This year along with the Allora Show Society, the Mayor's Flood Appeal also received a boost courtesy of the WCU Foundation.

The Warwick Credit Union have provided sterling community support to the areas encompassed by their many branches, with financial and other support given to events and projects large and small including The Warwick Turf Club's 'Warwick Cup' and the Warwick Show & Rodeo. Helen Roche, Warwick Credit Union's Senior Manager - Sales Marketing commented that "our community contributions have seen the Credit Union provide over \$50,000 a year in sponsorship over recent years, a tremendous investment in the local area".

WCU Grant Allows Grandstand Facelift


Allora Show Society Secretary Wendy Ardrey was elated when she heard her recent application for a Warwick Credit Union Foundation Grant was successful.

The WCU Foundation is a not for profit organisation focused on providing grant opportunities to community groups for innovative projects, facilities and activities. The grants are in addition to other regular support and sponsorship the Credit Union provides to the region.

The Show Society has received \$ 13,000 which will be used to refurbish the Showgrounds historic 106 year old Grandstand. The building, that provides a wonderful backdrop for all activities within the show ring, was built in 1905, and is among the oldest of such structures in the State. Its resurrection will not only be an a boon to the Showgrounds facility, but will also prolong the existence of some of the regions significant structural history.

Mrs. Ardrey said, "local tradesmen will carry out the painting of the building after Show Society volunteers have attended to structural repairs. Allora's Denny's Engineering had also offered their services to assist with free crane hire". The Showgrounds are currently looking a picture, a fact attributable to the committee's forward thinking, and as Mrs. Ardrey proudly suggests, "to the ready voluntary workforce that give so much to one of Allora's focal points."

The WCU Foundation grant program commenced in late 2009 to provide financial support to community groups undertaking projects which provide ongoing benefit to the wider community. Last year the Warwick Historical Society was a beneficiary, with their project being a rose garden at Pringle Cottage to commemorate Warwick's 150th anniversary celebra-tions.

Allora residents get new waste transfer station

A brand new waste transfer facility was officially opened at Allora last Thursday as part of Southern Downs Regional Council's new waste management plan. The \$1.45m facility which took 12 months to build has recycling options and bitumen roads, and replaces the old Allora landfill

Waste will now be disposed of in large bins, and transported to the Warwick Waste Transfer Facility where it can be recycled or further reduced by heavy crushers.

"It's a giant step forward for resource recovery, recycling and waste management in the Allora district," said Mayor Ron Bellingham.

"I believe Southern Downs Regional Council is one of the leaders in the field in strategic waste management," Cr Bellingham said.

"You only have to look at the recent National Tidy Towns resource and recovery Award won by Stanthorpe now Allora is also a big step closer to modern waste standards.

"The purpose of a waste transfer station is to reduce our footprint on the environment by stopping waste going to


"Our goal is to be as efficient as possible in waste management and create a result that's better for our residents and our environment."

12 bins will be available for the recycling of paper and cardboard, plastic, aluminium and glass and there is also a recycling shop where items can be purchased during opening hours.

Collection of green waste, scrap metal and Drummuster will continue to be accepted at the site.

The new Allora waste Transfer Station will open every day except Wednesday and Thursday from 8.00am to 5.00pm.

The project was jointly funded by Council and the State Government Department of Local Government and Planning.

The facility was designed by Duggan & Hede, Engineering and Environmental Consultants and constructed by Sedl Engineering of Toowoomba.



It is thought that the child caught the disease from contact with relatives from one of the southern states where an epidemic of diphtheria is raging. The child had not been immunized.

Students from local high schools awarded Defence Technical Scholarships -

This year, a total of 1500 Defence Technical Scholarships have been awarded across Australia with a record 444 Queensland students awarded Defence Technical Scholarships compared with 207 students in 2010. Of the 444 Queensland Scholarships, some of these went to Clifton State High School, The Scots PGC College and Warwick State High School students.

The Minister for Defence Science and Personnel, Warren Snowdon has announced there has been a record number of scholarships awarded to Year 11 and Year 12 students across Australia for the 2011 Defence Technical Scholarship program. Mr Snowdon said the Defence Technical Scholarship program, now in its third year, offers high school students some first rate opportunities to extend their career opportunities.

"Students in Year 11 and 12 receive financial support to learn a trade, and at the same time they're encouraged to stay and complete their senior school years, so it's a win-win situation for them, the community and Defence."

Defence Technical Scholarships provide \$2000 to Year 11 students and \$3000 for Year 12.

The 2011 program received in excess of 2000 applications from students interested in pursuing a technical trade career in the Australian Defence Force (ADF) when they leave school.

"This is a unique award, as it's still the only large scale program targeting students specifically wishing to pursue a trade," Mr Snowdon said.

"The Defence Technical Scholarship program aims to address the national shortage of technical trade qualified people within the Australian workforce while demonstrating Defence's commitment to compete for its fair share of them."

The initiative was originally launched in 2008; this year is the first to reach the program's ceiling for scholarships awarded.


"The Australian Government's commitment can be seen in the results since the program's inception with nearly 3000 scholarships awarded in all. Additionally, by the end of this year, nearly 300 scholarship recipients and 50 school teachers and Career Guidance Counsellors will have participated in Defence Experience tours as a related activity.

"It is a pleasure to congratulate those awarded a Defence Technical Scholarship and I encourage them to pursue their interest in the Defence Force as they complete their schooling," he said.

To be eligible for the scholarships, students needed to be studying Maths and a technical trade related subject and to have demonstrated a genuine interest in joining the Australian Defence Force at the end of their schooling.

"Importantly, there is no obligation on scholarship recipients to enter the ADF, however clearly the application process seeks to identify those who have a real interest," Mr Snowdon concluded.



a look after noticing the Show in the newspaper" she said. The competition standard was very high, but it was a "fairy tale" finish for first time exhibitor Melissa Taffijn from Postman's Ridge near Withcott. Her five month old Indian game pullet took out the "Champion Large Hard Feather Fowl" ribbon, before being judged overall Champion "Bird of Show" later in the day. The winning fowl is a product of the New South Wales breeding pens of respected poultry breeder Brad Scott, and it has only been with Melissa a month. It will take pride of place in her poultry breeding program commencing in August. 
