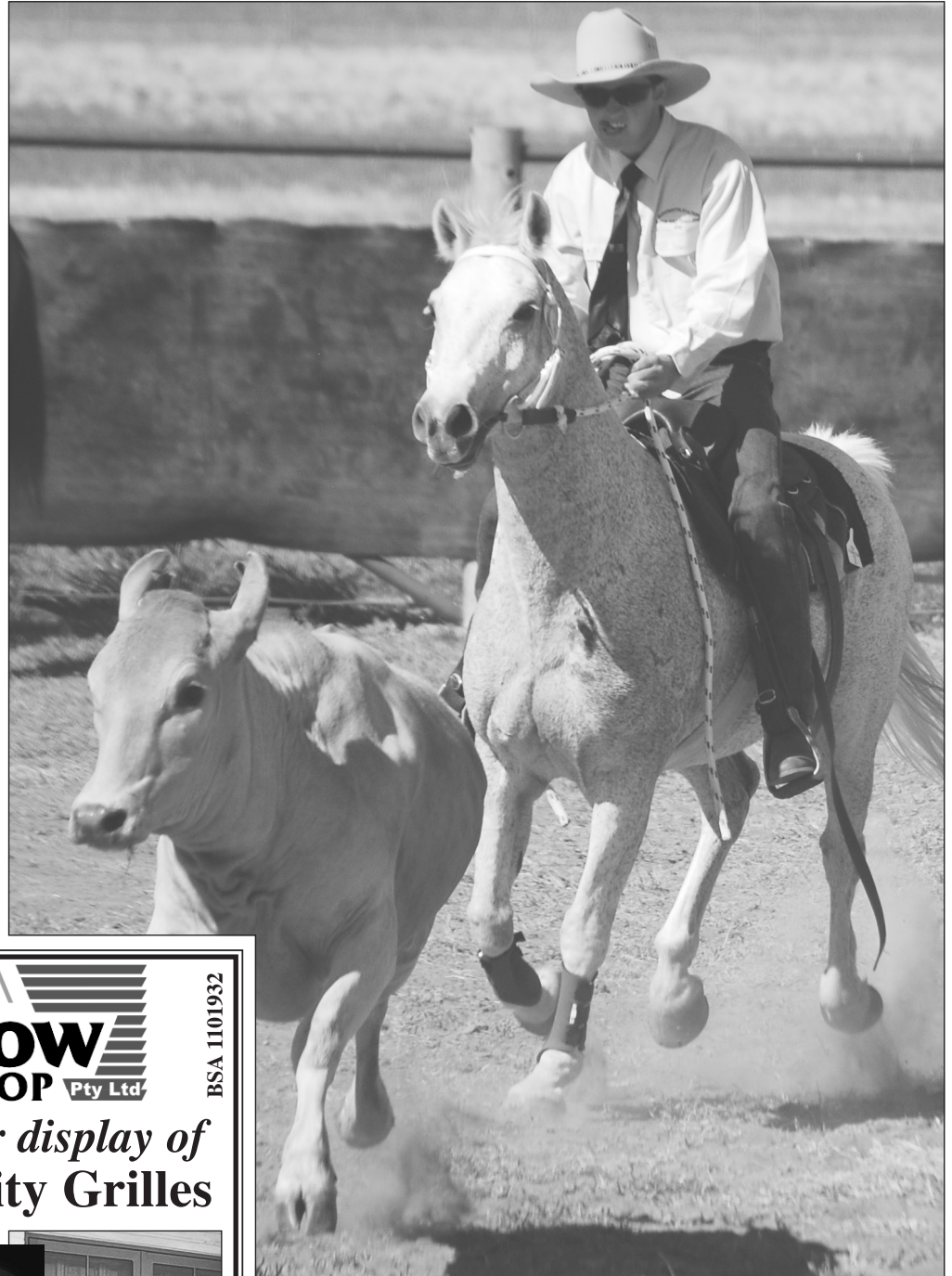
Start of a Camp Drafting Career

Tyre dumpers targeted by Council

Council is considering random spot checks and installing security cameras in illegal dumping hot spots to curb increasing incidents of unlawful dumping of tyres in the region. Director Planning and Environment, Ken Harris said that illegal dumping of tyres continues to cost legitimate businesses, communities and the environment. "In the end, it is the community who have to meet the cost of cleaning up tyres from the roadside because others can't be bothered to do the right thing," Mr Harris said. "Ironically it takes just as much energy to do the wrong thing as the right thing and take the tyres to an appropriate landfill site," he said. "Council and our community work hard to keep the region looking attractive so we'll be adopting a zero tolerance for this type of behaviour and enforcing penalties for anyone caught illegally dumping." The maximum on-the-spot penalty for unlawful disposal of litter/waste over 200 litres is \$1600 for individuals or \$6400 for companies. A further risk to the environment of illegal tyre dumping is the fire hazard.

COMMUNITY UPDATE

BY ALLORA MEDICAL SUPPORT GROUP
January 2010

- The community had no doctor
- No prospects of obtaining a doctor
- No access to a Medical surgery
- Waiting times of three/four weeks to see a doctor elsewhere

Today we have

- Two full-time doctors in place
- A lease of the existing surgery
- Established the Allora Medical Support Group Inc. (non-profit) to hold the Medical Assets on behalf of the community
- Negotiated with Southern Cross Care to take over ownership of the existing surgery and land
- Designed a new medical facility for Allora with provision for comprehensive allied medical services
- Applied for funds to cover the construction costs, under a Government funding program for such purposes
- To date all costs have been met by the Support Group

The future

- The funding application outcome is expected to be known before Christmas
- If successful, building will commence with a minimum of delay
- If unsuccessful, other options are being looked at and evaluated
- It is very likely the support group will be asking for financial support from the community to cover it's outlays.
- The community will be kept informed by a public meeting at a later date when building plans, funding options etc. will be outlined for discussion.

