

"Meet & Greet Tame, But Warriors Firing at Training"

Long time Wattles sponsor, the Down's Hotel at Drayton played host to the Wattles "Warriors' Rugby League Club's first major social event of the year on Saturday afternoon, being the club's pre-season "Meet & Greet". Club officials, sponsors, supporters and some players gathered to break the ice as we move to the new season commencing.

While organizers were hoping to have a few more players show to the "Meet & Greet", Wattles President Barry Glass is very happy with the early season numbers at training. Barry is reminding prospective players and those who have signed, training is on Tuesday & Thursday evenings at Clifton's Platz Oval from 6.30 pm, with new players

The Glass family influence won't just be being exercised from the Wattles Halls of Power in 2011, with Barry's son Brady a key player in Wattles forward pack, who will be exerting the Glass influence on the field. Brady excelled as a junior in his formative years with the Wattles Junior Rugby League Club, his size, ball skills and mobility eventually opening the representative door that saw him a South West Division representative in Under 17 & 19 grades. The strongly built back rower may take the step up to the front row as his career blossoms, but for now he will be a key weapon in Wattles 2011 arsenal.

Wattles Coach Ken Riddiford has an abundance of new and up and coming talent at his finger tips, but no doubt he will appreciate the early arrival of one of Wattles favourite sons to training recently in Russell McMillan. McMillan

needs little introduction around the Central Downs area, and across the Darling Downs really. His undoubted talents from his days as a junior player signaled he was someone who would go on and achieve in rugby league. McMillan spent a year with the Brisbane Broncos Under 17 side in 1997, and on returning to Wattles in 1998 gained Queensland Under 19 selection where his team mates included Chris Walker, Lote Tuquiri, Brad Meyers and future Kiwi Test star Brent Webb to name a few. McMillan was a consistent South West Division and also Toowoomba representative over a number of years, and also gained selection in the Queensland "Rangers" side that defeated New South Wales Country in Roma in 2003, a side that also included Wattles team mate Matt Gravson.

A prolific try scorer over his career, McMillan was the "Top Try Scorer" in the Toowoomba Rugby League competition in 2001 season touching down for a scintillating 26 tries (in only 16 "A" Grade games), and followed it up winning the same award in 2002 with 27 tries.

A former winner of the prestigious Toowoomba Rugby League "Colt of the Year" award, McMillan was a joint winner of the "Lew Platz Cup" as Wattles "Best & Fairest A Grade" Player in 2002.

Russell McMillan was a member of the Wattles Under 19 side that won the TRL premiership in 1998. His outstanding career and the experience gained along the way will be a vital bonus for the "Warriors" this season


Letter to the Editor...

Spring Creek Road re-opened under conditions

Southern Downs Regional Council and Main Roads have re-opened Spring Creek Road near Killarney under strict traffic conditions.

The road was closed between Carr's Lookout and Condamine River Drive until Friday last week due to slumping and subsiding embankments in two sections of the road controlled by Main Roads above Browns Falls. It also suffered some landslips on Council controlled sections of the road.

A geotechnical engineer reviewed the road issues on Wednesday 19 January, and Council road crews undertook urgent clearing and remedial works on Friday 21 January.

The road has been re-opened all the way through since Friday at 5pm, with single lane conditions in some sections.

For the foreseeable future, motorists will encounter stop/go traffic light conditions between Dagg's Falls and Carr's Lookout, and give-way signed single lane conditions with 30 km/hour limits from 2.3km above Carr's Lookout.

Southern Downs Regional Council Mayor Ron Bellingham said he was pleased to be able to get the road open, but implored motorists to take care.

"We're relieved to be able to open the road with the agreement of Main Roads, it will certainly assist local residents and businesses." Cr Bellingham said.

"Council will continue to monitor the landslip sections on this tourist route."

Locals urged to mark flood level at their property

Southern Downs Regional Council CEO Rod Ferguson is urging residents to keep a record of flood levels on their property for future reference.

Mr Ferguson said "Accurately recording flood levels on your property now will help future residents - whether it is yourself, a tenant or someone who buys your property - to make good decisions about placing infrastructure items around the property and to respond appropriately to future flood threats.

"The flood heights may seem extremely fresh in your mind now, but over time the exact levels can become hazy, or even overexaggerated through word of mouth.

"We urge locals to take accurate records including photographs, notes and placing flood markers."

Mr Ferguson spoke from out on the road as he reviewed local flood damage with Southern Downs councillors on Tuesday, ahead of the General Meeting in Stanthorpe today.

He said he has been impressed with the huge community spirit that has emerged after the floods, but there is a long road ahead for full recovery.

"There has been a great deal of damage to roads infrastructure in the region," he said.


"We urge people to drive responsibly and think of others because it is going to be a very long haul to get the roads back into a reasonable state.

"It will be challenging and not everyone will agree with our priorities, but we call for people to remain patient and keep communicating with Council."



Southern Downs Volunteer Project co-ordinator Bette Bonney is calling urgently for more volunteer drivers and assistants in Warwick to help with the pick-up and delivery of large household items such as furniture and white goods. This help

"We need more drivers and teams, and more utes, trucks or people with trailers who can help get these items from the people donating them to the people who need them," Mrs Bonney said.

The donated goods co-ordinators are thanking everyone for their generous donations, but request that people no longer donate clothing.

We have quite enough clothing now, what we're really after are small appliances like toasters and microwaves, white goods, furniture, kitchen utensils and linen," Mrs Bonney said.

Volunteer drivers are at the ready and can come and collect larger items in utes and pickups. To organise a pick-up, call 4661 0300 or visit the Warwick Town Hall on weekdays.

"We also urgently need a qualified electrician to tag and test the appliances before we can hand them out."

People needing assistance or requiring donated items should visit the Warwick Town Hall as the first port of call to get a referral for various goods.

"We've had people turning up directly at the St. Mary's Hall where the goods are being sorted, but they're not set up there to manage donations," Mrs Bonney said. "We're asking people who need help to come to the Town Hall first.'

Allora's Past 100 years ago January 1911 Valedictory

Staff Sergeant Major A. Hamilton has been transferred to Sydney after 2 years serving in the position of Sergeant Instructor of No. 2 Squadron, with headquarters at Allora and on Wednesday night he was honoured with a valedictory dinner at the Allora Town Hall. Besides a goodly muster of members of the A. L. H., a number of prominent residents accepted the invitation of the squadron and the proceedings were of a convivial and sociable nature.

The highest encomiums were passed on the guest of the evening by fully a score of speakers and never was praise better

bestowed, for Mr. Hamilton set an example of conscientious performance to the multifarious tasks pertaining to his duties. which has won him respect from all sections of the community. (The talents of Andrew Hamilton were not lost to the Allora district. He resigned his job with military forces to take up the position of Town Clerk for the Allora Municipal Council. He was appointed Shire Clerk with the new Allora Shire Council in March 1915 and held the position for the next forty years until his retirement in 1955)

A Licensing Prosecution

"Matt May Shines as 'Dongers' Finish Second in Cricket Classic"

Transport and Main Roads advises motorists to expect significant delays when travelling on the Toowoomba Range as urgent safety repairs continue.


One lane in each direction is closed to repair the road that was damaged by heavy rainfall and major flooding around 10 January 2011.
