





be achieved with the assistance of a technique called High Pressure Water

Texturising from an unusual looking truck. As it moves along the highways the equipment flushes the build up of excess bitumen that effect the road surface.

Using Ultra High Pressure water to improve the road surface is an environmentally friendly method that doesn't require layering more bitumen onto our highways.

This equipment is essentially a high pressure cleaner and



vacuum for the road surfaces that allows us to quickly and efficiently improve the safety of the roads by increasing the friction and road texture.

As part of the skid resistance program, the equipment will be covering 52,400 metres in the Darling Downs region; the equipment will be moving its way from Warwick to Toowoomba along the New England Highway before also visiting Pittsworth, Oakey and Dalby.

Irrigator contacts powerlines near

Allora's Past 100 years ago November 1910 Allora-Goomburra Railway

A letter from the Railway Commissioner regarding the proposed route of the Allora to Goomburra railway was considered at a special meeting of the Allora Municipal Council on the 4th November 1910. Present at the meeting were the Mayor, Ald. Ludgate, and Aldermen, Deacon, Dean, Bourne, Whitman, Muir and McMillan.

The letter proposed that the route of the line be shifted from Darling Street, as was originally planned, to a route along Warwick Street. The reason stated for the proposed change was that if the Darling Street route was used, the railway station would have to be shifted further south.

It was resolved that a public meeting be called for the following Monday night at the Town Hall to discuss the proposed change of route of the line.

In spite of the gloomy weather unusual interest was shown at the public meeting, at least fifty people attending. Mr Burge objected to the route change on behalf of the school committee citing a serious danger to the school children. Mr. F. S. Lound spoke on behalf of the business owners of Warwick Street stating that it was a busy thoroughfare and the railway line along it would cause too much disruption to traffic and business. He was supported by Mr. M. Corden, manager of the Commercial Bank of Sydney, and Mr. W. J T. Neale. Messrs. J. Dean and J. Flynn spoke in favour of the proposal.

Mr. W. Deacon moved "that the Town Council be instructed to inform the Commissioner of Railways that on account of the dislocation to trade and traffic, that it would cause great objection to be taken to the proposed route of the railway by way of Warwick Street". With one dissentient the motion was declared carried.

Old Residents' Reunion

Following the very successful function held in 1909, Mr. William Burge, secretary of the Old Residents' Reunion Committee convened "a meeting of those desirous of holding a second Reunion of Old Residents and Sympathisers, to be held at the Town Hall on the 7th December 1910".



Dr Katrina Warren's Top 10 Christmas Tips for Caring for Your Puppy - Part 1

Christmas is a family time and for most of us our pets are part of family celebrations. However with all the last minute preparation, excitement of family and friends arriving, exchanging gifts and finally sitting down to enjoy the festivities, your puppy's mischievous antics might easily go amiss!

- 1. Tree decorations look like dangly toys to puppies if you have pets, it is better to use unbreakable decorations rather than glass baubles. The glass used to make the baubles is very fine and splinters can be hard to remove from paw pads
- 2. Avoid gifts under the tree what self-respecting puppy could resist opening a gift or two? Not only will this wreck your giftgiving, but the contents of some gifts may be harmful to your
- 3. Chocolate is toxic to dogs if you find that your dog has opened the Christmas chocolates, seek urgent veterinary attention
- 4. Make sure your puppy is securely confined when guests are arriving. If young children are visiting, supervise your puppy at all times or confine them away from the children. Children can over-stimulate pets. especially at a time when the children themselves are likely to be over-excited

Cat's eyes change colour for road safety

Motorists driving on roads in and around Warwick will be able to see the road more clearly at night, in fog and heavy rain with new 'cat's eyes' line marking being rolled out on the region's road network in the coming months.

Main Roads Minister Craig Wallace said the 'cat's eyes' markers will be changed from white to yellow on centre line markings as part of a national initiative to boost road safety.

"Safety experts have found that yellow reflective road markers are clearer than white ones when there is low-light.

"We will be rolling out yellow 'cat's eyes' progressively around the state. When centre line markers need replacing, we'll do it with yellow ones," he said.

Mr Wallace said state-controlled roads in Queensland would have the new markers installed in stages over the next three years.

"Motorists will notice that roads with more than two lanes may have three different colours of markers to help delineate the lanes to give motorists clear guidance on where to safely drive. "Red markers are used on the far left-hand edges of the road, white markers on the inside lanes and yellow on the line near a central median.

"Yellow reflectors will also be placed on guide posts on the right-hand side of divided roads in keeping with the new standard," he said.

Mr Wallace said there were no plans to change the white painted line markings as they still provide the highest contrast with the road surface.

Final stage of \$33m Warwick project delayed - Southern Downs customers enjoying benefits of completed work

An unusually wet spring has forced Ergon Energy to defer completing the final stage of a \$33 million project to rebuild the main electricity supply line to Warwick until next year.

Acting Manager Regional Services Michael Hellyer said crews had been on schedule to complete the work last month until the heavy equipment used in stringing the lines became inoperable on the wet black soils near Toowoomba.

Mr Hellyer said all of the 280 concrete poles had been stood and only about 5km of the new line remained to be strung when work was terminated for the summer storm season.

"The risk of taking the whole line out of service during the storm season was considered too great, so our crews will return to complete the work over about three weeks in autumn," he said. "We also had to take into account that we were working on easements on private property and our machinery would have caused an unacceptable level of damage if we had tried to proceed before the land had a chance to dry out.

"Importantly, our 17,000 customers on the Southern Downs are already realising the full benefits of the 65km of line that has been rebuilt, as well as upgrades at the Middle Ridge and Warwick substations at each end."

Mr Hellyer said the new transmission line had been constructed in stages between April and October for the past three years.

"The project involves the complete replacement of one of the

"The project involves the complete replacement of one of the two 110,000-volt powerlines that runs from Middle Ridge substation to Warwick," he said.

"Work began in 2008 at the Warwick end because this section