"If tyres catch fire, the contaminants released to the environment can create serious environmental harm, not to mention property damage as they can burn for days." Mr Harris said that tyres left in the open also create an ideal habitat for vermin and mosquitoes. "When rainwater starts to build up inside it, a single tyre can act as a breeding ground for hundreds of mosquito larvae." Mr Harris urged residents to "dob in illegal dumpers" by phoning council on 4661 0300 but did stress that residents considering reporting illegal dumping, should do so safely. "Don't approach the vehicle or individuals who are illegally dumping, don't let the illegal dumpers know you are there and don't touch the illegally dumped material," Mr Harris said. Anyone witnessing someone illegally dumping waste should take note of details such as vehicle type, colour and registration, amount and type of waste, company names, details of person/s dumping waste, time, date and location. Council will maintain the confidentiality of sources of information about illegal dumping.

Looking Back...

Sport in Allora

The "Warwick Examiner" of January 9th 1869, contained the following report of what could have been the first organized horse-racing meeting in Allora.

"On Saturday afternoon last a very good day's sports was got up at this quiet little township, when six races were set down for decision. There was a very good attendance of visitors, and the races were well contested. Results were as follows:

Hurdle Race, over six jumps, two miles; this was won by Mr. Nemeth's Buckley, who took the lead at the starting, and went over the hurdles in splendid style, was never headed and won easily.

The Maiden Plate, one mile and a half; Mr. Schriek's Clipper (Higgins in the saddle), 1; McIntyre's Minerva (Ross), 2; Holmes' Halivah (Williams), 3.

The Town Plate, three miles; Mr. Adams' Eucalyptus (Ross), 1; Samuel Gordon's Bobby (Higgins), 2; Schriek's Tommy (owner), 3.

A Hurry Scurry, two heats; Mr. Carmichael's Lucy (Brian) won both heats of this race with great ease.

Hurry Scurry, three heats; this race was won by Mr. Brown's grey horse. In the first heat he won as he liked. The second heat was won by a Clifton horse. The third heat was won by Mr. Brown's grey with the greatest ease.

The Forced Handicap, two miles; Adams' Eucalyptus (McIntyre), 1; Gordon's Bobby (Higgins), 2; McCurdy's horse (Badford), 3."

With the 1930 basketball season over, the Allora girls were looking for a sport to occupy themselves over the summer. Miss Josie Imhoff convened a meeting at the Central Cafe on the 20th October, and the Allora Ladies Vigoro Club was formed with 20 enthusiastic members.

