"Tough as teak" front rower Jason Nightingale was an outstanding performer for the "Queensland Farmers Warehouse" Wattles "A" Grade side who finished behind the Southern Suburbs "Tigers" in Saturday night's Pre-Season trial at Platz Oval by 22 - 34. Outside back Nick Colthup returned to the Wattles lineup and showed fine form, and will be an experienced bonus to Coach Hamblin as the season unfolds. Souths enthusiasm was evident from the kick -off, their speed around the rucks, smothering of Wattles attacking opportunities and quick reaction to situations proved the difference between the two

Wattles were without team skipper & defensive dynamo Aaron Scheid with a knee concern, along with talented back rower Justin Free. However both will be available for this weekend's match against Warwick, with the added bonus of star fullback, the recently married Brenden Wilson and former Wattles player of the year, Damien Pauli. Impressive young colt Harry Gibson will be an absentee this week due to family commitments.

Aside from Blaine, centres Matt McCarthy & Luke Baker touched down for tries. McCarthy's try was evecatching, a product of some slick back line play by Wattles. Tim Hentschel set play in motion some 40 metres out before offloading to Brady Glass who found the team Captain McCarthy storming in support, stepping around the Souths fullback for the initial points of the match.



Allora Doctor's Surgery Update

The resolution was: "That the Allora community request the Southern Downs Regional Council to finance a study or investigation into the feasibility of establishing a medical clinic in the former Allora Shire Chambers by engaging the necessary expertise. We further request that funding for such a study be made available at the earliest convenience given the community concern over the issue of minimal medical services available to Allora & district residents. At the very least, the funding of the study be given the most serious consideration to be included in the upcoming budget."

As it turned out the committee that considers such requests (Community Services Committee) met the very next day, Wednesday 17th March. Glyn Rees attended the meeting and was invited to address the committee. The result was that all of the councillors and the mayor inspected the building that afternoon and that a recommendation will be made to council at their next sitting that funds be made available to do the initial investigations.

Three councillors - Denise Ingram, Jo McNally and Neil Meiklejohn and John Randall have been appointed to work with the steering committee of Jon Constable, David Dwan, Ann Balmain, Roy Smith, Glyn Rees and David Brown to promote the project.

No one likes to step in dog poo! Council is reminding Southern Downs' residents to be responsible pet owners and pick up their dog's waste.

Director of Planning and Environment, Ken Harris said that dog waste is often identified as the number No.1 community amenity issue in the streets and parks of communities across Australia.

"It causes environmental harm, public health risks and reduces the overall aesthetics of the local area." Mr Harris said.

He noted that every time it rains everything on our roads, footpaths and in our parks, including dog droppings, washes down the stormwater drains into our waterways.

"The nutrients in dog faeces can contribute to toxic algae blooms in our waterways, which affect our water quality and marine organisms that contribute to the health of our waterways," Mr Harris said.

Aside from environmental harm, public health risk and aesthetics reasons, residents should pick up their dog's waste because it is the law.

"Dog owners are legally required to collect their pets' droppings and to dispose of them via the rubbish bin," Mr Harris said.

"Council can issue on-the-spot fines of up to \$200 and has the option in the case of repeat offences, of going to court, where fines of up to \$2000 can be imposed.

"Clearly the best outcome is for all dog owners to be responsible. Don't make your dog's waste someone else's problem."



Scheid Primed to Lead "Warriors" to Shield Success

Wattles workhorse back rower Aaron Scheid is primed and ready to lead his team on to Platz Oval this Saturday evening determined to wrest the Barrett Family Shield from the grasp of traditional rivals, the Warwick "Cowboys". The Shield, that Warwick has won for the past three years, inspires rivalry between the two famous clubs, raising the spirits of all connected with rugby league in the southern downs area, as the "Cowboys" & the "Warriors" go head to head. It could be termed a grudge match, but whatever term is used in a description, it is certainly one of the clashes of the year as both sides traditionally lift to claim the coveted Shield. It won't be any easy task, but Scheid believes Wattles have the team to bring the Shield back to Platz Oval, and he has the full support of stand in skipper and Wattles senior statesman Matt McCarthy. Wattles bare only a remote resemblance to the team that took the field in the "green & gold" colours in last year's Shield clash, with Schied as one of the few players in this year's lineup still stinging after the 28 - 0 loss. Brenden Wilson, Brady Glass, Justin Free & Scheid are the only players named in Wattles Barrett Shield side that played in the trial in 2009.

