Animal Matters...

PREGNANCY TESTING OF CATTLE HERDS (for less than the price of a cup of coffee!)

Pregnancy testing in beef herds is carried out from April to September in beef herds for Warwick, Stanthorpe and Allora district cattle producers. Herds are tested to find the future calving percentages now so that proper management decision can be made ahead of the winter.

It is probably the most efficient and cost effective way of helping farmers work out next year's farm budgets. By estimating the number of replacers that growers will have next year, farmers can take some of the risk out of farm future returns.

Pregnancy diagnosis is an essential part of maintaining a productive profitable enterprise. Early identification of empty animals within the herd has a number of management benefits including:

- allowing empties to be sold when prices are high
- not having to carry non productive animals through the winter
- planning feed requirements and
- determining the numbers of replacements required

In addition to this, reproductive diseases such as Vibriosis and Trichomoniasis and abortion causing diseases such as Pestivirus, Leptospirosis and Neospora can be detected quickly so that appropriate therapy can be introduced before large numbers are lost.

Pregnancy testing cattle tail tags (produced by the Aust. Cattle Vet Association) can be used to identify pregnancy status of cows going to sale. Vendors can expect a premium price for cattle which have been tested and tagged in calf by a certified veterinarian.

For less than the price of a cup of coffee, growers can learn so much information about their herd through pregnancy testing. Please contact the clinic today to arrange a vet to test your herd at Warwick 4661 1105 or Allora 4666 3127.

Dave's Delectable Dish...

Italian-Style Meatloaf

INGREDIENTS

600g pork and veal mince
1 small brown onion, finely chopped
1 garlic clove, crushed
1 small red capsicum, finely chopped
1 small tomato, deseeded, finely chopped
1 cup fresh breadcrumbs
2 tablespoons tomato paste
1 teaspoon dried oregano
1 egg, lightly beaten
Steamed corn cobs and green beans, to serve

METHOD

Preheat oven to 180°C/160°C fan-forced. Lightly grease a 7cm-deep, 9cm x 22cm (base) loaf pan. Line with baking paper, allowing a 2cm overhang at long ends. Combine mince, onion, garlic, capsicum, tomato, breadcrumbs, tomato paste, oregano and egg in a bowl. Press into prepared pan. Bake for 50 minutes or until firm to touch. Stand in pan for 10 minutes. Lift out onto a board. Slice. Serve with corn and beans.

Dog bite coverage over the top

Media coverage on dog bites needs to help prevent panic, not cause it, says Australia's peak veterinary organisation.

"Increased reporting of dog bites is creating fear in the community, but not much is being done by the media to help the public prevent it from happening," said Dr Mark Lawrie, President of the Australian Veterinary Association.

"Animals are part of everyday life and the only solution is to educate the public about how to interact with them safely.

"As more and more people have become city dwellers they have become less familiar with how to interact safely with dogs and other animals.

"The media clearly has a key role to play informing people about prevention, especially with the amount of coverage we're seeing at the moment.

"Research shows that education is the solution to the problem and the media needs to become part of the solution," said Dr Lawrie.

The AVA is calling on the media to help promote four key messages about bite prevention:

- All dogs have the potential to react when they're scared or threatened.
 - Children under 10 should not be left alone in a room with any dog no matter how well known or well loved.
 - Dogs need to be socialised with people and other dogs as puppies
 - Children need to be taught early how to be safe around dogs
- "Recent hospitalisation data shows a downward trend in the number of admissions for children up to nine years of age," said Dr Lawrie.

"Despite these statistics, young children are still the highest risk group for dog bite injury, with most at risk in their home environment from their family pet.

"Dog owners can talk to their vets about how to socialise their pets and teach children about safety.

"There are also a number of school based education programs that that have been making progress in dog bite prevention," he said.

Final stage of \$33m Warwick project begins - New powerline promises more secure supply for Southern Downs

Work is under way on the final stage of Ergon Energy's \$33 million project to upgrade the main electricity supply line to Warwick.

Acting General Manager Operations Dave Heberlein said work was scheduled to be completed in October in readiness for next summer's storm season.

"The project involves the complete replacement of one of the two 110,000-volt powerlines that runs from Middle Ridge substation near Toowoomba through to Warwick," he said.

"We are progressively removing the timber-pole transmission line and replacing it with a concrete-pole line that runs along the same 70km route.

"Work has been scheduled from April to October in the past two years and again this year to minimise the risk of weather impacting on power supplies while only one transmission line is operational.

"Work began in 2008 at the Warwick end because this section of the line was the oldest and least reliable.

"So far, poles have been stood as far as East Greenmount and the lines have been reconducted up to Allora.

"Poles are now being delivered on the remaining section from East Greenmount to Middle Ridge and they are being fitted out ready for erection.

"The resumption of line works is imminent and earlier this month a specialist tower line crew from Rockhampton reconducted the sections of line near the substations at each end."

Mr Heberlein said the new line, supported by about 280 concrete poles, would be significantly stronger and more reliable, particularly in coping with the severe storms common in the area each summer.

"That translates into a more secure power supply for the Southern Downs region and the benefits have already been apparent to customers in the past two summers from the work done to date," he said.

Allora's Past 100 years ago May 1910

Memorial Service

Friday, May 20th, 1910, was observed as a close holiday in Allora following the death of His Majesty, King Edward VII. All creeds and sections of the community loyally attended the memorial service held at the Showground. The proceedings were on a somewhat ambitious scale, the various public bodies and societies taking part in a procession which marched from the Town Hall to the Showground. The procession was marshalled by Captain Deacon O.C.A.L.H. and was in the

following order, The Band, The Clergy, A.L.H., The Allora Cadet Corps, Town Councillors, Brethren of Hope Masonic Lodge, Pride of Allora Lodge M.U.I.O.O.F., St. George Society, Loyal Orange Lodge, Star of Allora P.A.F.S.O.A., St. Kevin's Branch H.A.C.B.S., State School Scholars, The General Public. As can be seen, the gathering was thoroughly cosmopolitan in character. About 450 people took place in the procession and the attendance at the Showground must have numbered 1,200 to 1,500.
