



Allora's Past 100 years ago June 1910

Association of Scotchmen

At an enthusiastic meeting of Scotchmen held on Saturday night, the preliminary steps were taken to establish an association in Allora. Mr. Alex. McMillan was in the chair and ably explained the objects of the meeting, drawing upon his considerable knowledge of Scottish history in support of his argument.

Mr. A. A. Cameron was appointed secretary, and it was resolved to write to the proper quarters for information relating to the institution and conduct of such societies. Considerable earnestness was displayed, and there appears no reason to doubt that the



new association, when properly formed, will be a valuable addition to the institutions in Allora. A further meeting will be held at an early date when the matter will be more fully discussed. A vote of thanks to the chairman concluded Saturday's meeting.

The first gathering of the newly formed St. Andrew's Club was held on St. Andrew's Day, the 30th November, in 1910. It was said to have been the first gathering of Scotsman in the town for at least 28 years. The club met annually on St. Andrew's Day until 1916, when the commemoration was changed to a patriotic concert on New Year's night. February 1917 saw the death of foundation secretary, Arthur Cameron, killed in action in France.

In 1920 the name of the organization was changed to the Allora Caledonian Society. The society was disbanded in 1925.

Home cooks risk fire with fingers in too many pies

Queenslanders could be too relaxed when it comes to home fire safety with around half stepping away from a hot stove to surf the net, do housework or help the kids with homework, according to new research.

With house fires peaking in winter, Queensland households are reminded where blazes commonly start and how easily they

Research shows one in three Queensland house fires continued to start in the kitchen, most as a result of cooking left unattended. Kitchen fires have the potential to spread quickly.

often jumping to curtains or cupboards in a matter of seconds. People are still leaving cooking unattended because they're either getting caught up in other things, are too busy or are simply being too relaxed.

A survey of more than 500 Queensland residents found that in addition to cooking dinner on the stove:

- nearly 70 per cent step away to watch TV;
- · more than 40 per cent squeeze in some housework;
- · more than 50 per cent surf the Internet; and
- nearly 50 per cent help their kids with homework.

To help prevent and be ready for a home fire, households can:

- · stay in the kitchen while cooking is on the stove;
- get a free Safehome visit from the Queensland Fire & Rescue Service on 1300 369 003;
- · install a smoke alarm(s) and test monthly. If you have batteryoperated alarms, change the batteries at least once a year.
- · have an evacuation plan and make sure everyone in the house knows and practices it:
- · keep a fire extinguisher and fire blanket at hand near the kitchen:
- · never use water to put out a cooking oil fire water will only ianite the oil:
- · don't key-lock deadlocks on doors when at home in case you need to leave in a hurry;
- phone 000 immediately if a fire does break out that cannot be safely and quickly controlled.

Dave's Delectable Dish... Cottage Pie

INGREDIENTS Serves: 4 Preparation time: 15 min 500 g beef mince Cooking time: 25 min 750 ml bottle of tomato pasta sauce 2 cups frozen mixed vegetable mashed potato (4 lge potatoes) ½ cup grated cheese

METHOD

Place mince in a bowl and mix in a little oil. Heat a large frypan until moderately hot, crumble in the mince. Brown the mince, breaking up any lumps with a fork.

Stir in the tomato pasta sauce and vegetables. Reduce heat, cover and simmer the beef mixture for 10 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 180°C. Combine the mashed potato and

Spoon the beef mixture into a shallow baking dish. Spoon the mash over the beef, spread it out, and rough the mash up a little with a fork. Cook uncovered for about 20-25 minutes or until thoroughly hot.

TIPS

- Sneak in an extra serve of vegies. After browning the mince, add a finely grated zucchini and a good handful of very finely chopped mushrooms. Cook stirring for about 2 minutes before you add the remaining ingredients.
- Freeze mince you don't intend to use. Uncooked mince can be frozen for 2-3 months. Rather than freezing loose mince in roundish shape as bought from the butcher lay it out flat to freeze. This is important as it allows the mince to freeze evenly and it allows the mince to thaw evenly. Cooked mince dishes can also be frozen for later use.
- Thaw frozen mince (and any meat) in the fridge, on the lowest shelf below and or away from any ready to eat food. And only thaw in the microwave if using the mince immediately thereafter.


