

Warwick will host its first-ever million dollar indigenous art exhibition next year.


The exhibition, to be produced by the Economic Development Unit of the Southern Downs Regional Council, will be held at the Warwick Regional Gallery in September 2011.

"Works on display will include paintings by the late Emily Kngwarreye, who was the first indigenous artist to sell at auction a painting in excess of \$1 million "



New pregnancy tags protect cattle buyers and sellers

New tags which recognise the pregnancy status of cows and promise greater protection when buying and selling cattle are now available in Australia.

The National Cattle Pregnancy Diagnosis (NCPD) Scheme, established by Australian Cattle Vets (ACV), a special interest group of the Australian Veterinary Association (AVA), has been improved to give greater certainty when trading cattle.

"We've revised our existing preg testing scheme to give better protection to cattle buyers and sellers," Dr Andrew Hoare, ACV President said.

"The tags, which have a defined certification mark, clearly indicate what is going on inside the cow or heifer.

"The improved scheme is legally stronger, more robust and uses a registration system alongside the traditional tail tags to protect those in the business.

"The owner now has a certificate signed by an accredited tester which goes with the tag.

"To become an accredited tester, you need to be a registered veterinarian and an ACV member. You need to have assessed more than 2,000 head of cattle using manual palpation, and complete a practical exam. Ultrasound pregnancy diagnosis accreditation is only available to veterinarians who are already accredited for manual palpation," Dr Hoare said.

"Only accredited vets are able to apply the tags, so when you buy or sell a cow or heifer with a tag, you know they have been tested by an expert.

"This scheme meets the legislative requirements for all states, as some states insist that preg testing is an act of veterinary science."

Sellers should contact their regular vet to ensure they offer this service.





Killarney Medical Centre funding application submitted

Hopes of securing funding for the proposed Killarney Medical Centre rest on the success of the Southern Downs Regional

Council's latest application for \$450,000 made to the Federal Department of Health. The application, made under the National Regional and Rural Health Infrastructure Program (NRRHIP), is for funding to construct a multi-purpose medical centre, which will be used to attract a full-time GP to the town. 

VACCINATION OF DOGS AND CATS

An article about vaccination of dogs and cats in the Courier Mail newspaper of 5th February, does not give an accurate picture say the Australian Veterinary Association (AVA) and the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA).

The APVMA supports the vaccination policy of the AVA. The AVA policy Vaccination of dogs and cats is a detailed document, and the article's attempt to simplify it has given pet owners incomplete information. For example:

• Triennial vaccinations are only appropriate for adult animals.

• Triennial vaccinations only protect against some diseases*. There may be other diseases that an individual animal should be protected against that require more frequent boosters.

 Puppies and kittens need a full series of vaccinations and a booster 12 months later.

There is a risk that media attention may reduce the rate of vaccination in young animals. It is important to have all puppies and kittens adequately vaccinated when young. There is a need for greater vaccine coverage rather than less to prevent serious and sometimes fatal diseases that can be very contagious.

Decisions about whether and when to revaccinate should be made by the veterinarian and the owner together based on the animal's specific circumstances.

There is a need to amend vaccine labels that imply a need for life-long annual revaccination with 'core' vaccines*. For more information contact:

* 'Core' vaccines are: For dogs - canine distemper virus, canine adenovirus and canine parvovirus. For cats - Feline parvovirus, feline calicivirus and feline herpesvirus.





Letter to the Editor...

Dear Sir.

I write you, if I may, on the subject of pet vaccinations. It is in response to a recently published article in the Allora Advertiser stressing the need to re-vaccinate adult dogs.

I certainly agree that all dogs should be properly vaccinated as puppies then be given a booster after a further twelve months. Owners should be aware that occasional outbreaks of parvovirus do occur and the disease is often fatal to unprotected puppies.

Ongoing re-vaccination in the form of 'boosters', however, is a different matter! That information comes from highly respected veterinary researchers. I regret I did not learn about this until after my own dog suffered so badly following a 'routine' vaccination booster.

She suffered neurologically following vaccination, and with her being an Assistance Dog there was also the risk of her presenting a public hazard until it became clear that she had fully recovered. Her co-ordination and behavior deteriorated so suddenly and so dramatically that the regular veterinarian suggested she may need a CT scan of her brain. It was frightening, extremely distressing and she was unable to work for many months. Once she did recover, and with no further vaccinations, the seasonal pollen allergy that had affected her since puppyhood disappeared completely. It is not uncommon for 'niggling' health problems to simply vanish once one stops booster vaccinations!

Veterinary researchers have been warning for many years that vaccination, despite its unquestioned benefit, is not without the potential for short and/or long term risk. Of more significance is that it has been shown that following vaccination immunity lasts a minimum of 7 years and probably for the life of the animal.

There is no benefit - at least for the dog and its owner - of booster vaccinations!

All this information is freely available to pet owners – provided they have online access.

One Australian website which has collected various sources of this information is http://www.freewebs.com/novaxx/. On the Links page visitors can access information from published articles, which the lay person can understand, to some papers authored by the veterinary researchers themselves.

A yearly visit to one's veterinarian for a comprehensive and thorough wellness exam is well worth the money spent without the inclusion of a booster vaccination.

Thank you for allowing me to share my concerns and this information through your paper.

Changes to the Forde Street Pedestrian Crossing

visibility of pedestrians by motorists could be improved as many motorists were not stopping for pedestrians in its current state.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads consulted with schools, local police, allora museum and community members to evaluate the best solution for this location and gain feedback on the possible removal of the Aleppo Pine tree at the location.

Their feedback, along with the results of an environmental assessment report on the trees health, finding it to be in very good condition, has meant at this stage of the project the department will not be removing the tree, but will assess this again following the post construction audit. Initial works in the coming months will include Ergon installing the street lighting

followed with the removal of the existing pedestrian crossing linemarking and signage to commence the concrete kerbing. We would like to remind motorists and pedestrians to observe all signage and be extra cautious and mindful when travelling in the area and walking across Forde Street during the works.




