The Allora Task Force (ATF) raised their hand to host the fourth Economic Development Strategy community meeting at the Allora Community Hall last night, May 12, at 6.30pm. The Allora Task Force was formed in March this year to progress the provision of medical services in the town, with the availability of a doctor seen as a key element in the ongoing economic growth of Allora.

Following on from previous successful meetings in Stanthorpe and Warwick, the Allora meeting continued to gather and gauge community feedback on the future framework for economic development in our region. The workshop is an important building block in the preparation of the Southern Downs Economic Strategy, due for completion later this year.

As Southern Downs Economic Development Officer John Randall explained, obtaining key public input is vital to developing a cohesive economic plan for the region's future. "It allows the community to voice their ideas, concerns and

"It allows the community to voice their ideas, concerns and visions and then converts them into a workable action plan," Mr Randall said.

"The ATF has been working very hard on the doctor issue and have been engaging across the whole Allora community.

"This makes them an ideal choice for hosting the public economic development strategy meeting."

The Chair of the Allora Task Force, Jon Constable and ATF member, David Dwan, are both making their mark in the preparation of the economic blueprint for the region.

"As well as our involvement with the Task Force, David and I have been in business in Allora for some time now," Mr Constable said.

"We both reckon that a formal strategy is essential for our region to be able to take advantage of the many opportunities both now and in the future."

Mr Randall said that there would be further meetings across the region and encouraged all residents to watch the press for information.





Allora's Past 100 years ago May 1910

Old Buffer's Race

A report appeared on Monday's celebration by the Warwick St. George Society. An event which caused a great deal of amusement was the old men's race. In this fourteen started, the handicaps according to age stretching out from scratch to 32 vards in 100 vards. The winner was G. Summerfield (Ipswich) who was on 23 yards and was the only one of the old buffers to turn out in orthodox running togs. Second place was secured by Thomas Maher (Allora) on 32 yards and third place was filled by H. Sterne (Warwick) on scratch. The age of the winner was given as 63 years and of the second man 72 years. Only those of 40 years and over were eligible to start.

New R C Parish

We understand that His Grace, Archbishop Dunne, has decided to grant a new R C parish, with Clifton as its centre. It is reported that the position of resident priest has been allotted to Rev. Father Cosgrove, at present at Nanango. We had hoped to hear that the prayer of a large delegation of Allora Roman Catholics which waited upon Archbishop Dunne, asking that a resident priest might be stationed at Allora and a new parish formed here, had been granted, but evidently the representations made by the Clifton Catholics carried greater weight with His Grace.

CHAMBER URGES BUSINESS TO GET ON FACEBOOK

Warwick's small business operators should look seriously at Facebook, Twitter and even YouTube to market their products to a bigger audience.

Chamber of Commerce President, John Randall, is urging all local businesses to look at joining the move to online social

"In the past, traditional sales through advertising has always been one-way, with the business operator talking to the customer in a monologue. Then the customer reacts whether they are interested or not."

"How many of us now grab the Yellow Pages before Google to find a business solution? The simple answer is fewer by the

"What the experts now are suggesting is that we talk in a twoway manner to our customers. By using social networking sites we can utilise relationship marketing, which is what any salesperson uses when they are face to face or on the phone." Small business management gurus such as Pete Switzer from Sky News Business Channel are strong supporters of business going on-line to both sell their product but also, more importantly to get to know their customers.

Mr Switzer was recently quoted in The Australian newspaper as saving, "Twitter, FaceBook and other networking sites are the new-age mediums for something that has always worked relationship marketing. Networking by showing up to events has always worked, but nowadays, many customers want to do it digitally."

John Randall added that as the cost of doing business increases, with factors such as interest rate rises and higher superannuation levies, most local businesses are looking at ways of reducing their marketing overheads.

"Sure, it takes a bit of initial effort, and maybe they may have to get some outside help. But there are already a few of our Chamber members who have gone in this direction to grow

"And it's not only the obvious operators such as homeware shops, hairdressing or fashion retailers. There are now in Warwick, operators in the industrial supplies business and similar operators who have gone outside their comfort zone and developed important relationships with both new and existing customers.'

"Another positive benefit to going on FaceBook etc, is that business owners can meaningfully engage their vounger. maybe Gen Y staff members, who are so savvy with this particular medium. A common theme amongst Chamber members is how do we connect with Gen Y staff, who normally don't respond to normal workplace incentives.

"Mention FaceBook, YouTube or Twitter to them, and watch their productivity go through the roof."



Dave's Delectable Dísh...

Lamb Tagine

INGREDIENTS

1.5kg shoulder lamb, diced

1 large Spanish onion, grated 2 garlic cloves, crushed

1 bunch coriander, leaves chopped

1 cinnamon stick

1 tsp ground cumin 1 tsp ground ginger

1 tsp paprika

1 tsp saffron threads

120ml (6 tbs) olive oil

1 large piece orange peel

800g chopped diced tomatoes

2 tbs tomato paste 375ml beef stock 1 bay leaf

30g butter, diced 2 tbs honey

240g can chickpeas, drained,

1/2 cup green olives Chopped mint, to garnish


METHOD

Combine lamb, onion, garlic, coriander, spices, oil and 1 teaspoon salt in a bowl. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

Preheat oven to 160°C. Heat a non-stick frying pan, add lamb in batches and fry until lightly browned all over. As meat is cooked, place in a tagine or casserole dish. Add orange peel.

Drain tomatoes, reserving juice. Set tomatoes aside. Combine juice with tomato paste, then add to meat with stock and bay leaf. Cover and cook in oven for 1 1/2 hours. Use a slotted spoon to transfer meat to a plate. Place dish over high heat (if you are using a tagine you will need to transfer the liquid to a frying pan).

Add diced tomatoes and butter and reduce for 2 minutes, then add honey, chick peas, olives and meat. Cook, stirring, for 1-2 minutes. Garnish with mint


