
matter for a Monday morning natter at the news agency.







## "Ross Shines as Wattles Crash in TRL Opener"

The performance of eighteen year old Liam Ross was one of few bright lights for Wattles at Pittsworth on Sunday, the young hooker outstanding with his dummy half play, and his all round

Despite a successful pre-season featuring two wins from two starts over Southern Suburbs and Warwick, the "Queensland Farmer's Warehouse Warriors" hit the Pittsworth turf with a hefty thud, the hosting "Danes" turning on the razzle dazzle to finish all over Wattles 44 - 4. Pittsworth were scoring at better than a point a minute by the 25 minute mark in the season opener, leading 28 – 0 & using the high kick to great advantage. Wattles claimed their only try of the match minutes later when halfback Jeff Neilson showed the ball after running off fiveeighth Rob Woodbridge, for the defence to open up allowing him to accelerate through and score from 25 metres out. After leading 28 - 4 at the break, the "Danes" thrilled their home crowd with another three tries in the final forty minutes.

Pittsworth fullback Brent Kohn was inspirational for his side scoring two tries and kicking six goals, a danger every time he handled. For Wattles, aside from Ross, back-rower Matt McCarthy was also among Wattles best, as was winger Tim Hentschel. Wattles defence left a lot to be desired, and will need to be honed up for Sunday's Platz Oval clash with Newtown.


While Wattles won more than their share from the scrums, penalties were favouring Pittsworth 9 - 2, before Referee Ben Godsall took a linesmen's flag and Paul Marek refereed the final 26 minutes of the match. Wattles winger Tim Hentschel spent ten minutes in the sin bin from the 48th minute.

The match was the ideal fixture season debut for the "Danes", who will worry many sides this year when they venture Pittsworth way.

"The One That Got Away"

Hooker Josh McIntosh was an impressive package in the "Railway Hotel, Allora" "Warriors" 20 - 24 reserve grade loss. His dummy half work first rate, making plenty of yardage with midfield scoots. Team mates, fullback Justin Van Der Poel and forward Matt Tuiono were also among Wattles best. It was McIntosh who kicked the ball in the minute that rebounded off the goal upright for Ashley Muller to gather and score. The Muller try gave Wattles an 8 - 0 lead but the scoreboard was locked at 12 all by halftime. The "Warriors" scored five tries to the "Danes" four, but missed their goal kicks in the windy conditions. Both sides scored twice in the second half, Pittsworth's two



five tries to the "Danes" four with goal kicking the eventual difference. Burly back-rower Walter McIntosh scored Wattles first try in the 12th minute after lead up work by halves Mark Duggan & Robbie McIntosh. After Muller scored next, centre Scott Murdoch pounced on a loose ball on the "Danes" thirty metre line and outlasted chasers to touch down for Wattles to lead 12 - 6. Second-rower Andrew Boyes put the "Danes" ahead after half time crossing for the home side to lead 18 - 12. While Wattles returned fire through a try by winger lan Brown, Pittsworth veteran hard man Geoff Brose made the Wattles defence look amateurish as her skirted sideways before darting straight to score. Trailing 16 - 24 with 22 minutes remaining in the match, and tempers beginning to flare, Wattles sleek winger Micheal McCarthy found space in the corner to ground the ball at the end of a Wattles rush.

Play broke up into an all in brawl in the 56th minute with "Danes" lock Grant Trott & Wattles centre John Tuiono dispatched to the sin bin by Referee Grungo, at full time after 70 minutes of play Pittsworth 20 - 24 victors.

McIntosh try leveling the ledger at 6 all. Wattles toiled for much of the first stanza in their own half, the "Danes" taking the lead again after 16 minutes when fullback Jeffery Weber ran wide to score. Winger Ryan Lewis hauled Wattles back level at 12 all when he ran off a gem of a ball by representative front rower Lee Lousick. Pittsworth scored on the cusp of half time to take a six point lead into the second half.

The home side extended their lead to 24 - 12, before Wattles hit back with tries by Matt Perry, who scored a good winger's try in the corner; and Lee Lousick after a powerful charge close to the line. Wattles were trailing 22 - 24, but seemed to struggle setting their defence late in the game, and very slow coming off their line. Pittsworth were sharp around the play the ball, resulting in two further tries in the latter stages to secure their victory. Back-rower Jimmy Johnson was among Wattles best along with Lee Lousick & hard working defender, lock Jason

Wattles take on the Newtown "Lions" at Platz Oval on Sunday from 11.30 am. The "Lion's" have endured a player drain on the off season, but despite that emerged on Sunday to win 34 - 32 over the highly rated Gatton outfit. Wattles will be more than keen for a better showing than we saw at Pittsworth, and a return to the winner's circle.



Warwick born Julie's titles at the World Championships over ten days included the Time Trial & the Sprint.

The Gold Coast based cyclist has attended six World Cycling Championships, three in Manchester, England, another three in Sydney and last year in Portugal. 


