Hughes Fires in Wash Out

Big hitting Allora batsman Stephen Hughes slammed a gritty 68 for the "Foodworks Eleven" on Sunday against Maryvale-Condamine on the turf at Warwick's Queens Park, in a match that was later washed out due to wet weather. Allora got away to a great start as openers Hughes and Ross Hentschel (40) put together a 76 run partnership to get the innings off to a flying start. All rounder Adam May came in at first wicket down to add to his impressive 2009/10 season average with 47 to have Allora at 3 for 152 when he was caught by Julian Luke off medium pacer Jordan Siebenhausen. From that point the Allora innings lost traction losing the following seven wickets for just 33 runs to finish with a total of 185. Young Maryvale-Condamine bowler was the star of the match, pocketing a record breaking 8 for 16 off seven overs routing the Allora batting line-up. The feat is all the more astounding considering Siebenhausen is aged only 13, playing in his fifth game of senior cricket. While there are no official Warwick Cricket Association records to compare with Siebenhausen's outstanding performance, his 8 for 16 is considered to be the best effort in Association fixtures since Errol Hall took 10 for 0 for Australian Hotel against Tannymorel in the 1980's. Allora blooded 14 year old talent Brodie Frizzell in the game, a local representative junior player, who showed he will figure prominently in local cricket in the future. Frizzell bowled three overs, finishing with 0 for 21 in his first senior outing. While debuting for Allora late last year, another 14 year old in Brodie Ellery also took his place in the line-up, while Andrew Denny donned the whites for his second successive match. Denny took 2 off the bat in his debut against competition leader's Inglewood the previous week, and this week was still at the crease, 9 not out, when the last wicket fell. Tim Hentschel made his initial appearance for the season joining his brother Ross, Tim having turned out for the club in previous seasons.

As a result of the wash out result, Allora pocketed two competition points, as did opponents Maryvale-Condamine. The result, coming hot on the heels of losses since the season resumed after New Year to Wheatvale and Inglewood. Allora are level on the points table with this weekend's opponents Colts, in fifth place on 20 points, both two points behind Maryvale-Condamine which is on 22 points. Allora need some winning results as they move into the final four fixtures of the season if they are to figure in the finals. Over the next four weeks they will match wits against Colts this Saturday, followed by Wheatvale, Diggers & Inglewood prior to the finals that commence on the 7th March. Experienced campaigners Cameron Stevens and Travis McMicking return to the "Foodworks" side for the match against Colts, while club stalwart Andrew Petersen will be absent. Petersen is a valuable member of the Allora bowling arsenal, claiming 1 for 31 off eight overs against Maryvale-Condamine and shining with 3 for 18 off five overs the previous week against Inglewood. Maryvale-Condamine opener Rob Lindsay was in fine form on 76 not out and his side at 3 for 120 when the game was called off on Sunday. Mrs. Shooter recalled this was always sung with vigour at the Hendon Hall in her youth. The celebrations were held in the Widgee Reception and Community Hall amidst the huge sporting complex all built by voluntary labour. The canteen is staffed by volunteers at the several big annual sports days and club functions.

The former federal Member for Darling Downs, Hon Tom McVeigh, who is remembered as a small boy in the Allora district by Mrs. Shooter, assisted her, with members of her family, in cutting the cake which Tom had made for her and which was iced by his wife Sandra. In speaking on behalf of all present he said "Mrs. Shooter belonged to the old brigade and was a member, in his view, of those wonderful pioneering woman immortalized in the poem by George Essex Evans "The Women of the West". Mrs. Shooter was renowned for helping the young with handicraft skills, and sporting opportunities, particularly on the tennis court, and she impressed on them the value of honesty, integrity, fairness, and by her example, always with a smile, that hard work hurt no one and developed character. Mrs. Shooter has volumes of that. Her son Graham, in reply, thanked all for making the day such a memorable one for his mother. He reminded all that on her 100th birthday his mother had arrived by helicopter and he had promised her that for her 110th birthday he would take her on a trip to outer space. His mother acknowledged his promised gift with a smile.

Limitations on taking water Upper Condamine Water Management Area and Condamine and Balonne Tributaries Water Management Area

- This notice is given by the chief executive pursuant to section 25 of the *Water Act 2000* ("the Act").
- This notice has effect on and from 28 January 2010, and until further notice, for the Upper Condamine Water Management area zones UCU-01 and UCU-02 and the Condamine and Balonne Tributaries Water Management area zones CBT-07, CBT-08 and CBT-09 as defined by the *Condamine and Balonne Resource Operations Plan 2008*.
- The notice published on 12 November 2009, having effect on the taking of water from the Upper Condamine and associated tributaries is withdrawn.
- The taking of water under the following entitlements:
 - water allocations for any purpose that have both a nil passing flow condition and a condition stating that the water cannot be stored; and
 - water licences for irrigation purposes, is limited as follows until further notice.

5. Notwithstanding clause 4 of this Notice:

- the chief executive may give a licensee a notice pursuant to section 25 of the Act, to withdraw and replace this Notice to the extent that it applies to that licensee; and
- a licensee who is given a notice mentioned in clause 5 (a) of this Notice may take water only in accordance with the conditions in that notice.

6. Licensees wishing to be given a notice mentioned in clause 5 of this Notice should provide the chief executive with a written submission demonstrating why the limitation under clause 4 is unsuitable to the licensee's operation and identifying an alternative limitation.

7. The operation of this Notice is not affected by the making of submissions under clause 6 of this Notice.

8. A person must not take water in contravention of this notice. A contravention of this notice is an offence under section 25(4) of the Act and renders a person liable for a maximum penalty of 500 penalty units (\$37 500).

Note: Submissions to the chief executive may be addressed to the Departments Warwick office see details below.

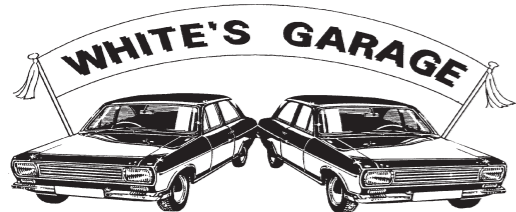

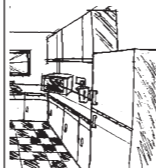



Rugby Union football was
played in Allora from the
early 1890's. At a meeting
on the 13th April 1907, the
Allora Rangers Football
Club was formed with W.
E. Hawes elected
president and P. Bonfield

membership fee was 2/6.
The Central Downs Rugby

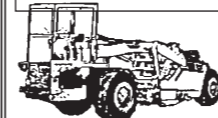

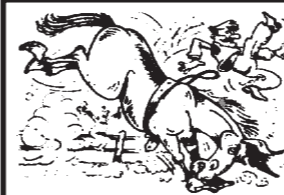
