A talented swimmer, she has competed as a State level competitor in both backstroke and butterfly, a medalist and finalist at State & National level swimming events against the likes of Stephanie Rice & Leisel Jones. While her father's family are rugby union orientated, with long standing links with the Dalby "Wheatmen", Mum's family have similar links with rugby league in Dalby. On the union side, a family member is well known Wallaby representative Stephen Larcom.

Camilla enjoys watching Matthew and his Wattles team mates play each Sunday, and while she is not all that concerned about an injury to the Warriors star back rower, she believes his temper robs him a lot of his ground time.

McCarthy is a name that is synonymous with the Wattles club, and while Camilla may have received a gentle nudge to be



## A 50 Year Partnership – Keith & Marg Rackley

Fifty years ago today blushing bride Margaret Loveday strode to the entrance of the Methodist Church in North Ipswich on the arm of her father, and took the short walk to that alter where she would marry her true love, life partner and best friend Keith Racklev.


It was the 13th of May 1961, Del Shannon's hit tune "Runaway" was top of the charts, and rather than running away, Mr. & Mrs. Keith Rackley headed off with car and caravan on a tour of the southern

States, before settling in their home town of Rosewood.

The Rackley & Loveday families were keen campers, snatching a break at Easter & long weekends, and it was on such a camping trip that nineteen year old Keith met seventeen year old Margaret in 1958, camping with their parents at a Tweed Heads Caravan Park, hatching a romance that would live for over five decades

Keith was a truck driver

in the Rosewood based family business Rackleys' Transport, and Marg a public servant in the Mental Hospital at Goodna around the time they exchanged vows. Just given how busy the young couple were, riding in Keith's truck, enroute with a load of cattle, provided much of the time they spent together in



those early days.

The Rackley's have been dedicated supporters of Allora sporting and community groups, they themselves enjoying sport in their younger years, Marg a better than average swimmer who regularly represented her school and also Ipswich. Keith was a regular for a time in the Rosewood Rugby League side, and recalls those times with a grin, especially the pugilistic habits of the tough boys from Esk. After seven happy years in their home town of Rosewood,

that saw their three children David, Leanne & Paul welcomed into the world, the Rackleys relocated to Allora. They initially rented their current Warwick Street residence, before buying the house from Bert Telford for \$1200, and have remained there ever since. The homely lowest timber building with the retiree veranda has significant history in Allora, originally

serving as the Miegunyah Hospital that opened in 1915.

Keith took a truck driving job with J.H. Enright's Consolidated Freighters who operated from depots in Allora & Warwick. Before long the Rackley's took over the Allora section of the business, commencing Allora Freighters that serviced Allora. Clifton, Nobby, Greenmount, Toowoomba & Brisbane daily. The firm operated three trucks, two running the daily routes and a spare that Marg would handle if need be. While the business was a worthy bread winner, daughter Leanne recalls her Dad having all but no spare time, and never being home before she was in bed. What evolved into a highly respected transport business, was sold in 1990. Keith heading to a career change at the Warwick Bacon Factory that lasted fifteen years until retirement, a career that gave him spare and family time. While Keith was organizing the container movements at the Bacon Factory, Marg decided she would help out at Warwick's Mobil Oasis Service Station. She went on to "help out" for seven years before joining the deli staff at Debbie Smith's Allora Supermarket.

Keith and Marg, like most parents, are exceptionally proud of their children & their families, and all of their achievements. Daughter Leanne Ingram Manages Warwick's Suncorp Bank branch, and will celebrate 25 years of marriage with her husband Phillip this year, the year their only son Dylan graduates from Year 12 at the Warwick State high School. Youngest son Paul, who is currently in the USA with his wife Lee-Anne & family, is a sergeant on the RAAF based in Darwin, with two children, Caitlyn and Jaxon. While recalling memories of their children, and the special events 2011 has brought for all in the Rackley family, Keith & Marg beam happiness, but also a stern pride.

