



Looking Back...

Descendants Found

From information provided by several sources, descendants of the family of Pte. James Robert Smith, killed in the Battle of Fromelles in 1916, have been found.

A granddaughter of Francis David Sarjeant, a half brother of James Robert Smith, and his wife Betsy, sang at the wedding of Joyce Dougall and Ron Gordon in 1951 and Pat and June Lawson have given contact details for the family. Although there is no connection between the two families. Ms. Jillian Trethewey, the Glengallan Smith family historian, has made contact with descendants of the East Talgai Smith family. One complication to the task of identifying the body of Pte. James Smith is the fact that he had only sisters on the Smith side of his family, and his half brother Francis David Sarjeant, had only daughters. Apparently DNA is easier to trace between male descendants.

The story of James Robert Smith as we know it, is that he was born at East Talgai on the 29th March 1893, the son of James Smith and Harriett, formerly Sergeant, nee Flint. James Smith snr. was a groom at East Talgai. James Robert Smith attended the Hendon State School, He would have caught the train at Ellinthorp Railway Station as did other children of East Talgai employees including the late

The 1903 electoral roll records James and Harriett Smith living at East Talgai Station where James was a station hand.

James Robert Smith joined the Star of Allora Protestant Lodge in 1910. His occupation is given as farm hand. He enlisted on the 12th December 1915 and was later posted to the 31st Battalion in France where he was killed in action on the 20th July 1916. His name appears on the Allora cenotaph, the Warwick cenotaph, the P. A. F. S. O. A. honour board, and appeared on the Hendon honour board (lost in the 1926 school fire). A headstone was later erected to his memory at the Warwick cemetery.



Drink to good health with water

To avoid dehydration over the summer months, Queensland Health is recommending people drink plenty of fluids each day, but be wise to the type of fluids they consume.

Darling Downs Population Health Unit public health nutritionist Sarah Stevenson said many Australians do not drink enough fluids.

"If you wait to drink until you feel thirsty, you're probably already dehydrated."

"Dehydration can lead to constipation, kidney stones, bladder infections, fatigue, headaches and poorer learning and thinking abilities. Elderly people and young children are most at risk,"

Ms Stevenson said our bodies' need for fluids varies widely, according to environmental conditions, the amount of physical activity undertaken and individual metabolism.

"Adults should aim to drink at least eight glasses of water every day. Children should be encouraged to drink at least four to five glasses of water."

"During very hot weather, and when being physically active, everyone should aim to drink more fluids. For example, for every hour of strenuous exercise, drink an extra three to four classes." she said.

"Breast milk is the best fluid for babies under six months and it's not necessary for breastfed babies to be given additional water – just offer them the breast more often."

Ms Stevenson said water should be the drink of choice for adults and children.

"Keep water chilled and add ice cubes. Flavour water with a slice of lemon or lime, or some chopped mint."

"Try to get into the habit of replacing that 'second' cup of tea or coffee with a glass of water."

"Keeping a refillable water bottle close by at work, at play, when shopping and travelling in the car; and, when dining out, asking for a jug of water to be served to your table."

Ms Stevenson said other healthy options include low-salt plain mineral waters, soda waters, weak cordial, welldiluted fruit juice, milk, herbal teas and weak tea.

"It's important to reduce the amount of soft drinks, caffeine drinks, sweetened fluids and sports drinks consumed."

"These drinks are usually high in some form of sugar, contain few nutrients, may lead to tooth decay, excess energy intake and weight gain," she said.

Caring for carers over the holiday period

This holiday period, beyondblue: the national depression initiative urges everyone to spare a thought for the invisible army of carers who dedicate their time to looking after others. More than three million people experience anxiety disorders and/or depression. The number of carers is estimated to be much greater.

Associate Professor Michael Baigent, Clinical Adviser to beyondblue, said carers can feel isolated during the holiday period when the role can be extra demanding and negative attitudes and stigma may be more profoundly felt.

"For some people, the Christmas holidays can be a difficult and demanding time, but when someone has to provide an extra level of care for a loved one, it can be very hard. Many carers don't have the time to catch up with other people and eniov the traditional festive activities.

