Medical Facility Takes Giant Step Forward

Next Tuesday, December 6th at 1.30 pm, will become a significant date & time in the recent history of Allora and its district, especially in regards to the efforts of the Allora Medical Support Group Inc. in their 18 month dedication to establish a new medical centre in Allora's town centre. The thrust to see Allora with a suitably staffed reliable Medical Facility commenced at a public meeting in the Allora Community Hall back on March 16th 2010, a meeting that saw the Hall bursting at the seams with at least 600 concerned community members from the Allora area, and other nearby rural communities and towns. A committee was formed and charged by resolution to pursue a permanently staffed Medical Facility, that committee were joined by Councillors from the Southern Downs Regional Council forming a Taskforce to advance the cause. The Taskforce was later disbanded and on the 26th of July 2010 the Allora Medical Support Group came in to being, determined to see a new Medical Facility within the Allora business centre, convenient and accessible to the local community and those further afield.

On Tuesday AMMSG Chairman Jon Constable, committee member Roy Smith, other AMMSG members & Allora Medical Centre staff will meet with Sothern Cross Care's General Manager of Legal Services and Special Projects Paul Luton and Frank Bowling, Southern Cross Care's Treasurer of the Board of Management, in a brief ceremony that will see the AMMSG furnished with the deeds as new owners of land at 45 Herbert Street, Allora. Southern Cross Care have agreed to make the land available to AMMSG in a tremendously generous act for a most minimal fee, for the development of a modern, efficient medical facility to service the Allora & district community's needs.

Chairman Jon Constable said "ownership of the land, that includes the current aging Medical Centre facility, is a major hurdle conquered for the AMMSG committee". "We must have a suitably positioned allotment to achieve our goal of a new Medical Centre to serve community needs, and on Tuesday this will be formalized".

The Southern Cross Care management representatives will be in Allora attending the Homestead's Christmas Afternoon Tea, before meeting at the current Allora Medical Centre with staff and AMMSG committee members for the handover ceremony.

Southern Downs' 20 year vision endorsed by Council

Southern Downs Regional Council last week endorsed the content of the new Southern Downs 2030 Community Plan. The plan is a 20 year vision for the region based on six months of intensive community engagement across the region. It reflects mutual goals and aspirations for the area developed from thousands of ideas provided by the community.

"This plan will be the most important document in Council and will influence the allocation of resources over the next 20 years," said Director of Community Services Tony Minuti.

"It provides high level visionary statements to guide the actions of Council, State Government, agencies and organisations within this region," Mr Minuti said.

"It will sit above all other plans," he said. "Council's other plans such as the Corporate Plan, the Operational Plan and of course the 10 year budget forecast will need to align with this Community Plan as they are developed and updated, so that they reflect the community vision for the future.

"This is the largest piece of social planning that Council has undertaken to date and will really shape this region's future," he added.

"This project has been a collaborative effort by a very large number of people," Mr Minuti said.

"I'd like to thank the members of the Community Advisory Group who assisted with guiding development of this plan, and everyone else who contributed," Mr Minuti said.

A launch celebration is planned for February when the final designed and printed Southern Downs 2030 Community Plan document is available for distribution, and on the web.

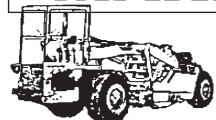
February will also mark the beginning of the implementation phase of the Plan.

RADF turns 20 exhibition

Regional Arts Development Fund Southern Downs will this week begin a series of two Retrospective Exhibitions aimed at showcasing the innovation, diversity and enduring appeal of projects funded in this region during the past twenty years.

In addition to celebrating past successes, the regional committee hopes to promote similar originality in future arts projects throughout our region.

RADF Turns 20 Project coordinator and curator of the exhibitions, Dorothy Haig, said that her "research has shown that many of the projects funded in the 1990s have been found, almost twenty years later, to have had an enduring effect on local communities and remain an important part of their psyche".

"Projects such as the restoration of the old bullock wagon in Killarney with associated veteran logger, Eric Reis; Dawn Heath's photographs depicting "A Town Like Allora"; stoneworks, Tiddalick on the banks of the Condamine in Warwick and The Lesleys created to overlook Lesley Dam by then Leyburn Sculptor, Vern Foss; and the book, Echoes of Italian Voices: family histories from Queensland's Granite Belt edited by Franco and Morwenna Arcidiacono from Stanthorpe, are examples of important symbols of life in our communities, symbols which became possible through RADF funding," Ms Haig said.

