Passers-by could have been excused for thinking the Allora State School was under siege on Saturday, with firefighters





dangling from ropes and lines from school buildings. QFRS Allora staff Captain Brett Bender, Lieutenants Peter Koina and Mal Clarke, and firefighters Andrew Petersen, John Meddleton, Andrew Quirke and Cameron Thomas were involved in a "High Angle Rescue" course over Saturday, with most returning on Sunday to take part in the QFRS "Swift Water Rescue" course held at both the Muir Street Fire Station and the Allora Swimming

Instructors for the courses were Station Officer Shane Rankine from Toowoomba and Warwick based Senior Firefighter Michael Coombes, who earlier this year among Australian emergency service contingent who attended New Zealand's earthquake tragedy.

Mr. Coombes said "the weekend was a great success in that the Allora QFRS staff had gained valuable skills that could see them called on, not only to attend local emergency incidents involving rescue, but also incidents further afield". The Allora staff members boast significant experience and

knowledge, which was added to over the weekend, thus providing Allora and it's surrounds with a commendable emergency response.


Queensland's past year of tragedy including cyclones & floods has seen the State's emergency services performing at optimum levels. "The courses the Allora staff completed successfully will see them and the Allora community better prepared should similar future situations occur" commented Mr. Coombes.

Firefighter Andrew Petersen was one who enjoyed the courses, the hands on aspect especially in areas of rescue procedures new to most of the local staff. "An enhanced knowledge of the dangers of elevated and also water rescue, along with new knowledge of rescue techniques & the importance of team work would benefit all staff who took part in the training".

The courses completed over the weekend are another step in a continuing upgrade, maintenance and addition to firefighter skills as is conducted State wide. Allora Captain Brett Bender said the new skills focusing on water and elevated rescue take the capabilities of his staff to another level, those involved in the training better equipped to handle the unpredictable situations that emergency services can be called on to address. 

To the Editor of the Allora Guardian

#### **Desecration of the Sabbath**

Dear Sir, Will you kindly permit me through the medium of your paper, to speak a word to my neighbours of Harrison's Paddock and Forest Plain, upon a matter that concerns not us alone but the public generally.

A short time ago one of our farmers was seen working his reaper on the Sabbath. Then, shortly after, three or four followed this bad example. Then followed carting in sheaves on the Sabbath.

Now, I ask, when and where this evil is to stop? Shall we see, next harvest, the whole of the people in the Allora district reaping and drawing their wheat on the Sabbath, machines threshing, and all labourers working? And, after that, shall we see farmers ploughing, stores and hotels open, carpenters and blacksmiths working, and the complete secularisation of the Sabbath? And then shall we see this mischief spread throughout the colonies, and throughout the British Empire? God forbid! But the beginning of the evil is as the breaking in of the waters of the ocean, and the kindling of fire in the dry grass.

I hope my neighbours will see the evil of this pernicious practice, and leave it off for their children's and neighbour's sakes, for the colonies and the Empire's sake, and for the world's sake. The day of rest is a sacred privilege. Apart from its religious aspect it is a political right, and he who secularises it, infringes the rights of his fellow subjects.


#### To the Editor The Brisbane Courier

Sir, No doubt many of your readers feel as I do, that much of the interest in the subject matter of the various questions discussed in your columns centres on the personality of the writer. Unfortunately, modesty, or less desirable attributes, usually induce correspondents to use a nom de plume - or perhaps a nom to guerre! There is one correspondent, however, who attaches an honest-sounding signature to his contributions, but no doubt to many thousands of "Courier" readers this name - Isaac Hardwick - may be a pen name. It looks like a name-portrait of one of Cromwell's grizzled captains! But the name is genuine - and so is the possessor. The first time I saw this old warrior entering the "Courier" lists there flashed to my mind Browning's: - "I was ever a fighter - and one fight more, The best and the last".

Isaac Hardwick was a prolific writer to the Letters to the Editor column. He was a very early blacksmith in Allora, a farmer and a storekeeper. He was a member of the first Allora Municipal Council and Mayor in 1872. He was a stalwart of the Methodist Weslevan Church and founder of its Sunday school. He was the great great grandfather of the Telford family of Headington Hill and the Charles Smith family of

Kimberley accumulated 175 points on "Lethal Breeze" to win from seasoned veteran Michael Boyce on "Connie Ray", but she also collected the honours for third place on "Doc's Melrose". Neville Fanning of Warwick on "Synton" finished with the highest cut out score.

Roadvale based rider Megan Porter was victorious in the George & Fuhrmann Maiden Draft on "Silkstone Fourten", finishing ahead of second placed Arthur Crumblin on "Peppy Doll" and Mick Aspinall who finished third on "Chulas CD Hickory", also collecting the highest cut out honours.

The Junior Draft with the prize of the "Frank Phelan Memorial Trophy" was won by Tyler Aspinall on "Flash", receiving his trophy from Neil & Robyn Phelan.

After being postponed from its regular time slot in early October, the 2011 Downs Polo Club annual campdraft finally got under way on Sunday at the Allora Showgrounds with a mammoth 290 entries. The weather was warm, but the conditions ideal for the highly successful draft. Previously known as the Allora Rotary Rodeo which featured a campdraft, the event has been a regular occurrence on the local calendar over many years, organized by the Downs Polo Club for the past 28 years.

Downs Polo Club spokesman and former organization President Andy Gilmore rated Sunday's event as "the best ever". Mr. Gilmore issued high praise to the Allora Show Society for the outstanding condition of the campdraft facilities, "improved conditions from previous years saw the return of many former competitors, while the cattle used over the course of the draft were ideal". "Success of a campdraft relies on the conditions of the arena and the cattle, and we had the best line of cattle from go to woe on Sunday".