"The holiday period might also bring into focus those things the person has given up in order to care for someone else. New Year's Eve in particular is a time to reflect on life, relationships and the future. Carers might be more aware of the limitations in their lives and the problems the person they care for might have."

Associate Professor Baigent says it's common for some carers to feel excluded from activities by family and friends who don't understand.

"Stigma that surrounds depression and anxiety disorders affects carers too. This might lead to more isolation at this time of year. Carers might not get invited to events with family and friends because of negative attitudes about the person who is ill." he said.

CEO of beyondblue, Leonie Young, added that there are many things people can do to reach out to carers over the holidays. "Be inclusive and aware of how that person might be travelling. Ask people how they're going and offer emotional support as well as practical help, if possible.

Food Safety a High Priority During the Holiday Season

Food safety should be a priority during the holiday season says Dr Michael Eyles Food Safety Information Council Chairman.

"Hot weather, large crowds, overloaded fridges and foods we don't normally cook, all make perfect conditions for food poisoning," Dr Eyles says.

"We are also more likely to be cooking for several generations and we need to be especially careful when preparing food for young children, the elderly, pregnant women, and people whose immune systems may be compromised, as food poisoning can be very serious for them.

"There are a few easy things to do in order to minimise the obvious food safety risks.

"Clean out the fridge so there's plenty of room to store food and ensure it's set at 50 or below. Plan the menu to ensure perishable food can be stored properly and to minimise leftovers. Discourage family and friends from arriving at the last minute with cream filled desserts, seafood or other items which will need fridge space. Lastly, have plenty of ice available so drinks don't have to go in the fridge.

"Getting the drinks out of the fridge is easy and has huge benefits. There will be more room in the fridge, the fridge door will be opened less often, and the drinks container filled with ice can be strategically placed to minimise the kitchen traffic. Less people underfoot allows the cook to be less hassled and therefore more likely to follow the basic food safety tips of clean hands, utensils and chopping boards well and often, cook food properly, separate food which will be served cooked and uncooked, and chill cold food and serve hot food steaming

"Keep food out of the temperature danger zone - between 5 and 60 degrees Celsius - where food poisoning bacteria grow best. Prepare foods as close as possible to eating time and don't leave food out to nibble on too long, for example put out small serves of dips and replace every few hours."

Dr Eyles says one of the biggest challenges during this period is the turkey as it is not something we cook very often.

"Deciding whether you actually need a whole, large turkey or not is a good starting point - perhaps just a breast or other cuts is enough and will decrease the food safety risks as it will be easier to store, prepare and cook. There will also be less leftovers to worry about.

"If you do have a large turkey ask your butcher to defrost it in the cool room. If this isn't an option, due to the size it's OK to defrost a turkey in a cool place, but you must make sure it is thoroughly defrosted and cooked all the way through. Use a meat thermometer to check that the temperature in the thickest part reaches 75 degrees and juices from the thickest part of the turkey must run clear. Because stuffing slows down cooking and cooling, it is best cooked separately," Dr Eyles

fishmonger to pack your purchase with ice, transport it home in a cooler and then store it in the coldest part of your fridge. Don't leave seafood in the temperature danger zone for longer than necessary.

"Leftovers are another challenge so they are best minimised through good menu planning. If you do have perishable leftovers remember the 2-4-OUT rule:

- is not sitting in the sun.
- when originally taken from the fridge; if they contain dairy products, raw eggs, or other risky ingredients; if they are exposed to the sun for most of this period, or if they will be eaten later by young children, older people, or those pregnant or unwell.
- 4 hours or more unrefrigerated throw it OUT.

"Ham will keep well with proper handling. Remove it from its plastic wrap, cover with a clean cloth soaked in water and vinegar so it doesn't dry out. Store it in the fridge at or below 5 °C. Reduced salt hams are now becoming popular but will not last as long as conventional hams so follow instructions on the packaging. If a large amount of ham is leftover consider cutting off a chunk and freezing it for later use.

"The Christmas and New Year holiday period is to be enjoyed. Following just some simple food safety tips will mean you, your family and your friends will be less likely to be one of the 5.4 million cases of food poisoning that occur in Australia each year," Dr Eyles concluded.
