(Sir William Gunn, Wool Industry leader, was invited to open the show on the suggestion of Fr. McCormack. Father Thomas McCormack was Parish Priest in Allora from 1960 to 1968. He was a veteran of sheep dog training, having taken up working and breeding sheep dogs twenty years previously when he was a priest in the Roma district. He was president of the Queensland Working Sheep Dog's Association for at least fifteen years and had won many awards including the "Open Trial" at the Brisbane Exhibition)

Allora's Past 100 years ago February 1911 **ALLORA SHOW**

The 27th annual show held under the auspices of the C. D. A. & H. Assn. may easily be classed as one of the most successful conducted by the association. The weather was kind on the day of the show which had been postponed for three weeks because the uncertainty of the weather. On the completion of the judging, the show was officially opened by the Hon. James Tolmie, Minister of Agriculture and Stock. As a natural result of the luxuriant weather of the past few weeks, the Show Grounds were a thing of beauty, clothed in a carpet of living green, mowed and trimmed under the supervision of the Secretary, Mr. J. H. Buxton. The new parade ring was, on all sides, voted a huge improvement on the barbed wire entanglements which did duty previously. The coveted Champion Wheat prize for milling wheat went to Mr. George Grayson from seven other entries. Mr. Grayson's sample of Budd's Early weighted 70 lb. to the bushel (standard weight 60 lbs)

In the Dairy Cattle Section there was an excellent exhibition of Milking Shorthorns. S. A. I. Co. (Talgai West) swept the board winning all seven classes in the section, as well as winning Champion Dairy Bull of the Show and Champion Cow of the Show.

In the Vegetable Section the prizes for 6 beetroot, Plate of tomatoes, and Bunch of rhubarb were all won by Ah Dick (the Chinese market gardener)

In the Pantry Section the prize for Best Damper, not more that 3 inches thick, baked in ashes, was won by Mrs. J. E. Harvey, and in the School Work Section, Best Scrap Book by a boy or girl under 15, was won by Miss E. Noel Briggs (50 years later, long term secretary of the C. D. A. & H. Assn).


New subdivision approved in Stanthorpe

A new estate of 29 residential lots has been approved by Southern Downs Regional Council for development in Stanthorpe.

Director of Planning & Environment, Ken Harris, said it's a sign that the Stanthorpe area is still growing.

"Council is still keen to encourage good development in appropriate areas, and this development application was considered right for the area."

Under the approval for reconfiguration of a lot and material change of use, two vacant lots (Lot 12 BNT67 and Lot 16 RP12304) with access to Pitts Street will



be divided into 29 lots. The proposed layout is similar to previous subdivisions in this area.

The proposed lots vary in size from 739 square metres to 1755 square metres and will have two pedestrian pathways; one linking the subdivision to the existing park located to the northeast, and the other to the land to the south.

Well done Southern Downs! Flood Appeal tops \$65.000

Mayor Ron Bellingham has congratulated locals on their generosity as The Southern Downs Mayoral Flood Appeal to help local flood victims topped \$65,000.

As at 11am Monday morning the total tally available for flood relief was \$65.400.60.

Anyone from the Southern Downs area who has been affected by floods is now encouraged to apply for assistance grants. Local flood victims had until close of business Wednesday 2 February 2011 to apply for the first round of financial assistance from the Appeal.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said he was extremely pleased at the

amount of money raised here in such a short time, and now he wants to see that go to those flood affected locals who need it most.

"Some people have had significant losses and damage, and the clean-up is still continuing," Cr Bellingham said. "This fund is to help people who need immediate assistance with food, appliances, getting tradesman, clothing and other kinds of flood relief."

Donations have been made through partners the Warwick Credit Union, Stanthorpe branch of Suncorp Metway Bank and Stanthorpe branch of Queensland Country Credit Union.

A meeting was held after 5pm Wednesday to authorise more cheques for victims, and to target amounts up to \$500 (higher on occasion) for losses suffered in the floods.

Riddiford well have his "thinking cap" on as he settles on a halves combination that, barring injury, can guide the side through the season. Wattles forward pack has no shortage of workers, starting with club captain Aaron Scheid back in the mix. Scheid missed the 2010 season with injury, but will be back to his workaholic best leading from the front with fellow forwards Brady Glass, Jason Nightingale, Nick Colthup & outstanding colt Liam Ross. Another new face sure to add some class to Wattles pack is former Toowoomba Newtown player Ray Duncan. Duncan was previously turned out with Wattles, and while then an outside back, he has now made the transition to the forwards. A player sure to make an impact in 2011 is utility player Justin Van Der Poel. A graduate of Wattles JRL Club, the 20 year old Van Der Poel presents as an imposing package at 185 cm and 95 kgs. A thorough gentleman off field, Van Der Poel is a fierce runner of the ball using his size and genuine speed to great advantage. He debuted in top grade last year in Wattles second round loss to the "Tigers", scoring a try in his first "A" Grade appearance. Wattles new signing's Rob Woodbridge, Dean Cubby, Aaron Hooper & Ray Duncan shone in last weekend's "Warriors Knockout Rugby League Carnival" in Toowoomba. Woodbridge,