Their first match against the de Milo Physical Culture Club in Toowoomba, resulted in a five run win. On the 13th December 1930, a fair attendance witnessed the first vigoro match to be played at Spring Creek, when Allora was victorious over the local side. The country teams turned the tables in January 1931 when, in a surprise result, the Allora side was defeated by the Goomburra ladies. The Allora team was decked out in white with green trim while the Goomburra ladies wore cream with lemon trim.

The 1931/32 season saw matches against the newly formed Clifton Rovers side. Nine out of twelve members of the Southern Downs representative side in the 1932 season came from the Allora district; Clarice Anderson, Betty Gilmore, Thelma Willett, Ella Ford and Beryl Wright from Goomburra and Josie Imhoff, Carrie Imhoff, Thelma Hoey and Nin Byrne from Allora.

The Wheat Belt Association was formed in the 1932/33 season with teams from Allora, Clifton, Nobby, Bellevue, Back Plains, Spring Creek, Goomburra, Gladfield, Clintonvale, Freestone and Pilton.

In 1933 trial matches were held to select a Queensland vigoro side to play New South Wales in Sydney. Miss Clarice Anderson from Goomburra and Miss Thelma Hoey from Allora were chosen to represent Queensland from the Wheat Belt Association. Miss Rosie Telford from Spring Creek was chosen for the trial matches but was unable to attend.

Protection works on Cunningham's Gap

The Department of Transport and Main Roads has commenced work installing concrete barriers along the highway at Cunningham's Gap from Tuesday 23 November. Transport and Main Roads District Director Paul Noonan said Stop/Go traffic conditions will continue until Friday 26 November and operate between 8.00am to 5.00pm each day. The work will reduce the westbound climbing lane at Gap Creek and create a barricaded zone between the rock face and the road for stabilisation work to take place. Mr Noonan said there would be traffic changes but the works will not require a full closure of Cunningham's Gap. "We're hoping to finish this work on Friday but they may continue through to the middle of next week if wet weather

Stanthorpe community meeting next week

Councillors are set to undertake their final community meetings for 2010 with dates now scheduled for Stanthorpe and Warwick.

Stanthorpe's meeting will be held next Tuesday, 30 November from 7.00pm to 8.30pm in the Stanthorpe Civic Centre Supper Room at the corner of Lock and Marsh Streets, with Warwick's meeting in the Town Hall the following Tuesday, December 7.

CEO Rod Ferguson said that the meeting format of the Stanthorpe and Warwick meetings will alter slightly from earlier community meetings to include presentation of the SDRC Annual Report.

"Along with broader resident questions, we'll be taking a look at the achievements and challenges of the last financial year," Mr Ferguson said.

Earlier this year, councillors and senior staff sought feedback on local issues from residents across the region, with areas such as youth, planning, water and roads of greatest concern to residents.

Manager Community Development, Sheila Stebbings is hoping for a large turnout of residents at the Stanthorpe and Warwick meetings.

"These community meetings provide an opportunity for a two-way exchange of information between residents and councillors and senior staff, Ms Stebbings said.

"With councillors now re-examining the rates model, this is an opportunity to provide feedback and gain clarity on this issue, as well as other debates and programs currently before Council."

Residents keen to attend the Stanthorpe meeting should forward questions they would like answered to sheila.stebbing@southerndowns.qld.gov.au or phone Sheila on 4681 5520 by Monday, November 29. Warwick questions should be received by Monday, December 6.

"By submitting questions ahead of time, the team can target the appropriate officer for the correct answer, rather than having to answer in an ad hoc or ill-informed manner on the night," Ms Stebbings said.

Residents are also encouraged to speak with Sheila to suggest agenda items for next year's community meetings.

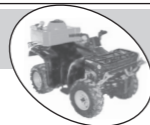
"The community meetings will start again in February 2011 with the first one likely to be at Leyburn, which is where we started a year ago," Ms Stebbings said.

"The community support for these meetings has been variable however some have been exceptionally well attended, especially in the smaller communities that don't have the same ease of access to councillors and senior staff, as our more urban residents have."

