

Competition sizzles as Allora Butchery wins at state Sausage King

The 2010 Queensland Sausage King competition at Ekka on Sunday 8 August judged the best 42 snags from a field of more than 800 entries that competed this year in regional competitions all over the state. Run by the Australian Meat Industry Council as part of the Royal Queensland Food & Wine Show, sausages were judged in six classes: Traditional Australian, Traditional Australian Pork, Poultry, Australian Lamb/Open Class, Continental, and Gourmet/Open Class, with Allora Butchery taking out the Poultry Class.

The competition takes the top six snags from seven regions: North and South Brisbane, the Gold Coast and Hinterland, Sunshine Coast and Burnett, Capricorn and Tropical Regions, and the Outback, and sends the winners to the National Titles – Tasmania, 2011. Queensland took home three National titles at the National Sausage King competition in February this year on the Gold Coast.

The Sausage King competition is strongly supported by the AMIC, the meat industry who supply ingredients and equipment, and the butchers themselves who travelled from all over the



state to attend the finals - who see this as serious business, with sales and reputations at stake

Gail Butler from the AMIC is one of the driving forces behind the competition, "The Sausage King competition represents a remarkable journey for our sausage manufacturers. It started off 12 years ago as butchers talking in a country town, and just got bigger. Now it's amazing how many independent butchers have taken to it... they put flavours into sausages I never thought you could – it's fantastic".

For the regional finals, the same team of judges travels the state to ensure consistent results, headed by long-term chief judge Alan Rowan, who recons a good sausage "...uses fresh products, is made with good equipment, and is properly mixed with seasoning or flavourings."

The meat the sausages for the competition contain must be 100% as labeled. Next, they are judged on appearance, cut open to see if they have been evenly mixed, and when cooked they must not shrink or break apart. Finally, an individual snag is sliced up for tasting by the panel of three judges, all drawn from industry sponsors.

Errol Rees of Kerry Ingredients was the expert cook who kept the snags turning all day, "The important thing is to cook them slowly on medium heat. If you put a cold sausage onto a hot surface they may expand and break. They must be turned regularly and evenly. You don't want to prick them to release liquid, as it is that fat and water that carries the flavour of the meat."

Local culinary identity Peter Howard MC'd the Sausage King state final, "Now it is an artform, when you look at the sausages being made by our butchers ... and independent butchers must have that integrity if their customers are going to keep coming back ... by supporting these butchers you are supporting agricultural excellence.'

Alison Alexander, broadcaster and foodie turned out three fabulous dishes featuring premium sausages for the audience to taste as the judging took place, passing on great ideas for meals that are easy to prepare, nutritious and delicious.

Letter to the Editor...

Dear Editor,

As I travel around the vast electorate of Maranoa, which I have the privilege of representing in the Federal Parliament, one issue has risen above all others as vitally important to the people of western Queensland - health. Whether it is trying to attract doctors to towns or working hard to secure funding for infrastructure, the communities of Maranoa want, need and deserve better health services.

The Liberal-National Team has a range of election policies and plans that will help to improve services in non-metropolitan Australia and boost support for the dedicated health professionals living in Maranoa.

A Coalition Government will:

- · Create an \$85 million Community Health Fund for local hospitals and community health organisations to apply for funding for capital upgrades or to provide vital health equipment such as MRI, CT and PET scanners.
- Double the number of rural scholarships for medical students who commit to at least three years working in a rural community;
- Fund 100 additional scholarships to rural and regional nurses to become Nurse Practitioners; and in towns without a resident medical practitioner, we will pay annual bonuses to Nurse Practitioners;
- · Introduce a pilot scholarship scheme for dental students who commit to working in a rural area; and
- · Re-establish community-controlled public hospitals so that local doctors, nurses and community representatives - not city bureaucrats - can have a greater say on how to run local hospital services.

The Rudd-Gillard Government promised to end the health blame game but nothing has changed under the current Federal and State Labor Governments. Only the Liberal-National Coalition will return health services to our local communities, improve patient access to vital medical services and encourage more doctors to live in the wonderful rural towns of Maranoa.

Changes to Council office in Allora

In response to security concerns for the one staff member located in the Allora office, Council has made a minor change to payment arrangements.

Staff will no longer accept over-the-counter cash payments above \$150, but will happily accept cheque or card payments in the office for amounts in excess of \$150. Residents will not be disadvantaged by this change, as cash payments for any Council account can still be made at the Allora Branch of the Warwick Credit Union or the Allora Post Office.

Council's Allora office will continue to take dog (and eventually cat) registration payments: hall, cemetery and debtors payments; and partial payment of rates.

The change results from the need to ensure the individual officer's safety at peak times such as the rating period, and will resolve problems associated with keeping large cash amounts in a workplace manned by just one officer.

This situation will be reviewed in six months.





The Old Shire Hall: Is it Worth Saving?

The Old Shire Hall on the corner of Warwick and Forde Streets is leased by the Allora and District Historical Society from the


Southern Regional Council. Owing to structural problems and termite damage the Council is considering its future. Following an inspection by a structural engineer, a prominent Warwick builder has estimated the cost of repairs required to bring the building up to standard to be in the vicinity of \$280,000. Council has indicated to the Historical Society that it has set aside \$100,000 for repairs to the building, and is not prepared to exceed that amount. They suggest that the Society seek grant money to cover the extra \$180,000+ needed. building was originally the Allora Town Hall and was the headquarters of the Allora Municipal Council. It was completed in 1907 and officially

opened on the 8th January 1908. It replaced the original Town Hall built next door in Forde Street in 1870. The new building was erected by local contractor, H. W. Stay, to a plan drawn up by another local builder, Daniel Stoddart. It consisted of a council meeting room and balcony upstairs, and offices, a kitchenette, and public hall downstairs.

In February 1915, with the formation of the Allora Shire Council, the building became known as the Allora Shire Hall. Wedding receptions, dances, film shows and other forms of entertainment continued to be held in the public hall. The Red Cross used one of the downstairs offices as a blood collection room. The strong room was added about 1919.

When the Shire Council moved into a new building in Herbert Street in 1960, table tennis tables replaced the council meeting table it the upstairs room. Various groups including the Junior Farmers/Rural Youth used the building as a meeting place. In the 1970's the building was taken over by the Youth Club and the downstairs internal walls were removed to make room for a basketball court.

The Historical Society leased the hall from the Allora Shire Council in the 1990's and used it for storage purposes. They obtained a grant to replace the balcony which had been

amalgamation of the Allora Shire in 1994, the building became the responsibility of the Warwick Shire Council. The Society was granted a 10 year lease of the building in 1999 and in 2007, this was replaced by a lease from the Southern Downs Regional Council over the entire Local Government Reserve. The Society is interested in gaining public opinion on the cultural value of the Old Shire Hall to the people of Allora and district. Would they prefer to see money spent on the museum collection rather than preserving an old building? 
