Have your say on the Allora Streetscape

Allora is a quintessential Queensland country town with a charm and character all its own, developed over the years since its birth in the mid 1800s.

Southern Downs Regional Council is now funding a study into ways of enhancing that inherent character with a rejuvenation of the Allora main streetscape.

Fifty thousand dollars has been set aside in this financial year to develop designs for enhancing the streetscape in the main business area along Herbert Street between Warwick and Drayton Streets.

"The goal is to develop an attractive sense of place that builds on the current character, has community support and enhances long term business, tourism and town development opportunities," said Mayor Ron Bellingham.

Residents are invited to an initial public consultation with landscape architect Stephen Palmer and Southern Downs Regional Council staff to provide your input, ideas and feedback on what you want for the Allora business streetscape. Issues such as shade and rain protection, greenery and plantings, pavement treatments, meeting places, colour and design, artworks, drainage, parking, signage and equal access for people with disabilities will all be considered.

"It's important to stress at this point that nothing has been decided or set in concrete as to what will happen in the Allora streetscape," Cr Bellingham said.

"We are looking for residents' input before elements are decided on, and will be holding a public consultation for input on Friday 25 and Saturday 26 February.

"We recognise an opportunity to build on Allora's unique features and in so doing, establish a centre of special character,

based upon the pleasant and scenic nature of the locality and its strong "sense of place".

Landscape Architect Stephen Palmer has studied the area and is keen to meet locals and hear what they want.

"The street itself is very flat with little grade variation, and apart

from the Blue Cow Hotel there is no vegetation on the street," Mr Palmer summarizes.

"We'll be available to discuss some of the design issues, such as those found on the Western side of the street which has shallow gutter clearance for ramp crossings across the street gutter, access limitations into some of the Allora Shops and little protection for the verandah posts from vehicle parking."

"There are many options for enhancements, some of which may be practical rather than visual, such as extra outdoor electricity points in the street to help with staging "street events" like the Allora Bush Christmas party," he said.

The Mayor said that once end designs were adopted, Council would look at funding sources for any associated construction.

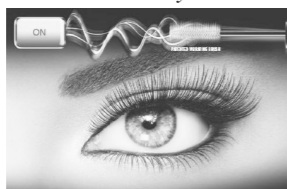

The pick-up of large unwanted items usually occurs on alternate years in Stanthorpe and Warwick at the same time as Clean Up Australia Day. Last year was Stanthorpe's turn, this year is Warwick's turn.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said that Council has had to postpone this year's pick-up because of the workload on Council's works crews dealing with flood repair.

"We are putting every available resource behind flood recovery at the moment, with pleasing progress like the re-opening of Palmer Bridge on Freestone Road yesterday," Cr Bellingham said.

"The kerbside pick-up will be rescheduled for a later date this year once priority flood recovery works are completed."

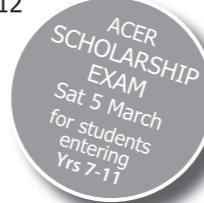

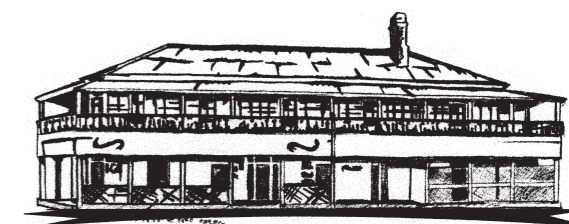

New STOP signs in Warwick
 Obey new STOP signs or face \$300 fine - All Give Way signs in Canning Street, Warwick, between Fitzroy Street and Wood Street have been changed to STOP signs.
 Mayor Ron Bellingham said that Council has made the change at the request of Warwick District Police, following numerous accidents along this stretch.
 "This change is also supported by the Warwick & District Road Safety Advisory Group, which has been concerned for some time about people not properly giving way at these intersections. "We hope this helps eliminate the likelihood of accidents in this area," the Mayor said.
 Ten give way signs at five intersections were be replaced with STOP signs last Wednesday and Thursday.
 A white line is painted across the intersection next to each stop sign, replacing the dotted Give Way line. Motorists must come to a complete halt before the white line at a Stop sign and pause before continuing.
 Penalties for failing to stop are \$300 and three points off your licence.
 Motorists are also warned that a new STOP sign has replaced the Give Way sign on the corner of Willi Street and Glen Road Y-intersection in Rosenthal Heights.
 The change comes after a resolution in Council late last year to help improve traffic safety at the intersection.

Weeds need controlling after the rains
 Weed growth has exploded after the rains, with seeds from declared weeds also potentially spreading to new areas via swollen creeks and rivers.
 This week, Southern Downs Regional Council pest control officers started a three month survey mapping the spread of declared weeds like European Blackberry and African Boxthorn across the region.
 It is important to get on top of declared weeds before they seed and spread further.
 Pest control officers can provide information on the best herbicides to eradicate each declared species, and help with correct identification if landowners bring a sample in to Council. Landowners can also hire 600 litre quick spray units from Council to assist with weed control.
 Officers will issue pest control notices to landowners whose properties have populations of declared pest plants. Property owners will then have a period of time to control those populations.
 High priority pest plants include Bridal Creeper, Weedy Sporobolus (Rats Tail) Grass (Parramatta, Giant Parramatta), St John's Wort, Honey Locust, European Blackberry, African Boxthorn and Salvinia.
 This survey will run over three months, ending 18 May 2011. For more information, contact Council's Pest Control officers on 4681 5500 (Stanthorpe) or 4661 0300 (Warwick).

Artists urged to apply for RADF Round 3

Applications are now invited for financial assistance under the Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) program Round 3 - 2010/11, after the new RADF Committee considered six arts projects under Round 2 of the program.

Southern Downs RADF committee chair Cr Mally McMurtrie urged anyone with an arts or cultural related project in this region to apply before the Round 3 deadline of April 8, 2011.

"We've had some exciting projects come through in Round 2, but there is still some money available, so we are running a third round of applications this year," Cr McMurtrie said.

"The Round 2 deadline coincided with the floods and we understand that some artists were unable to meet the deadline, so we're opening another round."

There was \$52,993 available in Round 2, with six applications totalling \$30,425 received.

Those six projects will be considered for approval by councillors in tomorrow's Community Services Committee meeting and next week's Council General meeting.

Remaining monies will be available for new projects by professional artists, arts workers, cultural workers, project coordinators, professional emerging artists, community groups and organisations within the region, for one-off short term projects.

"Projects must offer professional arts, cultural and heritage opportunities," Cr McMurtrie said.

To be eligible for approval, projects should also not commence prior to approval being granted by the RADF Committee and Council. Artists should be aware that grant monies will not be received until after the approval process is finalised.

The Regional Arts Development Fund is a Queensland Government and Southern Downs Regional Council partnership to support local arts and culture with a total of \$92,500 available for arts funding this financial year.

Cr McMurtrie said she is extremely happy with the new RADF committee, which has two new members this year, Mrs Dorothy Devine and Ms Barbara Hadley.

"There is a wealth of arts knowledge and experience on our committee and we look forward to considering creative and interesting projects that will further arts in the region."

The third round of funding will close at 5pm on Friday, 8 April
