

was another to stand out from fullback, as was lock forward Jesse Keys with his committed defence.

Brothers raced to an early 10 - 0 lead after six minutes, before Wattles winger Jake Smith scored in the corner after quick backline hands and a great Brady Glass pass.

Brothers hit back to lead 14 - 4 when five eight Tim Hentschel fooled the defence before offloading to Brady Glass for Wattles' second try. A further home side try saw Brothers leading at halftime 18 - 10.

snatch the premiership points.

For Wattles Dan Sullivan put in a sterling performance, while front-rower Jim Hegarty made a real impact with his fearless charges with the ball. Brady Glass was another to impress with the ball in his hands while centre Luke Baker was up to his usual standard with his bruising defence. Five eight Tim Hentschel was a constant danger in attack, his combination with halfback Murdoch a vital cog in Wattles overall performance. Hooker Luke Miller, front-rower Jason Nightingale and Liam Ross also posted strong games in what rates as one of Wattles better outings for the season to date.


