Roadworks on New England Highway -

According to a Department of Transport and Main Roads spokesperson, works are now underway on a \$1.8 million project to improve safety and efficiency on the New England

> Highway, approximately 15 kilometres south Toowoomba, near the Cambooya turnoff to provide a safer and smoother ride for motorists.

The 1.6 kilometre project involves the widening and sealing of the existing road surface to a 10-metre-wide sealed surface, providing two 3.5-metre-wide traffic lanes and 1.5-metre-wide sealed shoulders.

The project will improve safety and travelling conditions on this section of the highway, which carries about 6,000 vehicles a day -11 per cent of which are heavy vehicles.

The project is being carried out by RoadTek Asset Services (South) and is expected to be completed by the end of August, weather permitting.

Temporary traffic measures are in place to ensure safe and efficient traffic flow through the roadworks site.

The department thanks road users for their patience and co-operation as the vital safety improvements are underway.




