## Allora Welcomes Endeavour Ralliers

This Saturday the Allora Showground's will come to life yet again when up to 100 Endeavour Rally drivers, crew and event workers in thirty eye catching vehicles from around southern Queensland, roll in to the "Best Little Town on the Downs" for the 2011 Great Endeavour Allora Preunion & Worker's Rally.

Allora will be represented more than capably by veterans of last year's rally, Beverley O'Halloran and Lyn Wright, while Robyn Devine is a new face in the rally hardened crew. The "Worker's Rally" provides entrants in the 2011 Great Endeavour Rally, this year titled "Goondiwindi to the Gold Coast via the Golden West", with a taste of rally conditions. Over the past 23 years, Great Endeavour has seen all walks of life participate in what is a unique event. Husbands and wives, brothers and sisters, mates, girlfriends and the never ending list goes on. This year's Great Endeavour Rally will see entrants covering 4000 kms over ten adventure packed days, offering plenty of excitement and challenges. On Saturday first timers have the opportunity to look, listen and learn, and see why the Great Endeavour is so addictive and memorable. This weekend's event is traditionally a great shake down for the car and crew, and a lesson for the unskilled navigators, a "must do" before hitting the ignition to start in the real thing, the 24th Great Endeavour, in July.

On Saturday the Worker's Rally will start and finish in Allora, crews covering 377 kilometres of roads and tracks across the Darling Downs. Ralliers will receive their briefing for the Great Endeavour on Saturday night, an informative session that is an absolute must for all involved, covering the specific details of this year's run.

Saturday's Rally gets under way between 9 and 10 am, and will emulate what crews can expect to encounter on any day of the Great Endeavour. The Allora community is invited to see the rally get underway, and if you are about, the cars should return around 4 pm.

Well travelled, Father Andrew also brings the experience from ministries in South Croyden, Victoria, Maroochydore and Chinchilla, not to mention many brief appointments to other Anglican Parishes.

Born in County Kent, nine miles from Canterbury in England, Andrew Baldwin attended teacher's college in Derby, and after graduating headed to Queensland in 1973 as part of a teacher recruitment program. He taught at Bundaberg State High School until 1978, and as a member of the church choir in Bundaberg, he began his future direction with the Anglican Church.

The thought of taking up the vacancy in Allora was bred in January this year, and the offer came in April, the Baldwin's feeling very confident they have made the right decision. Allora's spiralling temperatures of late are no deterrent, the town's newest family having experienced the sting of a winter on the Darling Downs during their time at the western downs centre Chinchilla.

Father Andrew has considerable admiration for his parishioners, who are so active within the community, and is looking forward to providing the necessary support.

While he enjoys camping and travelling, the former hockey player and junior soccer coach is keen on sport, especially tennis, and is the founding member of the Bundaberg Canoeing Club.

Father Andrew believes his appointment will provide "stability and provide for parish growth and consolidation" after a lengthy period without a permanent Rector at St. Davids. He considers the Parish facilities are more than adequate, especially with a new hall under construction in Clifton.

## Stay safe around electricity this winter

With autumn gone and winter under way, Ergon Energy is urging customers to stay safe during the cooler months.

General Manager Service Delivery Southern Paul Jordon said that as temperatures began to fall, the use of heaters and electric blankets began to rise.

"Electric blankets spend much of their lives in storage and can be easily damaged," Mr Jordon said.

"Always store them flat and check carefully before use. If there are signs of misuse or damage, have it checked by a licensed electrical contractor.

"When the temperature drops, it's tempting to sit too close to the electric heater or to place it in the bathroom on cold mornings.

"But both practices can be risky particularly if the electric heater is placed near a bath or on a wet floor. Water conducts electricity and the two can be lethal when combined."

Mr Jordon said inappropriately using electric heaters to dry damp clothes was also risky.

"Clothes, especially synthetic materials, can catch fire if placed too close to electric heaters. You need to also be careful in placing bar heaters on or near combustible materials such as drapes and carpets.

Mr Jordon said avoiding tragedy was a simple matter of following basic safety procedures such as:

- Don't touch anything electrical with wet hands.
- Don't use electrical appliances such as hair dryers around wet

places like baths or basins containing water.