Leanne, speaking on behalf of brother Paul, can't thank her parents enough for support they gave in their growing years, and the superb & respected example they set as role models. But while a life time of memories that bring a smile to her face whiz through her mind, Leanne recalls her Mum's days as a "truck salesman adviser" with a jolly chuckle. Various truck salesmen would meet Marg as the face of the Rackley's transport business, and she told more than one that should Keith consider acquiring a certain brand of truck, she would drive him over the gap in it.

While the Rackley's have experienced the rocky road of life with its various hardships, hard work & many moments of happiness, they also experienced tragedy when in June 1986 eldest son David and his partner Sandra's lives were taken in a motorcycle accident involving an intoxicated unlicensed driver.

Ironically David was a school days friend of a fellow biker David Morrish, who passed away earlier this year, the boys great neighborhood mates.

Keith & Marg are very well known in kennel club circles around the Darling Downs, and share a 50 year affection for boxer dogs after receiving one two days before their wedding. After a marathon 22 years of showing dogs, the couple have dropped off the show circuit somewhat, now channeling their energies to assisting with the Allora Kennel Club and the Allora & Killarney Annual Shows. Keith has spent countless hours over the past 20 years manicuring the Allora Showgrounds dog arenas, the result an absolute picture since the first trees were planted in the area 15 years ago. The devoted couple was recognized at the 2010 Allora Show when the "Keith & Marg Rackley Dog Arena's" were named in their honour.

Marg is the longest serving Patron of the Allora Swimming Club, and both she and Keith are proud Life Members of the progressive group. The Rackley children were all committed members of the club, Leanne representing in State swimming titles. The "David Rackley Memorial Shield" is among the major meets on the Swimming Club calendar. Patron Marg, who at one stage served as the club Secretary, Handicapper & Coach in a single year, has much admiration for the club who

# THIS FRIDAY DEADLINE FOR COUNCIL EVENT SUPPORT

Community groups looking for Council support for events between 1 July 2011 and 30 June 2012 have until this Friday, May 20, to get their applications in. This includes groups seeking either financial or in-kind support for their events.

Written requests for Council support must outline the name, location and description of event; date/s; type of assistance required; any sponsorship or financial assistance request; and how Council would be acknowledged in return for any approved support

CEO Rod Ferguson said that the new process was designed to assist with budgeting for events each year in a strategic manner

"Up until now we have ad hoc requests, and sometimes these have been very close to deadline," Mr Ferguson said.

"To improve planning and budgeting there is now a new annual process where a community organisation must apply once a year in writing for Council support.

"That applies even for those groups who have traditionally received assistance each year from Council for their event." To be included in this year's budget submissions must be in by Friday, 20 May 2011. Thereafter the deadline is March 31, 2012 for events occurring in the following financial year/s.

# Famous medals return for Warwick

Jackie Howe's feats are part of sheep shearing folk lore and he single-handedly made the blue singlet a national fashion statement.

So it's fitting that the shearing medals won by Warwick's favourite son will return home for display during the Rose City's 150th birthday celebrations later this month.

His gold medals, shield and fob watch, worth an estimated \$305,000 and normally housed at Canberra's National Gallery, will be on display at Warwick Art Gallery from this Friday, May 20 until May 29.

The Warwick Art Gallery will be open extended hours during that week, including Monday 23 May, from 10.00am - 4.00pm. Warwick Art Gallery director Karina Devine said regional Australia was lucky to have the items on display.

Jackie Howe was born at Canning Downs near Warwick and is famous for his 1892 unbroken record of shearing 321 sheep in one day using hand shears.

Jackie Howe wore the medals and fob watch when he wore a

The collection was bought by a private collector after they were auctioned by the Howe family in 2008.

Southern Downs Mayor Ron Bellingham negotiated with Canberra contacts over getting the collection back here for the

"The wool industry was an integral part of Warwick's roots and I really believe these medals are a Warwick treasure," Cr Bellingham said.

"It is an opportunity for our community to see a genuine and important piece of our history," he said.

## Looking Back...

Allora's Past 25 years ago May 1986




