#### **Landcare Working Bee -**

Five volunteers attended the Allora Landcare working bee to spray weeds along the banks of the Dalrymple Creek on Sunday 15 August.

Several mature examples of privet were sprayed along with some regrowth that had escaped the last spraying day. Examples of White Moth vine (Araujia hortorum) were also found and sprayed. This vine originates in Peru, and the stems and leaves exude a milky white sap when damaged. One example had already fruited and one seed case had already burst to liberate thousands of seeds, which are dark coloured, 4mm long and have a white silky hair tuft or "parachute" to assist their dispersal on the lightest of breezes. The other mature pods were collected and destroyed.

Allora Landcare secretary Jim Flesser would like to thank all those who volunteered for the job, as they say, many hands make light work. The Allora Landcare AGM is open to all members and interested persons, and will be held at the Blue Cow on Thursday night at 7.30pm.



# Council seeks community opinion on Warwick seven-day trading

Council will be randomly surveying a cross section of residents in the entire Southern Downs region as to their opinions regarding proposed seven-day trading for Warwick. The phone survey will be conducted by Council's Economic Development Unit

Council's Director of Community Services, Tony Minuti, said today that it was important for Council to know first hand what the community's view is on this matter.

"Retail trade is a major economic driver for the Southern Downs and in Warwick alone retail employs over 1200 people," Mr Minuti said.


"Any change to the existing business environment has to be looked at very carefully, including the possible impact on other towns in our region, which is why Council has asked for this survey to be undertaken."

Mr Minute said that Council will be considering its policy on seven-day trading for Warwick at its General Meeting later this month

"The results of the survey will form part of the decision-making process so I encourage all residents to contribute if they are contacted for the survey," he said.

There is currently an application for the approval of seven-day trading in Warwick for those businesses wanting to trade on Sunday. This application was submitted by the National Retail Association on behalf of the larger supermarkets. The matter will be decided by the Queensland Industrial Relations Commission in early October and Southern Downs Regional Council has been invited to make a submission on this matter in early September.

Seven-day trading has been allowed in Toowoomba since May



this year and there is concern that local retail businesses may suffer because of this.

The online survey is in the exact format as the upcoming telephone survey.






