#### **Senior Citizens Open Doors** to Public

Fancy a game of cards, other games, afternoon tea, and great company in pleasant surroundings? In an attempt to promote awareness of their group, President Mary Smart and the Allora Senior Citizens Club committee are opening their doors, inviting community members to be a part of their weekly card meetings. You don't have to be a club member, just looking to enjoy some time and conversation with people that have their community at heart. The card afternoons on Monday & Friday weekly commence at 1.00pm with afternoon tea at 3.30pm.

Many within the Allora community will have visited the stylish brick hall at the rear of the Southern Downs Regional Council building on the corner of Herbert & Drayton Streets, the home base of the Allora Senior Citizens Club for the past 32 years.

Most will recall the Senior Citizens Centre as a popular venue in Allora for community social

events, celebrations, birthday parties and more. But the Centre is much more, it has been a thriving hub of activity for the Allora district's senior population since it opened; cards, concerts, bowls, bingo, cent sales, functions and meetings, the list goes on, seeing the Centre a well used and very necessary facility. However, in more recent times various factors have affected the use of the hall as a venue to be hired, and time is also having it's affects on the membership of the Allora Senior Citizens Club. Membership numbers are dwindling, putting pressure on the precious few that actively maintain the Centre and manage activities for the lessening list of members. Those in our district community aged fifty and over are very welcome to join the Senior Citizens Club, to enjoy the company of fellow club members and the varied activities the Club provides. The proven successful social group that has catered so admirably for our senior population for over 45 years extend a warm welcome new members. Current members are not as young as they used to be, and some new faces will provide some additional energy, time & direction for the Club's future which is vital to the Allora community. Many loyal committee members have guided the Senior Citizens Club very successfully since it formed, an example being the 17 consecutive years of voluntary service as Secretary by Mrs. Joyce Black and former Treasurer Heather Mole, but new members are needed if the tradition is to continue.

The Senior Citizens Hall was built in 1980 at a cost of \$127,000, considered Allora's number one building at the time, with Allora Shire Chairman Stuart Henry encouraging use by all sections

#### of the community.

A visit to the Pittsworth Senior Citizens Centre by Allora Hospital Board & Allora Shire Council members started moves for a similar centre in Allora, the Board members "amazed at the facilities at Pittsworth". Councillor Henry said "after seeing what they had, we decided that Allora's senior citizens deserved something similar".

A public meeting was called and the Allora Committee for the Aging established, the well attended meeting also prompting the Hospital Board to contribute \$20,000 towards a centre. A federal government subsidy of \$81,000 and a \$41,000 State subsidy funded the construction of the building.

Since that time the Allora Senior Citizens Centre has served our elder population and the Allora community well, and if the current committee of the Allora Senior Citizens Club have their way, their Centre will continue to be a community hub well into the future.

The Senior Citizens Club have a lengthy history in "the Best Little Town on the Downs", having formed at a meeting in the Allora Shire Council offices, Chaired by then Shire Chairman Stuart Henry, on the 16th of June, 1965. The Club later became incorporated on the 27th of January, 1989.

While the Club has a lengthy and respected history, an increase in membership is absolutely vital to the Club's future existence according to Committee Treasurer John Roessler. Hire of the Senior Citizens Centre has also diminished in recent times, and along with the concern of withering numbers at Club activities, the committee have concerns over falling income. Membership numbers stood at 58 when the Senior Citizens Centre officially opened in 1980'. In 1994 membership had reached 70 and 2006 saw the club boasting 87 members.

The 2010-11 year saw President Jan Moore mention in her annual report that membership was on the decline, and the rising expense of bus trips to neighbouring centres and points of interest was now curtailing that activity. However, the Club's annual Cancer Day with a "Bring & Buy Stall" raised \$ 800 for the very worthy Cancer Fund charity, just another example of the support the Senior Citizens Club have provided their community over many years.

#### **Ducks Ready for Starters Gun**

Its Dalrymple Duck Race time again in Allora, with event organizer Ted Cowley busy selling tickets for 400 of the cutest yellow ducks that will take to the Allora Swimming Pool at 3.00 pm on Australia Day in what has been a novel and successful fundraiser over many years for Allora Show Princess entrants. It may not be the race that stops a nation, but it will halt a good percentage of Allora as they cheer their duck home from poolside. The main race will be preceded by a warm up race to help the ducks stretch a few necessary muscles and get their bearings, and punters can also buy tickets to acquire a warm up

This year the Duck Race will benefit Show Princess entrants and Allora locals Lauren Morris and Jessica Van Der Poel, with both young ladies willing assistants selling Duck Race tickets. With the purchase of a \$2.00 ticket community members can lay claim to a duck in the big race, and should that duck cross the finish line first the winner collects an easy \$150, second place pockets \$100 and a crisp \$50 note goes to third place.