The community meetings program is an annual initiative by Council. Meeting locations change within the small clusters of townships over time, with November meetings reserved for Warwick and Stanthorpe residents, in order to coincide with the release of Council's annual report to the region's major communities.

Local Official Named to Head Rugby League

Allora based rugby league official Glyn Rees was reappointed to the Queensland Rugby League's Central Division Board at the Board's Annual General Meeting in Toowoomba on Saturday. Rees was endorsed as an Independent Director on the Central Division Board at the recent Queensland Rugby League meeting. The director position includes a portfolio that has Rees as Chairman of the QRL Central Division Juniors Board. Rees was the inaugural appointment to the same position for 2010, the first year of the Central Division's existence. The Central Division came about in late 2009 with the amalgamation of three former Queensland Rugby League divisions, South West, Wide Bay and the former Central Division (now known as Capricorn). The amalgamation saw the newly created Division stretch from Rockhampton to Longreach in the north, extending south to the New South Wales border, excluding the Brisbane area. Prior to the formation of Central Division, Rees presided over the QRL South West Division Juniors Board for a period of 14 years. He also spent the same period as a Director on the QRL South West Division (Seniors) Board, and is the longest serving Director on the Queensland Rugby League State Juniors Board with 2011 his 16th consecutive year.

Involved in rugby league administration commencing in 1975 in Gladstone, Rees has also served terms as President of Warwick's Collegians JRL Club, and the Warwick & District Junior Rugby League. He served for 18 years on South West Division Boards in various executive roles.

The Central Division Junior's Board Chaired by Rees includes Toowoomba's Rex Zeeman (Central Division Manager), Phil Shield from Gladstone (Capricorn), Daryl Swan from Gympie (Wide Bay), Tom Kelly from Jandowae (South West), Anthony Lanskey from Bundaberg (Independent Director) & Glen Dreger from Maryborough (Development). Queensland Rugby League, Central Division Board Chairman, Michael "Bert" Borland (from Rockhampton) was re-elected to head the Division overall for a second consecutive year. Borland will also continue as the Central Division's Director on the Queensland Rugby League Board. The Central Division Board is Borland from Rockhampton as Chairman, Division Manager: Rex Zeeman, Region Delegates: Tim Bliss of Toowoomba (South West), Graham Campbell of Emerald (Capricorn), Danny Maguire of Caloundra (Wide Bay); Independent Directors: Rex Little of Toowoomba (Referees), Glyn Rees of Allora (Juniors), Peter Hunt of Rockhampton (Finance).

The recent Annual General Meeting of the QRL South West Regional Advisory Council Juniors saw long standing local official Amanda O'Halloran reappointed as the group's Secretary. The 2011 season will be Amanda's second in the position, after spending eight years previously as Secretary of the former QRL South West Division Juniors, and this year as Secretary of the Central Division Juniors. The AGM also saw the announcement of Regional representative roles for 2011, with three Allora based officials appointed to positions with the South West Junior "Mustangs" for next year. Glenn Brown will mentor the 2011 "Mustangs" Under 13 side as coach, Shaun Henry continues in the role of Manager of the "Mustangs" Under 16 side, and Jeffrey Rees has been appointed Leaguesafe Officer for the "Mustangs" representative squad, which includes the U/13, U/14

& U/16 teams. Former Wattles (Seniors) A Grade Coach Dan Sparksman and Trainer Pat Johnson have also secured representative roles, Sparksman again coaching the U/16 team while Johnson is the squad Head Trainer. The "Mustangs" major representative commitment in 2011 is the QRL State Junior Championships at Ipswich from the 29th June to 3rd July. The 2011 South West Region Junior "Mustangs" Selection Trials will be held at Miles on the 21st & 22nd of May.

In other local rugby league appointments Allora's Liz Henry has been appointed President of the Warwick & District Junior Rugby League. It is Mr. Henry's first District League appointment, having filled the role of Wattles Junior Rugby League Club Secretary in recent years. Mrs. Henry is the first female President of the League that was formed in 1966, and will combine with long serving Secretary Kathy Hamel of Texas to steer junior rugby league in the Warwick & Border region over the next year. The Warwick & District Junior Rugby League had previously been headed by local league identity Peter Cavanagh for over a decade.