The first Retrospective Exhibition will be launched this Thursday 1 December 2011 at the Civic Centre Supper Room in Stanthorpe from 5.30pm to 7.00pm and remain open to the public between 10:00am and 4:00pm until Sunday 4 December 2011.

This will be repeated in Warwick at the Warwick Town Hall with a launch on Thursday 8 December 2011 from 5.30pm to 7.00pm and will be similarly available for viewing by the public until Sunday 11 December 2011.

Committee members will be available to discuss possible projects with potential applicants for future RADF funding at both venues during the exhibitions.

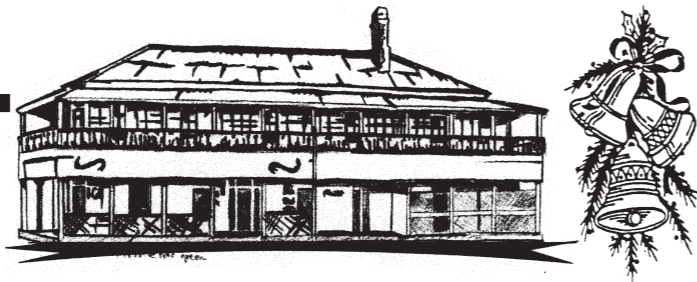

Calf Rearing Operation Approved

The Allora Shire Council this week approved of the proposal of Mr. Gerard Lessels to rear up to 1200 calves undercover on a property on the Forest Springs Road, 5 km to the north east of the town. Local restaurant owner, Mr. Lionel Watney raised strong objections to the proposal. In an open letter to the council, copies of which reached as far afield as the "London Times", Mr. Watney said that he would sell his restaurant and residential property if the council allowed noxious and pollutant industries to be established nearby. A petition against the enterprise had so far collected over 85 signatures. The Shire Chairman, Cr. Jim Deacon, refuted claims that other people were prevented from signing the petition because of fear of reprisals. The Shire Clerk, Mr. Lex Ellwood, said that because the calf rearing operation did not meet the definition of a feed lot, the application was approved without advertising for objections.

New Presbyterian Minister

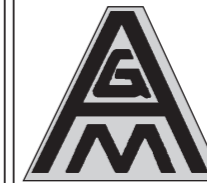

D Day for Waste Levy

The Bligh Government's waste and recycling reforms, including its controversial Environmental Waste Levy, come into force this Thursday, 1 December.

Under the Levy, all commercial and industrial waste that cannot be recycled or reused and will ultimately go to landfill will incur a charge of \$35 per tonne at local landfills.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said this includes waste from farming or agri-businesses, which Council was initially told would be exempt from the Levy.

"However, any waste that can be reused or recycled - such as green waste, scrap metal, concrete and demolition waste, waste oil, grease trap waste, drum-muster containers and batteries - does not incur the Levy," Cr Bellingham said.

"It now makes even more sense for businesses to recycle or reuse as much waste as possible, and to concentrate on separating their waste into recyclable areas that don't incur the Levy," he said.

Not all items can be recycled at all waste facilities, please check with Council to find out which facilities recycle which items, or view the table below.

"We will work with businesses as much as we can under the legislation to reduce commercial and industrial waste costs," he declared.

"I want to make it clear to residents that Council is making no money from collecting this Levy, it all goes to the State Government," Cr Bellingham said.

"In fact, we are unlikely to ever recover the cost of officer time spent on administration to implement the Levy, and we are currently out of pocket around \$40,000 for additional infrastructure like fencing and key locks on unmanned facilities," he said.

The Local Government Association of Queensland said the levy has caused much upheaval in some of the 34 councils affected as they scramble to ensure previously unregulated landfills comply with the new laws.

In the Southern Downs, all supervised sites that currently accept commercial and industrial waste - Warwick, Stanthorpe, Allora, Killarney, Yangan, Maryvale, Pratten and Leyburn - will continue to accept Commercial and Industrial Waste, applying the new Levy charges.

