive between \$5,000 and \$30,000 for their projects as the Australian Government

continues to invest in the future of the arts in the state.

Round 2 for the 2010 Regional Arts Fund (RAF) is now open, with applications closing on Friday 13 August for projects commencing after 1 January 2011.

Communities, artists and organisations from all over Queensland have experienced positive outcomes from successful RAF grants, with projects delivering meaningful and lasting outcomes that strengthen cultural identity, develop artists and build community cohesion.

Last year, the Fund injected over \$380,000 into regional Queensland communities, contributing a total project value of over \$1,184,567 to the state's regional arts economy.

The nine projects that received funding in the first round for 2010 included a wide range of art forms, from mosaic workshops to creative skills workshops, a community music magazine anthology, Indigenous arts, new media, percussion master classes, theatre and multimedia. 

Toowoomba bypass key to southwest's wealth

Building the Toowoomba bypass is the key to unlocking the wealth of south-west Queensland, according to the RACQ.

The state's peak motoring organisation is seeking commitments from both the Federal Government and the Opposition to provide "critical mass" funding for the bypass as part of an overall upgrade package for the Warrego Highway.

RACQ president Richard Pietsch said the highway "ticked all the boxes" for upgrading through the current government's State Infrastructure Fund, announced in the federal budget specifically for infrastructure servicing resource industries.

"We also note previous undertakings from the Opposition to fund the bypass and call upon them to honour that promise, should they be elected to government," Mr Pietsch said.

"Providing a safe, efficient road transport link to the emerging Surat Basin coal seam gas industry alone justifies greater investment in the Warrego Highway.

"The concerns were confirmed by last year's RACQ regional highways inspection tour, which found that maintenance and infrastructure upgrades had not kept pace with the increasing demands placed on the Warrego Highway."

Mr Pietsch said the significant traffic volumes and high percentage of heavy vehicles warranted widening of the Warrego Highway to a least a ninemetre standard, duplication in some areas, and the removal of hazardous roadside objects.

"But the region's primary producers have an even longer-standing cause for complaint over the steadily deteriorating highway and lack of bypass around Toowoomba's increasingly

congested streets for trucks and other through-traffic," he said.

Mr Pietsch said the next Federal Government needed to bite the bullet and commit serious, project-starting funding to the much-delayed Toowoomba bypass, recognising that traffic volumes would not support its being fully financed through tolls.

"From a strictly commercial perspective, the bypass will probably never stack up," he said.

"Therefore we need a Federal Government that is prepared to take the wider economic view of the benefits the bypass would bring to the entire region – and commit sufficient funding to help it finally become a reality."
