


"It's a generous donation, and we thank them very much," said Mayor Ron Bellingham on receiving the money from a student delegation currently in Stanthorpe.


The donations will go to the Southern Downs Mayoral Flood Appeal and be used to assist local flood victims. Donation details:



Rehabilitation works at Heifer Creek Crossing No. 7 on Gatton-Clifton Road

The Department of Transport and Main Roads advises that major rehabilitation works on the timber bridge at Heifer Creek Crossing No. 7 on Gatton-Clifton Road, located approximately 23km south of Ma Ma Creek township, have started.

The works involve removing the old decking, replacing older components, reinstating the deck, installation of guardrails and asphalt resurfacing on Heifer Creek Crossing No.7.

Working hours will generally be from 6.00am to 6.00pm, Monday to Friday. Anticipated delays of up to 15 minutes may occur while these works are in progress.

To provide advanced notice to motorists about the works on this section of Gatton-Clifton Road, advanced warning signs will be located at the following intersections:

• New England Highway and Gatton-Clifton Road,

Gatton-Clifton Road and Gatton-Helidon Road; and

• New England Highway and Greenmount-Hirstvale Road.

The Department thanks you in anticipation for your patience and understanding during the delivery of these important works to improve safety on Gatton-Clifton Road.

The works are expected to be completed by 20 May 2011, weather permitting.

Looking Back...

Greeks in Allora

It is said that pre WW II, there was hardly a town in Queensland that did not have a Greek cafe. Allora was no exception, and had Greek cafe owners from the early 1900's into the 1970's.

Nicholas Zaunders opened refreshment rooms in Holmes' Building on the Herbert and Drayton Street's corner in 1908. The shop was destroyed in the February 1909 fire. C. Criticos opened the Allora Oyster Saloon in a new building on the site later in 1909. He became somewhat of a hero in the town in July 1910 when he singlehandedly fought a fire, lit by an arsonist in the new Holmes' Building, until help arrived. He was presented with a cheque for £15 by the insurance company and a handsome shaving set by Mrs. Holmes, owner of the building, at a dinner held in his honour. In October of that year the business was taken over by William Crassas and Arthur Comino.

N. Comino opened new refreshment rooms on the site in 1911 and sold to Mick Patrick in 1913. The name Mick Patrick doesn't sound Greek but he was of "Mediterranean appearance" and later named his business the "Olympia Café". A Supreme Court writ, followed by an The building, along with six others, was auction in November 1933, saw the sale

Patrick bought Mrs. Joyce's Cafe in Jovce's Buildings (now Allora Hardware) Nicholas Andronicos bought the Olympia Cafe in 1917. In 1923 he took on the agency for Nash motor cars and employed as his assistant, a cheerful young Greek named Theo Macris. Theo was well known in the town and district with his "Indian" motorcycle and sidecar and his love of roaming the paddocks shooting hares. Nicholas Andronicos, sometimes known as Nick Johnson, helped out at Allora's Star Pictures and when he sold the cafe to Demetrius Manegos in 1928, he bought a picture theatre in Coolangatta. Theo Macris continued in the employ of Jim Manegos but had a falling out in 1930 when he sued for unpaid wages and the repayment of a loan. Theo was unfortunately drowned in the Warrego River at Charleville at the age of 35.

destroyed in the 1914 fire and Mick

In October 1930 the re-named James' Cafe was leased to Kertaco Cominos and to K. Trifellis in 1933. In the same year Zacharias (Roy) Manegos, age 20, was one of the first entrants in competition conducted by Paramount Film Studios in search of an Australian film star (and Allora's answer to Errol Flynn)

of Manegos' Buildings and the goodwill, furniture and fittings of James' Cafe. The cafe was re-opened in December 1933 by John Condoleon as "The Bluebird Cafe". George Skettos came to Australia in 1919, landing at Fremantle, W. A. He set out for Kalgoorlie to find work. In the late 1930's he came to Allora and bought the cafe which he renamed the "Allora Cafe" Except for a two year period from 1954 to 1956, when he conducted a business in Caboolture, he, and later he and his wife Archondia, conducted the Allora Cafe, George and Mrs. Skettos retired in Allora in 1973 and both are buried in the Allora cemetery

In 1954 Nick Johnson took over the old A. R. Cunnington's cafe and renamed it the Central Cafe. He traded there until he retired due to ill health in 1967. Although it has been suggested otherwise, it seems too much of a coincidence if Nick Johnson of the Central Cafe and Nicholas Andronicos a.k.a. Nick Johnson who ran the Olympia Cafe in the 1920's were not one and the same person.

No matter how short their stay, all the people of Greek heritage would have contributed something to the development of the character of our town.



tirelessly and were again among Wattles better performers this week, along with five-eight Robert Woodbridge.

Woodbridge scored the 'National Farmers Warehouse' Warriors first points with a try in the 7th minute to give his team an early lead, before home side winger, Josh Belz, scooted over to score. When Hawks and former Wattles halfback Wes Murray was unsuccessful with the conversion attempt, the Warriors held a marginal 6 – 4 lead in the tenth minute. 
