

Allora Win Needed As Finals Approach

The Allora Cricket Oval will host its first cricket match for 2010 on Sunday when Inglewood clash with the local Allora "Foodworks" Eleven

in the "headspace" Warwick Cricket Association Round 10 match. The outing will be the first for the Allora combination this year after winning on forfeit against "Diggers" on January 3rd. "Why Not?" come and see... **TED'S TRACTOR TREAT**

It will be an absolute treat for tractor buffs at the 2010 Allora Heritage weekend when they see the featured marquee Case represented by Allora's Ted Cowley and his 1949 Case LA series thirty horsepower tractor. An excited Ted explained how his tractor was purchased new by his father at the forty nine Clifton show. Now sixty years on after a lifetime of work for the Cowley family the old machine is finally getting a makeover with fresh shiny paint applied by Allora's Peter Morton just in time for the Allora Heritage Weekend.

Ted tells how as an eight year old (nudging nine) he watched in awe as George Rumming from Rumming Bros garage of Clifton the local Case agents drove up the driveway to the Cowley families mixed farm "40 cows, 200 acres grain and 50 cattle" patiently waiting to learn to drive on the bright red Case. Cowley's first tractor had been a W30 McCormick but this time Ted's dad traded in his John Deere D model.

The Cowley's were keen on their tractors. In 1952 they bought a new Caterpillar D2 for £3200 and in the sixties a Chamberlain for \$600. They also purchased a new Ford overhead valve

The Case serviced the family farm very well till it went under the 1976 floods and then languished for a couple of years before being repaired. When asked why he is restoring the old Case, Ted's reply "...for Allora and our family's history". What better reason?

The Cowley family is dedicated to the Allora district and places considerable importance on the Allora Heritage Weekend as the showcase of the local history and the men and machines that pioneered our region. Ted's Case will be one of Case models leading the tractors Grand Parade.

Skin checks urged for this summer

Cancer Council Queensland is urging all Queenslanders to get their skin checked this summer season.

Community Services Co-ordinator at Cancer Council Queensland, Rachel Hull, said the early detection of skin cancer is vital for all Queenslanders.

"Queensland has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. so it's really important that people keep an eye on their own skin for early signs of skin cancer and see a doctor regularly for skin checks," Ms Hull said.

"In many cases skin cancer can be successfully treated. Regular check-ups can help to detect skin cancer early.

"Recent Queensland Health research shows Queenslanders are still forgetting to apply sunscreen while outdoors, which is alarming with Queensland's extreme UV levels.

"Cancer Council Queensland strongly urges everyone, especially those with sun damaged skin, to get their skin checked as soon as possible this summer," she said.

More than 2600 Queenslanders are diagnosed with melanoma each year, and more than 260 people die from the disease. All Queenslanders are encouraged to protect themselves from

Looking Back...

Allora's Past 25 years ago January 1985

Allora's Past 100 years ago January 1910

Early Days Reminisces

At the reunion of old residents of the Allora district held on New Year's Day 1910, Mr. Thompson, at that time probably the district's longest resident reminisced on his arrival at Goomburra Station exactly 60 years to the day ago. Previous to his arrival at Goomburra, Mr. Thompson had worked for the Leslie Brothers at Canning Downs. His wages had been £6 per year plus two suits of clothing. Mr. Thompson recalled that on one occasion he had been sent from Goomburra Station to Jubb's blacksmith shop to have a horse shod. This was in the days before Separation and long before the town of Allora was surveyed. There were no railways in the Colony at the time. It was then said that the land was no good and should be returned to the aborigines. The land was worth more in pounds now than it was in shillings then. Mr. Thompson ended his reminisces by saying that the young people of today might well be proud of the stock that they had sprung from.

INFORMATION REQUIRED

The Allora Historical Society has received an email from Michael Doyle who wants to find out about the boxing career of his father, Timothy Patrick Doyle, who was born in Allora in 1915 and appeared in boxing rings in and around Allora in the 1940's and 1950's. 