From 12 December 2011, seven unmanned waste transfer stations in the southern region - Amiens, Thulimbah, Pozieres, The Summit, Broadwater, Glen Aplin, and Ballandean - will be locked, with key access for domestic waste disposal only given to local residents.

"All local property holders near these facilities should now have received a letter about how to apply to obtain a key for their local waste facility," said Director of Planning and Environment Ken Harris.

"If you do not own your property and are a tenant, you need to contact your property manager or landlord about obtaining a key," Mr Harris said. Alternatively, you can contact Council.

"We will be accepting domestic waste only at these key-lock facilities," Mr Harris said.

"Commercial waste can be taken to the Stanthorpe Landfill and Resource and Recovery Centre, and people should be aware that they can take larger household or domestic items like couches and fridges to Stanthorpe at no charge."

Anyone caught dumping either commercial or domestic waste faces large fines.

The Local Government Association of Queensland said in a statement today that it has succeeded in convincing the State Government that councils needed funding help to prepare for the introduction of the levy and build weighbridges and other infrastructure but the money on offer is unlikely to cover all costs.

The statement said that LGAQ has insisted that all revenue collected from the new levy be channelled back to councils to ensure the changes lead to true reform and greater efficiency in waste processing rather than simply provide a cash cow for the Government.

**Fairholme Taste Rotary Shield
Success**

While the rain lingered throughout Saturday, it held off long enough for the Fairholme Swimming Club of Toowoomba to finish ahead of the field to earn their first Allora Rotary Open Swimming Shield success at the Allora Swimming Pool. The Allora Swimming Club have held the Shield for the past two years, but finished second behind Fairholme, 276 points to 273. Aside from Fairholme and host club Allora, teams from Clifton, Millmerran, Pittsworth, Stanthorpe, Gatton, Warwick, Dalby and Toowoomba based clubs Flyers, Newtown, The Glennie & Academy all contested what was the 44th Allora Rotary Shield Meet. Allora swimmers performed admirably across the Meet, with Age Championships going to Madelaine Nott (Girls 15 years & over) and Joshua Day (Allora).

over), Brendan Hoffman (Boys 10 years), Jack Mantova (Boys 14 years) and Joshua Day (15 years & over). The prestigious Shield has a history that dates back to the summer of 1967/68 when it was won by Warwick. Allora first won the Shield donated by the Rotary Club of Allora in 1976/77, the first year in a four year dominance that stretched to 1979/80. Allora have won the Shield on 13 occasions, more than any other club, followed by Warwick who are ten time winners, Killarney nine successes, Goondiwindi seven wins, and Millmerran, Stanthorpe & Crows Nest have all won the Shield on one occasion each. The Shield Meet, that featured 175 competing swimmers and 700 nominations, always provides some impressive performances, four records falling on Saturday. Ben Armbruster of Stanthorpe cruised down the pool in the boys 9 year 50 metre butterfly for a time of 41.19 seconds, bettering the former record set in 2006 of 41.71 seconds. In the 8 years boys 25 metre backstroke George Tighe of winning club Fairholme clocked 20.84 seconds bettering the 21.13 seconds set in 2000, and also broke a ten year old record of 21.41 seconds with his time of 21.19 seconds in the Boys 25 metre butterfly. Allora's Josh Day singed the 15 years boys 50 metre breaststroke record of 35.14 seconds set in 2001, swimming a time of 34.77 seconds. Seventeen year old Warwick swimmer Ben Batten shaved .01 of a second off the boys open 50 metre freestyle record that has stood for a decade of 26.89 seconds, touching the wall in 28.88 seconds. While not a record, Allora Swimmers Nick Van Der Poel and James Gilmore touched the wall at precisely the same moment in the boys 12 years 50 metre freestyle to finish tied in second place with a time of 34.11 seconds behind event winner Dylan Stevens of Newtown. 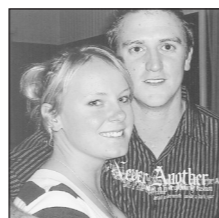

Top tips for hot dogs and cool cats:

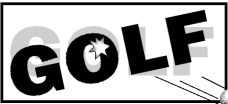
