Mandatory jail time for assaults on police

Thugs who seriously assault police or emergency services workers will face a minimum of three months jail under laws introduced into State Parliament by the LNP on Wednesday. Deputy LNP Leader and Shadow Attorney General Lawrence Springborg said an overhaul of sentencing laws was needed to provide a strong deterrent to criminals who attacked police and emergency services workers.

"Police and emergency services workers have a tough enough job working to protect the community and criminals need to be sent a message that violent assaults, and spitting on and biting these officers, won't be tolerated," he said.

"Under Labor's laws, criminals who attack police know they won't face serious consequences with only one in three offenders going to jail.

"The LNP's laws will not allow Labor's weak sentencing laws to give thugs and idiots who want to use our police officers and emergency services workers as punching bags the soft option of court ordered parole or suspended sentences."

Mr Springborg said it was time the Bligh Labor Government offered bipartisan support towards making Queensland's streets safer for police and the community.

"The Western Australian Government last year introduced laws that provide for minimum sentences for offenders who assault police, so there is no excuse for the Queensland Government not to act now," he said.

"The LNP introduced similar laws three years ago, but Labor used its numbers to defeat the move.

REMINDER FOR ORGAN DONOR AWARENESS WEEK -

Minister for Human Services, Chris Bowen MP, and Parliamentary Secretary for Health, Mark Butler MP, has urged Australians who have registered their organ and tissue donation decision with the Australian Organ Donor Register to check their details are up to date and talk to their family about their decision.

"Around 5.6 million Australians have registered their donation decision, including the organs and tissue they wish to donate, on the national Australian Organ Donor Register," Mr Bowen said.

"Australian Organ Donor Awareness Week is from 21-28 February and is a great reminder to check that your registration details and contacts are up to date."

The theme for Australian Organ Donor Awareness Week this year is 'family discussion'. A third of



Australians have not discussed organ and tissue donation with their family and Australia's current national family consent rate for organ donation to proceed is just 56 per cent.

"If you plan to be an organ donor, it's important that your family know and accept your wishes as they will be asked to give their consent for the donation to proceed," Mr Butler said.

"That's why as part of the new DonateLife™ program, we are encouraging Australians to discover the facts about donation, decide whether you want to become a donor and discuss your decision with your family."

The Australian Organ Donor Register is administered by Medicare Australia. Authorised medical personnel can access the register 24 hours a day from anywhere in Australia.

The number of people in the Darling Downs Statistical Division on the Organ Donor Register increased from 43,248 to 43,910 during 2009, an increase of 662.



Dog rego's on the way

With registration notices now in the mail, Mayor Ron Bellingham has issued a timely reminder to Southern Downs' residents of the importance of registering their dogs.

"If Council officers pick up a dog without a registration tag, we are unable to contact the owner to advise them that their dog has been impounded," Mayor Bellingham said.

"Unfortunately, if a dog has not been collected from the pound within three business days, it will be euthanased," he said.

By paying the annual registration fee, residents are assured of Council having the necessary details to arrange the safe return of impounded dogs.

Registration fees for each dog over the age of three months in the former Stanthorpe Shire and each dog over the age of four months in the former Warwick Shire area are as follows:

Owners of dogs who have completed a Certificate of Training in Dog Obedience by a recognised dog obedience club or recognised training organisation are also entitled to a 50 per cent reduction in fees.



Looking Back...

Allora's Past 100 years ago February 1910

An Allora Boy

Detective Gravson of Queensland Criminal Investigation Branch, is without question, the youngest detective in Australia. He is only in his twenty-third year. In addition to being a smart thief-taker he is a good all round athlete. Yes, and brought up rigorously by an honest, God fearing dad, he is a credit to the Police Force, and the most cavalier of advocates when defending prisoners, takes Detective Grayson's word as the absolute truth without comment.

John James (Jim) Grayson was a son of Mr. and Mrs. George Grayson of Hendon. He was born on Talgai Station and represented Darling Downs at schoolboy cricket. He went on to play first-

grade with the Valley Club in Brisbane. He was also prominent in Brisbane rugby league circles and played top class golf. During his Police career he was awarded the Royal Humane Society's medal for his rescue of two drowning men in the Brisbane River.

Progress in Allora

Bank manager, Mr. Corden.

"Works will include installing concrete islands in Percy Street for pedestrians to cross more safely and improved line-marking for motorists entering the intersection."