- Use only bathroom heaters specially designed for bathroom use.
- Checking all appliances which have not been used for some time, particularly electric blankets. Exposed elements, perished, stiff or damaged connections on the flexible cord or plug top and any other visual defects should be inspected by licensed electricians before use.
- Don't overload circuits with too many heating appliances. This can cause damage to wiring, plugs and electrical circuitry.
- Don't pile items such as suitcases or piles of clothes on beds with electric blankets switched on. Trapped heat in such circumstances can cause fires.

Mr Jordon also urged householders to consider installing safety switches to further protect against fatal accidents.

"Safety switches can save lives by cutting off power instantaneously in the event of an electrical fault with an appliance or power tool, amateur electrical work, or a curious child," he said.

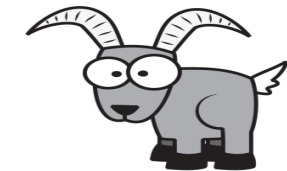

## Have your say on flood study

Southern Downs residents are invited to have their say on the preliminary findings of the Condamine River and Tributaries flood study at public meetings this Saturday 18 June 2011.

Data collated since August last year has been built into maps of the flood plain and will be presented at the meetings.

The study focuses on the risk of flooding in the towns of Allora, Warwick, Killarney, Yangan, Emu Vale, Tannymorel and Pratten, as well as rural areas along the floodplain.

"Our goal is to develop computer flood models of the Condamine River flood plain and quantify and map flood risks in study area," said Adam Colrain, Southern Downs Regional Council's manager design and assets.

"This should help to reduce community vulnerability to flooding and raise awareness of flooding risks," Mr Colrain added.

The study team is seeking to liaise with the community throughout the study to ensure the most accurate and relevant information is obtained and used.

The study was commissioned in August 2010, with contractors Sinclair Knight Merz (SKM) but was delayed by the December 2010 and January 2011 flood events and a delay in aerial surveying.

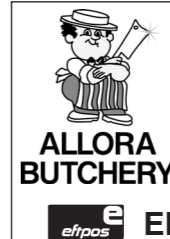

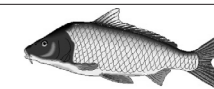

### Allora's Past 75 years ago June 1936

#### Allora Estate Finalized

Probate has been granted in the will of the late Mrs. Sarah Eleanor Clarke of Allora, licensed victualler, who died at Allora on July 2nd 1935. The gross value of the estate was sworn at £3,029 realty and £758 personalty.

The late Mrs. Clarke was, at the time of her death, the proprietor of the Princess of Wales Hotel in Raff Street, Allora. Except for an eighteen month period 1885/86, the hotel has been in the hands of the one family since 1864. The original hotel was built by the late Mr. Samuel Gordon, an early pioneer of Allora, and the present building was erected in 1915 on the site of the original structure by the late Mrs. Clarke whose father was the original licensee. Miss Minnie G. Clarke, a daughter of the late Mrs. S. E. Clarke, is the current holder of the license, making in all, three generations in the hotel.

Mr. E. M. Lilley K. C.

News was received by Mr. W. J. Lilley, solicitor, of Allora, on Thursday morning of the death of his brother Mr. E. M. Lilley K. C., the said event taking place on the night before. The cause of death was heart failure. The late Mr. Lilley was a brilliant and hard working barrister, and estimable citizen, and a gentleman who in every way lent additional lustre to a name already famous in the annals of Queensland. The deceased was born in 1859 and was the eldest son of the late Sir Charles Lilley, former Premier of Queensland and Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.

#### Mr. Henry Black

One of our oldest and most esteemed residents passed away on Thursday night at Goomburra. We refer to Mr. Henry Black who had reached the ripe old age of 81 years, and could claim over 58 years in Queensland, most of which was spent in this district. He has thus been associated with this State from the old pioneering days, at which time he played a doughty part amidst the trials and privations inseparable from the life of a pioneer. He arrived here about 1852, a year after his marriage, and his first child, the late Mrs. J. Dougall, was born on board the ship by which he travelled from the old country. He was of remarkably good constitution and bore the burden of increasing years splendidly till of late, when he failed steadily. He leaves a large family of children, grandchildren and great grandchildren to mourn his passing, numbering amongst them many of our most estimable and respected residents. The funeral will leave his old home at 10 a.m. this morning for the Allora cemetery.
