Death of Long Term Resident

The death occurred of Mr. Robert Frizzell snr., who came to the Allora district 56 years ago from Ireland at the age of 17. He first found employment as a farm hand for Mr. Alex. Shannon, later taking up work as a carrier and contractor. When the Talgai West property was divided into share farms, Mr. Frizzell took up one of the farms, purchasing the property after the Talgai West subdivision in 1912. Mr. Frizzell was a long time member of the Allora Show Society and an Allora Shire councillor for a considerable period. He was a member of the Victoria Hill School committee for more than 30 years.

Mr. Frizzell was twice married and was survived by his second wife and a large grown-up family.


Allora Man in Antarctica

With the publicity about the recent (12th January 2012) centenary of the arrival of Douglas Mawson's scientific and exploration party in Antarctica, it is of interest to note that a former Allora man was involved in the expedition. Sydney Jeffryes, a son of Henry Jeffryes, Post Master in Allora from 1891 to 1909, joined Mawson at Commonwealth Bay on the Aurora's second trip in January 1913.

After leaving school Sydney found employment with Queensland Railways and advanced to the position of Assistant Station Master at Clifton. He qualified as a radio operator and was appointed to the Australian Antarctic Expedition in that capacity. Mawson, having missed the second arrival and departure of the Aurora, was forced to spend another winter at Commonwealth Bay with six companions including Sydney Jeffryes. Sadly, soon after arrival, Sydney suffered a mental breakdown, greatly adding to the expedition's hardships.

The seven remaining members of the expedition returned to Australia in February 1914, Sydney Jeffryes later spending time in a Victorian asylum.



Trade training boost for Warwick region

Allora P-10 State School, Warwick State High School, Clifton State High School and Killarney State School students are set to benefit from a new \$3.5 million Federal Government investment in trade training, Federal LNP Member for Maranoa Bruce Scott said Tuesday.

Mr Scott said the new project, the Warwick Trade Training Centre, would be mainly based at Warwick State High School but would also support students from Allora, Clifton and Killarney.

"The Federal funding will include the construction of an industrial workshop and an industrial shed, the refurbishment of an existing facility to include an engineering workshop, as well as providing equipment across the schools," he said.

"The Trade Training Centre will deliver Certificate I and II qualifications in agriculture, engineering and manufacturing and also Certificate II qualifications in Sampling and Measuring. "With the Warwick region located on the cusp of the Surat Basin Energy Province, these Certificates and facilities will help more local students find employment in skills areas identified by the resources sector."

Motorists urged to avoid flooded roads

Persistent rain across south east Queensland has prompted the RACQ to remind road users about the dangers of driving on flooded roads.

RACQ spokesperson Brodie Bott said it was essential that motorists and pedestrians exercised extreme caution in the wet after authorities warned of localised flash flooding across parts of the state.

"It only takes 15 centimetres of water to knock a person off their feet and 60 centimetres to wash a car off the road," Mr Bott said.

"So, the message is simple - avoid flooded roads, regardless of whether you have a four-wheel drive or a small car.

"Water can be very powerful. We've all seen what it can do to cars and homes. If you come across a flooded road, the best course of action is to find an alternative route. It's not worth risking your life.

"Forecasters expect the wet weather to continue over the next few days, so we're also asking motorists to use common sense and drive to the conditions."

To ensure a safer journey in wet weather, Mr Bott suggested that motorists:

- Slow down and leave at least four seconds distance between their car and the car in front.
- Turn the headlights on while driving, but remember to turn them off once they arrive at their destination to avoid a flat battery.
- Increase visibility by using the fan or air-conditioner to demist a foggy windscreen.
- · Avoid driving if it's not essential.
