Ann's Most Successfull Morning Tea





Allora Sporting Heritage on Show

Few things in life can hold one's attention like aging sporting memorabilia, and currently the display in the Allora Pharmacy window is a popular conversation point in the "Best Little Town on the Downs". The display is in support of the annual Heritage Week, arranged by Allora Historical Society members Lyn Wright and Bev O'Halloran. The Allora Pharmacy window is filled with photographs, dressed mannequins, sporting shoes, cricket bats, golf clubs and trophies, just a taste of what's on

"A historical display has occurred in support of Heritage Week over the past couple of years, this year with a sport theme" said Historical Society member Lyn Wright. "The display is also a demonstration to the community that the Historical Society is an active working organisation, while creating an awareness for the public of local history".

The display has created a lot of interest with community members offering additional items to add to the display. People passing through Allora have also been intrigued, contacting the Society about the particular items.

Ken Telford, Keith Masters and Heather Slatter are three Allora identities who contributed to the display, all having strong links with Allora's sporting heritage. Ken Telford has been one of Australia's foremost polo players, also achieving at International level. Cricket was Keith Masters game, a great supporter of the sport within the district and a long serving President of the Easter Downs Cricket Association, a man noted for his ability with the bat himself. Heather Slatter supported her late husband Geoff across a lifetime of sporting involvement including rugby league, cricket and hockey, both Heather & Geoff devoted supporters of school

and junior sport in later life

The window display would provide an education for our current sporting generation, the mere sight of a vigaro bat resulting in some head scratching. Nancy May's wooden tennis racquets in frames are a far cry from space age metal models wielded today, while the photo of the Allora Croquet Club from the early part of the 1900's, provides evidence of a once proud club that has passed into Allora's memories.

Allora's reputation as a football (rugby) stronghold is enhanced when we catch a glance at the confident stares of the premiership winning 1912 and 1913 Boomerang Senior Football Club, the aged Clifton & District Rugby League Shield adorns the wall as a back drop of the photographs, which include a group from Allora's 1950's "B" Grade Premiers side with youngsters Max Phelan, Jim Bennett, Don Weier, Con

While Allora community members are more familiar with names such as Crawford, Murdoch, Harrison, Strange and May along with many others in local golf news, few would be aware a former Allora Golf Club was formed in 1927, a nine hole course aside Dalrymple Creek with the first players teeing off in September that year.

Pharmacist Jon Constable gets a regular look at the examples of sporting history in his window, the former Annerlev Recreation Club soccer player particularly taken by the image of the Allora State School 1917 soccer premiers. Interesting to note that the side included the Laws brothers Fred and Col, who both went on to rugby league greatness in the 1920's and 1930's. Fred Laws played 6 Tests for Australia and 33 matches for Queensland, while Col turned out in 12 matches for his State. As an addition to Heritage Week, the Historical Society will hold a demonstration day on October 22nd at the old Allora Shire Hall museum site, with olden day machines working as they would have such as displays making batter, fashions from yesteryear among many other attractions along with a market day. The Warwick Veteran & Vintage Vehicle Club will also be involved with displays of their machinery.

Community members who a yet to see the display should do themselves a favour and take a look, and soak up a little of their local history.

Allora's Past 75 years ago June 1936 **Death of Priest**

The death occurred in Brisbane of Father Phillip Corrigan. Queensland's oldest priest. Father Corrigan was born in Ireland in 1857. He was ordained at Carlow College in 1879 and came to Australia at the end of that year. He served in many places in western Queensland and when the parish of St. Patrick's at Allora was formed in October 1911 he became Allora's first Parish Priest. He was succeeded at Allora by Father Edward Carroll in 1913.


Allora's Past 100 years ago June 1911 **Pretty Cold**

The past week has been characterised by a succession of exceptionally heavy frosts. How severe the visitations were may be judged by the fact that on Monday night the glass went down to 26 degrees, on Tuesday night to 24 and on Wednesday to 22, equal to six, eight and ten degrees of frost respectively. The figures were supplied by Mr. A. L. H. Cooke of the A. B. C. Bank who is a regular observer of the little silvery thread. It is hoped that the string of frosts referred to are the precursor of a good steady downpour of rain.

100 YEARS ON WARWICK ST

2011 marks the 100th anniversary of Allora State School opening on its Warwick Street site.


Formal schooling in Allora dates back to 1867 when students taught by Mr William Deacon in the rented premises of the Wesleyan Chapel in Herbert St. Previous to that, from 1863, children were educated by Mrs James Gwynne under the patronage of the Church of England.

The local community were vigorous in their efforts to provide a permanent home for their school and by 1868 a schoolroom and teacher's

residence had been built on land in Herbert Street. The school site, over time, became too small, in spite of a number of extensions made to the building.

Cramped conditions and drainage problems at the Herbert Street site eventually led to the decision to move the school to the site on Warwick Street which had been acquired some time

On 9th June 1910 the Minister approved the construction of a new school and residence along with fencing on the Warwick

Street property.

The new school was opened in June 1911 by Mr J D Story, Under Secretary for Education. The opening was celebrated with a Grand Picnic.

Top Swanfels Road undergoes reconstruction

Sections that will have the bitumen removed include a 100m section 600m from the interaction of Top Swanfels Road and Yangan Killarnev Road . a 400m section 1.2km from the intersection of Top Swanfels Road and Yangan Killarney Road and a 400m section 3.7km from the intersection of Top Swanfels Road and Yangan Killarney Road. The road works schedule is subject to weather conditions.