Mr Platz said traffic controllers would be on-site to direct traffic safely through the site and ensure continued access to local businesses while works were

Gemma of St Judes visits Stanthorpe

At a presentation in Stanthorpe at St Joseph's Hall last Wednesday (15 February), School of St Judes in Tanzania Director & Founder Gemma Sisia, addressed students and staff of St Joseph's school as well as many friends of St Judes from Allora, Stanthorpe and Warwick.

The St Patricks Parish and School in Allora have been supporting Gemma's work over the past 7 months and endeavour to continue raising awareness and funds for these schools well into the future.

Last year the St Patricks School held a 70's night in Allora and donated \$750 to Gemma's work. The St Patricks Parish also catered for a recent local wedding and recently handed over \$200 to Gemma at the presentation in Stanthorpe. (see picture).

During Gemma's promotional/ fundraiser tour, she is also travelling the country with our local girl, marketing employee Sarah Henry (John & Narelle Henry's daughter), who attended both St Mary's and Scots PGC schools in Warwick.

Gemma is the only daughter of Sue and Basil Rice. They raised their eight children on a fine wool sheep station just out of Armidale on the New England Tablelands. When 22 year old Australian, Gemma went to volunteer witnessed first hand the results of

people in the Third World caught in the tragic cycle of poverty, intensified by a lack of education. There she taught mathematics, science and sewing to girls in Kalungu, a rural village near Masaka township in the middle of Uganda.

Following years of volunteer work in Uganda and East Africa, Gemma returned home to rural Australia to a rewarding teaching job and a comfortable lifestyle, but never forgot the poverty and suffering she left behind in the country that still had her heart.

Gemma, at 24 years of age, with the powers of persuasion honed by growing up with seven brothers, easily convinced some of her friends and family members to pledge at least \$5 a month, to be put into an account at the local bank, and the proceeds of which enabled 2 young women to go to school in Uganda. From this humble beginning, the East African Fund Incorporated was born and is now a registered Australian charity (No: CFN16123). With Gemma's unceasing energy, passion, dedication and enthusiasm for the projects of the East African Fund inspiring others, she was asked to speak at various Rotary Clubs in her local area. The word spread quickly and many individuals and members of schools, institutions,

in East Africa for a few years, she Felicity Philp and Monique Bryson on behalf of St Patricks Parish handing over \$200 to School of St Judes Director Gemma Sisia.

businesses, Inner Wheel and Rotary Clubs throughout Australia, pledged donations and assistance. Soon Gemma's dream of starting a school became a reality.

So in February 2002. Gemma founded The School of St Jude in Northern Tanzania, East Africa. The School of St Jude is owned by a registered Tanzanian company that is a "Company Limited by Guarantee and not having a Share Capital" called The School of St Jude Ltd. This company can not be bought or sold but rather only given to another similar not-for-profit company with similar objectives.

The School of St Jude opened its doors to three very small, bright and underprivileged students, with one teacher and a single classroom. Seven years later the school has grown to over 1300 students, spread across two amazing campuses and employes over 350 local staff.

The years spent in Africa were tough but rewarding years for Gemma as she witnessed and personally experienced a gamut of life's character building lessons. These lessons were gleaned from incredible hardship and painful loss (not least of which, watching her close friend, Gertrude, dying of AIDS), and rich rewards reaped from seeing many triumphs over adversity and forming strong and lasting friendships, including her best friend, soul mate and now husband, Richard Sisia.

The regional economy has steadily steamed ahead according to the latest economic data for the Southern Downs.

The data, contained in the latest 2009 Warwick and Stanthorpe Economic Briefs, is commissioned each year by Council's Economic Development Unit.

Mayor Ron Bellingham said that he was pleased to receive positive proof of the growth of the region over the past 12

"I am always hearing from residents as I move around the area how things have been picking up.

"Now it's good to see it actually proven in black and white," he said.

SDRC acting Economic Development Manager, John Randall, said that overall, the Southern Downs has grown stronger economically, adding 6.9 per cent to the Gross Regional Product, which shows production now at over \$1.4 billion per

"This means we are employing more people; up in 2009 by almost 700 extra workers compared to the 2008 figures," Mr

"Our population continues to grow, up 1.5 per cent to an estimated 34,621 persons. "We now estimate that our region will have nearly 44,000 persons within the next 21 years."

Mr Randall stressed that whilst population growth for the Southern Downs was below the Queensland growth figure of 2.3 per cent, the growth rate of 1.5 per cent for the Southern Downs was considered steady and sustainable.

"We are not a boom or bust economy," he said.