repeated his success of 2010 in the Carnival, captain-coaching his team, this year "Maso's Mob", to victory in the annual event. The "Maso's Mob" line-up that also included former Wattles players Anthony Schofield & Jack Dempsey, was named in honour of respected indigenous rugby league identity, and another former Wattles player, the late Jason Clevin. "Maso's Mob" were presented with the "Cec Docherty Memorial Shield" after winning the final 35 – 16 over "Giddy Goanna's".

Cyber-safety skills urged for kids entering digital schoolyard

Parents in Queensland have spent up big equipping their kids with the latest gadgets ahead of the new school year but many have failed to equip them with cyber-skills new Telstra research has revealed.

More than a third (34 per cent) of Queensland parents surveyed will send a child to school this year with both a laptop computer and a mobile phone.

The research, however, revealed that parents with children aged 10 to 17 haven't set aside time to talk to their kids about cyber-safety issues such as protecting their privacy and



managing approaches from cyber-bullies.

The Telstra research found:

- Queensland parents have spent up big on school tech. Four in ten (40 per cent) parents surveyed have recently purchased a laptop for their child's schooling and one in five (21 per cent) have recently purchased their child a mobile phone.
- Mobiles and laptops top the list of school-bound gadgets. Seven in ten Aussie parents (74%) say their child will take a mobile phone to school this year. Half (54%) of parents say their child will take a laptop to school this year
- New tech not being accompanied by new skills. Almost one in five parents admitted that they haven't spoken to their kids recently about how to protect themselves from approaches from cyber strangers, while a third say they haven't spoken to their kids recently about how to respond to cyber-bullies.
- Mobile safety essentials often forgotten. One quarter of the parents haven't spoken to their kids recently about who they should share their mobile number with and almost four in ten (38%) haven't discussed how to keep access to their phone secure through the use of PIN and password.

"In this digital age, internet connected devices such as laptops, mobile phones and mobile tablets can be just as important to learning as paper, pens and text books," said Telstra Country Wide Area General Manager South East & West Queensland, Nigel Beaman.

"They are a great way for kids to access online resources like news archives, virtual libraries, dictionaries and videos.

"But like any device connecting to the internet, mobiles and laptops present children with risks they don't necessarily understand. Our research shows that while parents are equipping their kids with technology to assist their studies, some are forgetting to equip them with the skills required to use these tools safely – an essential part of a positive online experience."

Telstra's research also revealed:

Aussie mobile ownership can start young. The majority of parents (73%) believe kids should be able to access their own mobile when they become a teen or enter high school – while one in five parents think kids should be able to access their own mobile phone in primary school.

Early access to laptops seen as crucial. Two thirds of parents (65%) think their kids should be able to access a laptop as young as possible or at primary school.

Parents are concerned by cyber safety risks. Parents mainContinues on page 12

concerns include: unsolicited contact from strangers (with 84% of parents surveyed saying this concerns them); the publication of their child's private content like photos or address details online (69%); cyber-bullying (66%); internet scams (64%) and identity theft (with 63% of parents saying it is a concern). Parents often relaxed about monitoring kids' internet time. Only

33% of parents closely monitor their kid's use of the internet, with 43% saying they 'keep an eye on it' and a further 22% saying they 'tend to be relaxed' and trust their child.

"Teaching kids when it's appropriate to share personal information, explaining what to do if approached by a cyber bully or online stranger and how to apply social network privacy settings should be part of every parent's back to school checklist," Mr Beaman said.

- 1. Protect yourself by keeping private information such as your birthday, school, home address or phone number private.
- 2. If you get harassed by a cyber-bully speak to a trusted adult so they can help. Try not to respond to a bully and block them so you can't receive their emails, instant messages or texts.
- 3. When using social media sites, don't become 'friends' with people you don't know in the real world and make sure you use the privacy settings to manage your privacy and the content vou share.
- 4. Only publish information you are comfortable with everyone seeing - once it's online it's always online.

6. Only connect to Wi-Fi hotspots that protect your personal data like bank account details, PIN numbers, or passwords. Make sure the hotspot is provided by an organisation that you trust (like your school) and that the connection is password-protected.

Mobile safety tips

- 1. Be careful who you provide with your mobile phone number and respect your friends' privacy by not giving away their details.
- 2. Ensure your mobile phone is PIN locked. If you use a smartphone, also set up a password to protect your email and social networking accounts when your phone is switched on.
- 3. Notify your mobile service provider if your phone is lost or stolen.
- 4. Think before you send. The person who you send text, picture or video to may not be the only one who will see them
