Council planning practices top shelf

2010 was always going to be a year of challenges, from finding ways to survive the global financial crises, to addressing the challenges of planning schemes for new regional councils but the Southern Downs has been acknowledged as leading the way at the recent 2010 Planning Institute of Australia (Qld) Awards for Planning Excellence.

President Dyan Currie said that the awards showcase the high quality of planning occurring in Queensland, but also emphasise the important role of good planning in the community.

"This year we had over 90 entries across the 14 categories and many of our judges highlighted the significant increase in the standard and quality of entries this year, making the judging process challenging at times," she said.

Southern Downs took out an Excellence Award under the Environmental Planning Conservation or Rural category for their work with Buckley Vann Town Planning Consultants on the Southern Downs Non Urban Land Study.

Director Planning and Environment, Ken Harris said that Manager Strategic Planning, Jeanette Davis and the team from Buckley Vann revisited long standing planning techniques in search of a better approach to managing rural land according to its multiple values, community and economic attributes.

"The team clearly identified the specific nature and challenge and applied a combination of first principles in planning and contemporary analytical techniques to reach an outcome that could be applied to other rural and environmental planning issues," Mr Harris said.

Cr Neil Meiklejohn, Chairman of the Planning and Environment Committee, who attended the awards ceremony, said the quality of the combined work by Council and Buckley Vann was acknowledged by the presentation of an Award for Excellence from PIA.

"It was very pleasing for Council to receive such a prestigious award and it clearly demonstrates Council's ability to be at the forefront of planning in the state," Cr Meiklejohn said.

Council was also recognised with the Wendy Chadwick Encouragement Award for Bushfire Hazard Mapping – Integrating the Elements. The bushfire hazard study undertaken by Council involved qualitative and quantitative assessment to provide robust and reliable bushfire mapping. The project was developed under the control of Manager Strategic Planning, Jeanette Davis.

Ms Davis said that the method used in the study involved working with the Rural Fire Service to undertake extensive ground truthing of mapping and resulted in a better understanding and representation of the interrelationship between land management, fire and biodiversity.

"In addition to being used as a planning tool, it is intended to assist in the management of fuel reduction and to be a tool to educate residents about fire risk mitigation," Ms Davis said.

Council received further recognition by being awarded a National Trust of Queensland Governor's Heritage Silver Award for Excellence in Heritage Conservation Works or Action at a separate awards ceremony in Brisbane. This award covered the Southern Downs Cultural Heritage Study prepared by Mark Baker Town Planning Consultant Pty Ltd in association with Ivan McDonald Architects.

"The study will be used to prepare the Heritage Codes in the Planning Scheme and also the Local Heritage Register," Ms Davis said.

**Police Court – Warwick 4th Dec.
1860.**

Mr. Cook applied on behalf of Mr. Clark for a publican's license for a house situated at Allora (better known as Dalrymple Creek) to be called the Dalrymple Hotel. In making the application, Mr. Cook stated that though Mr. Clark had not had a license before, yet as he was a person of high respectability and possessed considerable landed property at Allora, and that there was not another house of accommodation between Warwick and Drayton, a distance of fifty miles, the licensing of the house would be a public convenience – License granted. (MORETON BAY COURIER 11TH DECEMBER 1860)

(The Dalrymple Hotel was Allora's first licensed hotel. John Holmes took over the license from Donald Clark in 1862. The license was held by Martin Roggenkamp from 1864 until he was declared insolvent in 1868. No further license was issued for the hotel. You would why such a substantial building could not sustain a hotel business. By 1868 the bridge had been built over the creek at the northern end of Herbert Street and the business centre of the town eventually shifted from Drayton Street to Herbert Street. Of the three other hotels in the town at that time, the Crown Inn and the Queen's Arms were in Herbert Street. Its position in Raff Street did not affect the Princess of Wales Hotel which traded from 1864 to 1954. The answer could lie in the position of the Dalrymple Hotel in relation to the creek. Donald Clark owned the two 1 acre blocks on the corner of Raff and Drayton Streets. The hotel could have been built anything up to 80 metres from the corner. Indeed the late Jack Kerr said that he could remember the floor of the hotel still being in place in his school days in the early 1900's. He recalled that the hotel site was some distance from the corner. The record 1864 flood is known to have entered the building.)

The photo at the top of this page is of the Allora Senior Team 1938 which was defeated in Allora in the final of the St. George Cup against the Warwick Rep side 6 to 3 on Sunday, 27th July 1938. Unfortunately no names are recorded with this photo.

This photograph is to be included in a book documenting the history of the Allora Rugby Club, being compiled by Tom McVeigh and John Croke. No reference to the Allora team players in the photo could be found in existing press material at hand, however there was material on the team 3 weeks before when the game was in Warwick, but the names then are not the same as the photo shows.

Tom McVeigh recalls that he and John Fogarty sold chocolates and lollies with trays over their shoulders for Bob Brown who was secretary that day. He has a rough recollection of who played that day, but can't identify everyone in the photo. The oldest living former Allora player is Tom Maher, and he has been able to assist in identifying many of the missing names. 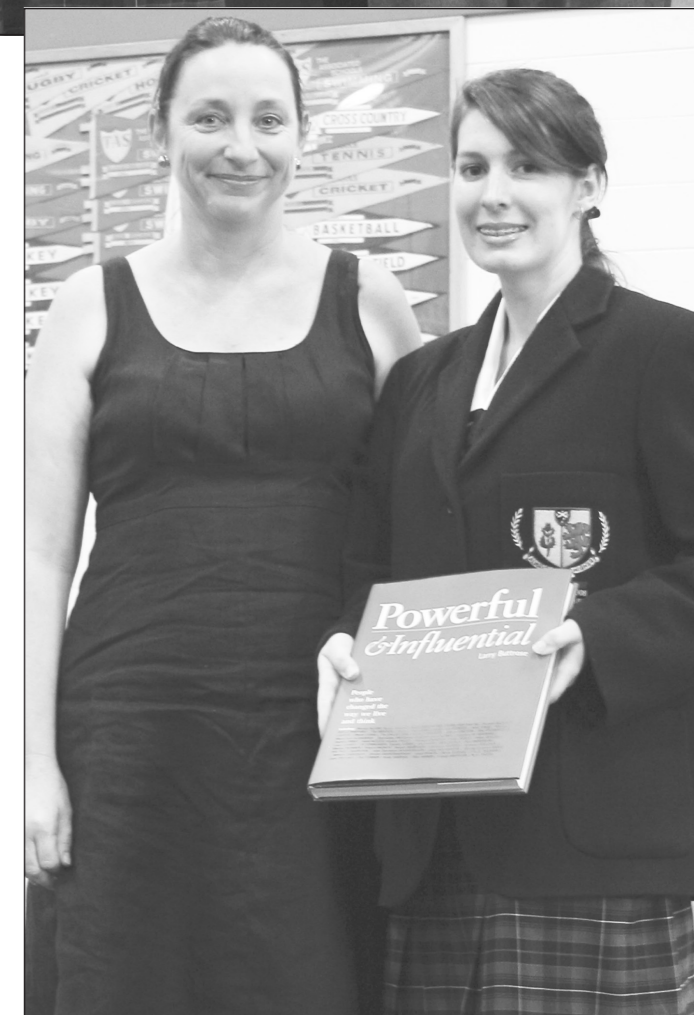