Oxford Australia Word of the Month

Broggie - a tight turn of a motor vehicle, usu. executed at speed; a broadside. Australian Concise Oxford Dictionary 5th edition

In Ross Barrett's 1992 novel Suns of Home (published in South Australia) the word broggie appears: 'Harry races her off in a series of broggies with mum squealing.' A broggie can be performed with a bike, with a motorcycle, or with a car: Pine Rd, Woodcroft, will remain a dirt road despite more than 350 people signing a petition calling for it to be bituminised for dust and safety reasons.

... Vines Golf Club of Reynella general manager Paul Sutcliffe said the road was a magnet for hoon drivers. 'Because it's not bituminised we have drivers who are spinning wheels and doing broggies, often at night', he said. (Southern Times Messenger, 9 September 2009)

Parent John Klomp said that some non-skaters were causing problems by driving on the dirt around the park, 'You get that at any footy oval (next door). I used to happen before the skate park was here they used to do broggies in the dirt." (News Review Messenger, Adelaide, 8 August 2001)

I am sure I speak for many of these people when I say that doing burnouts, broggies, donuts, drags and blockies around this suburb at 4am is unacceptable. (Advertiser, Adelaide, 9 January 2006)

The evidence here is from South Australia, but the term is also used in Western Australia and in some other parts of Australia. The **broggie** is a sharp turn or slide of a vehicle, with the aim being to throw up a lot of dust. The word is an abbreviation of broadside, with the addition of -i. There is some evidence of a form broadie, so this is probably the transitional form on the way to becoming a broggie. The original broadside in this sense appeared in the 1930s in the form of a verb that meant: 'Of a motor cycle in dirt-track racing: to skid and slide in the cinders as part of a deliberate manoeuvre when the rider is "hugging" a corner. Also in extended use of a car, pedal cycle, etc., esp. in a controlled sideways skid' (OED)

TO FLUORIDATE OR NOT **TO FLUORIDATE - THAT** IS THE HARD WATER QUESTION

Despite comments in the press, I do not regard myself to be an anti-fluoride campaigner. I am always most particular to stay out of the scientific argument as to whether fluoride is safe or not. The debate has become so politicised and polarised

that it is difficult to hold a logical, objective standpoint. However, what I am concerned about is that before public water supplies are used for mass medication purposes, the communities who will be drinking the fluoridated water should be consulted. It's a basic democratic right! Every effort should be made to provide balanced information and then allow the people to make a choice. There should be no fluoridation without proper consultation.

There appear to be some technical issues with Allora's water treatment infrastructure that have prompted council to ask for a 12 month extension on the State government's 2010 deadline to commence fluoridation in the district. There is apparently also some consideration being given by council to surveying the Allora townsfolk about the quality of their water



supply in coming months. However, I don't think council has any intention of including a question about fluoride in that survey - perhaps this is because the State government has mandated fluoridation through the Water Fluoridation Act of 2009. Council have been told to do it - or else! Council will no doubt take the three wise monkeys approach - see no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil. If you don't ask the people, you don't have to explain why you are ignoring the voice of the people. Ominously, the same Water Fluoridation Act removes all rights of civil action or appeal from anyone that suffers ill effects from fluoridation. So much for assurances that it is absolutely safe! One thing is for sure, fluoride will not improve the quality or taste of Allora's water!

As council appears to be reluctant to rock the state government boat on fluoridation by speaking to the people first, I carried out a small survey of my own by telephone and in the streets. The results are far from statistically defensible but they do indicate that only a minority in both Stanthorpe and Warwick support fluoridation (18% and 32% respectively). It was also very clear that the vast majority of people feel that the community should be properly consulted before fluoridation is carried out (98% and 86% respectively).

Whatever your views on fluoride, it seems foolish in the extreme for council to fluoridate 100% of the water supply to provide the 2% that people actually drink. The rest will go down the toilet, on the garden or through the laundry. Also, the beneficial effects claimed for fluoride are topical not systemic. It only has to come into contact with the surface of your teeth, you don't have to swallow it. In fact, the most enthusiastic supporters of fluoridation are always careful to add that it works best when accompanied by proper dental hygiene, regular brushing, and a sensible balanced diet. Surely it would be far more effective for individuals who want to use fluoride to use fluoridated toothpaste or mouthwash and leave the water supply free of medication for those of who don't want to use it. Just prior to Christmas young Allora local Verity Thorburn was announced as one of ten Southern Downs Regional Council Young Ambassadors & Delegates.


