Vehicle Rescue Training a Real Eye Opener


It's not all that many years ago that road accident rescue was not the essential responsibility it is of recent years for our State's firefighters. Allora's Matt Heslin is one firefighter that has a full appreciation for the latest cutting edge technical knowhow and equipment when it comes to dealing with rescues on our roads.

Matt was a member of the QFRS Clifton team the competed in the 2011 State Road Crash Rescue Challenge in Mackay over the weekend of April 29th & 30th. The Queensland Fire & Rescue Service, Allora, training officer who has been part of the Allora team for eight years, answered a call from QFRS Clifton Captain Peter McKenzie that the Clifton team for the Challenge was a man short.

The experience was all new, but something the owner of White's Garage in Allora considered was worth a try. The activities at the Challenge very basically involved the rescue of a person from a road accident scenario, with teams accessed on removal techniques, internal techniques, vehicle lifting, vehicle relocation and casualty needs in a strict 20 minute time frame by technical assessors. The skills of incident assessment, patient management and extrication techniques were demonstrated during the Challenge and these skills reflect the professional competencies that are all too frequently called upon by emergency service crews when responding to road traffic crashes across Queensland. The experience was a real eye opener for Matt, even with his emergency service experience and motor vehicle industry background. The Clifton QFRS team was representing the South

West Region, one of seven regional teams competing, with members Peter McKenzie the team leader, Andrew Bell (Medic), George Gall, Peter Auld, Gary Saville and Matt Heslin. Matt took part in road rescue training specific to the Crash Rescue Challenge with the Clifton crew for two months prior to the event. The involvement has ignited his interest in this vital area of the fire & rescue service, and he is hoping for another run next year against the States best in the field. It was the third year Clifton had competed at the annual event, this year registering a personal best result.

Of a particular interest was a Rescue Workshop on the Friday before Challenge weekend, when a Ford Territory and two BF Model Falcon Utilities were dropped from a height to simulate












100 years in Allora - Marshall Family Celebration

Over 100 people gathered together in Allora on Sunday, May 1st, to celebrate their forebears arrival in Queensland one hundred years ago. In July 1911, Thomas and Mary Marshall, with their nine children, arrived from Manilla. NSW to become licencees of the Allora Commercial Hotel. This couple now have approximately 220 descendants, with almost half of these attending the celebration, coming from localities as far afield as Darwin. Longreach, Sydney and Melbourne for the occasion.

Activities on the day included a Thanksgiving Mass at St Patrick's Church, a reunion luncheon at Allora Sports Club, the cutting of a celebratory cake by the oldest living descendant, Mr Dermot King of Warwick, and a family group photo outside the Commercial Hotel. The day concluded with a visit to locations of family interest in the district, including the property 'Carmella', just north of Allora on the highway, which has been held by the Marshall family for 99 years.

Looking Back...

Early Days in the Allora District

Philip Conley was born in Warwick in 1882, one of the 15 children of William George and Margaret Conley. His father was a building contractor who had worked on the construction of Talgai Homestead before setting up in business in Warwick. There he worked on the building of the Town Hall, Court House and some of the larger churches in the town.

In 1883 the family shifted to a farm called "Avondale" on the "Ironbark Ridge" to the south of Allora. They had a few sheep, dairy cows, pigs, and grew wheat. The Conley children attended the Hendon State School, Philip's first teacher being Miss Kate McKenna, who started as a pupil teacher at the school and ended her long teaching career in helping set up the Queensland correspondence system. Financial difficulties caused William Conley to sell "Avondale" and his Warwick business. Mr. Conley then helped set up the planing machine from his Warwick joinery in Andrew Gordon's saw mill near the corner of Forde and Drayton Streets in Allora. It was believed to be the first machine of its type in the town. The family moved to a farm owned by Frank Kates, aptly called "Poverty Ridge", adjoining the Ironbark Ridge. Philip had to drive the cattle to Deuchar Creek for water every day in the summer and every second day in the winter.

On leaving school, Philip's first job was planting corn at Sam Crookey's farm at Hendon. Sam Crookey inr. was the ploughman with a single furrow mouldboard and two horses. Philip planted every fourth furrow. The Crookey's then employed a man names Andrews with a two furrow plough, and Philip planted every second round as well as following the single furrow plough. He earned 6/- for 10 days work.

Philip Conley learned the building trade with his father and brothers and one of the jobs that they had was the demolition of the original horse stables at Headington Hill Station and their re-erection as a shed for the Logan family at Clifton. The Conley's later worked on the construction of the new Roman Catholic Church in Clifton.

Philip obtained casual work in the big wool sheds in the district. One of his first jobs was with Toby Mason at Talgai West when they penned the sheep up over night for the shearers and worked as "picker ups" for the shearers during the day. He took a job as tar boy with a mobile lamb marking crew at Talgai West. Wooden hurdles were moved from paddock to paddock to construct temporary yards. A crew of two ear markers worked with Dielemann Smith who did the castrating and tail docking of the lambs. Philip's job was to apply a mixture of tar and kerosene to the cuts and was often covered with blood and tar. In later years he went on to learn to shear and worked in the Pilton. East Prairie and Yandilla sheds.

Philip Conley worked as a builder, carpenter and commercial traveller over the years, and in a complete career change he leased Harry Reppel's bakery in Drayton Street for two years from 1st August 1914. It was to be an eventful week with the declaration of war on the 4th August and the burning down of Holmes & Co. and six other business premises in Drayton and Herbert Streets in the same week. Mr. Conley later joined the Railways Department as a carpenter. He retired to Maryborough, where he died in 1974 at the age of 92.

Letter to the Editor...


Dear Sir,

Fluoride levels steady

Six days after testing proved the new fluoride treatment plant was in order, the first batch of weekly testing for fluoride levels has been completed by Southern Downs Regional Council. Legislation requires fluoride levels for safe drinking water to be

between 0.50mg/litre and 1.20mg/litre. "Council is aiming for a very safe 0.80 mg/litre in the middle of

that range." said CEO Rod Ferguson. "Our testing today (19/05/2011) shows levels at between

0.64mg/litre and 0.79 mg/litre." Tests were taken at three points, and the water supply will continue to be tested on a weekly basis.

Baker showed a new string to his bow when he kicked ahead in the 51st minute for McMillan to celebrate his third try. The