While Ted Cowley, assisted by Princess entrants Lauren and Jessica, have been selling Duck Race tickets in recent weeks outside Allora Pharmacy, tickets will also be available before the big races on Australia Day.

The Dalrymple Duck Race has become an Allora district tradition, first held in the late 1990's. The popular race draws a healthy crowd to the Allora Pool, but the fundraising event had its beginnings in the Stuart Henry Park stretch of Dalrymple Creek, with up to 300 yellow rubber ducks winding their way downstream on a 50 metre course with nature providing the momentum for the wining duck.

The Dalrymple Creek Duck races back then were great spectacles, and great fundraisers, but the event didn't come

### Looking Back...

Allora's Past

#### **Historic Car Returns to Allora**



Noel Cox and his immaculately restored 1912 Cadillac Model 30 Tourer.

When vintage car enthusiast, Noel Cox of Toowoomba, bought the shell of a 1912 Cadillac from former Allora resident Bill Budd in the 1960's, he was told that the car had a connection with the famous "Talgai Skull".

The "Talgai Skull" is that of a young aboriginal boy believed to have died 14,000 to 20,000 years ago. It was found by contract fencer, William Naish, at Talgai West in 1884. Although it has since been pre-dated by another find, at the time that it was first examined at the University of Sydney, it was believed to have been to been the oldest known Australian aboriginal relic.

In August 1914, eminent anthropologist Professor (later Sir) T. W. Edgeworth David contacted William Naish, then aged 76 and living in retirement in Allora, to show him where he had found the skull. Mr. Naish was picked up in Allora and Professor Edgeworth David was met at the Talgai railway station (now Ellinthorp) in two cars, one big and one small. The larger car is believed to have been a Cadillac hired from Jack Murdoch of Warwick, who had replaced his horse drawn cabs with three Cadillac's in 1912.

The big car caused a sensation as cars were then rare in the Allora district. It was seen at the time, and later described many years later, by Reg and Les Shooter two young local lads swimming in the creek.

Noel Cox paid Bill Budd, then of Northgate in Brisbane, £22/10/0 for the chassis, engine and four rotted wheels of the Cadillac. With the addition of a £10 body from Ipswich, a £3 windscreen from Tannymorel and much painstaking work, he has restored the car to the showroom condition that it is in today. It can be seen in all its glory at the Allora Heritage Weekend organized by the Warwick Veteran and Vintage Vehicle Club.

#### Allora Landcare Group

The Allora Landcare Group (ALG) is a not-for-profit volunteer organisation that has been in existence for over 15 years and is part of the larger Landcare movement within Australia. It is affiliated with the Condamine Headwaters Landcare Group based in Warwick. The members of ALG continue to meet on the third Thursday of every second month, the next meeting scheduled for 16th February. The group meets at the Blue Cow Hotel in Allora at 7.30pm. All those interested in joining the group are welcome to attend. There are no joining fees.

The aims of the group are to maintain and sustain the local environment by conducting relevant projects in the district. Possible activities are discussed and any necessary funding is sought as a grant through appropriate government agencies. The most recent project was a weed eradication and planting program along the banks of Dalrymple Creek. The flooding experienced early last year destroyed much of the good work but replanting took place and so far appears to be successful. The group in conjunction with the Riverside Trust will also consider eradication of larger woody weeds such as willow and privet along the creek banks as a future project.

A major initiative currently under discussion is the development of Allora Mountain for recreational purposes. The aim is to establish easy vehicle access, initially to reach the level of the reservoir. Walking and riding tracks and possibly extension for vehicles to the top of the mountain are intended. Discussions with the mountain lessee, the Southern Downs Regional Council engineer and other interested stakeholders have been positive. An announcement seeking community input for the project was published in the Allora Advertiser in mid 2011 and the ALG again requests local people to contribute ideas to what we see as a major benefit for the town and district.

The lower levels of Allora Mountain have suffered marked pollution for years from rubbish and litter blown from the town dump. With the recent redevelopment of this facility to become a transfer station, the ALG will conduct a group activity on the mountain to remove rubbish as part of Clean Up Australia Day on 4th March. The project has been registered and it is intended to combine this worthwhile activity with a social function such as a sausage sizzle, sponsored by Allora FoodWorks.

The ALG continues to support the Allora Show and members will be in attendance this year. The famous ALG raffle of native plants conducted by Jim Flesser will again be a feature. Tickets are free and separate lucky numbers for adults and children are drawn every hour from 10.00am each day and announced over the PA. Please drop in to the ALG display trailer, take a ticket and say hello. We particularly like receiving botanical specimens, including weeds, of interest or unknown nature and we will endeavour to identify them for you. Another ALG Show feature this year is the awarding of a book prize for best collection of wild flowers by a boy or girl attending school. This activity is identified in Section 38 of the Show program.

The ALG is always open to welcome new members and we would like to encourage anyone with an interest in our work to contact us through the information given below or via direct contact with known members. A brief profile of members will occur in future editions of the Advertiser.