this year, have won the Barrett Shield in the awards inaugural year in 1993, and have since won the Shield on nine occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1998, 1999, 2002, 2007, 2008). Wattles have enjoyed hoisting the trophy on seven occasions (1996, 1997, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006), with the trophy shared in 2000 after a drawn result.

The Shield came into being after a suggestion at a Wattles Rugby League Club committee meeting in 1992 by then club Secretary Peter Glass that a trophy be introduced for the annual trial between the neighbouring clubs, and Wattles committee member Mary Hamblin (nee Barrett) offered a trophy in the Barrett Family's name. The Barrett name is synonymous with rugby league throughout the South West Queensland region. While a more than astute Treasurer for five years for the "Warriors". Mary was also President of the club in 1992 and 1993. Annual valuations released for the Southern Downs local government area

The Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM) has released the annual land valuations for properties in the Southern Downs local government area.

The valuations are a snapshot of unimproved land values as at 1 October 2009 based on changes in the local property market. The Southern Downs local government area's overall average value had increased 45.29 per cent since the last valuation issued in the former shires of Stanthorpe (2004) and Warwick (2006), DERM State Valuation Service South-West Area Manager John Thomas said.

Mr Thomas said that the majority of the real estate market sectors had increased since the revaluations were last issued in 2004 and 2006 for the respective former shires.

"The urban changes are a result of both the length of time since

property market has softened with an easing of the volume of sales," he said. "The land valuations, which take effect on 30 June 2010 for rating, land tax and State land rental purposes, provide a snapshot of unimproved land values on 1 October 2009 and reflect the movement in the local property market since the last valuation was undertaken." Details of the new annual valuation of rateable lands can be inspected until 21 May at the Southern Downs Regional Council's Stanthorpe Office at 61 Marsh Street, Stanthorpe for the former Stanthorpe shire and the DERM office at Level 1 Corner Fitzroy and Guy Streets, Warwick for the former Warwick shire during normal business hours.

Indicative valuations, market tables for major residential localities and other valuation information are also available on the DERM website until 21 May

Mr Thomas said it was important the public realised that valuation notices were not rate notices.

"Rates are set by local government authorities.

"General rating enquiries should be directed to property owners' local councils." Mr Thomas said.

If a landowner believes their valuation to be incorrect, and can provide information to support this, objections to valuations can be lodged with DERM by 6 May 2010.

"This year the objection process has changed and it is essential that landowners read the step by step guide before filling in their form," Mr Thomas said.

"Objections now need to be correctly completed on the new Notice of Objection form and lodged within the 45 day required period," he said.

The 2010 valuations were calculated using an "unimproved value" methodology, the same approach used in previous

For the 2011 valuation, the Queensland Government has announced it intends to move to a "site valuation" methodology for non-rural land. This is the method used in other Australian states and is expected to provide a simpler methodology supported by the property industry, local governments and other stakeholders.

Site value represents the land's current market value and reflects what can actually be "seen from the street" - the value based on what the vacant land would sell for in its present

Baked Ham

INGREDIENTS

½ cup brown sugar 1 large uncooked ham

1 tbsp mustard pineapple rings

cloves cherries

1 tbsp sherry or pineapple juice

METHOD

Soak ham overnight in water. Wrap in foil and bake in shallow pan 25 minutes for each pound of ham (50 minutes per kg). Remove skin, score fat in a diamond pattern and decorate with cloves, pineapple and cherries. Cover with mixture of brown sugar, mustard and sherry. Bake extra half hour, basting well.

Condamine River Parks' master plan to get under way

As Council prepares to undertake a master plan of Condamine River parks such as Queens Park, St Marks Park and Federation Park, residents are being urged to have their say in the parks' future.

Council considers HACC funding
